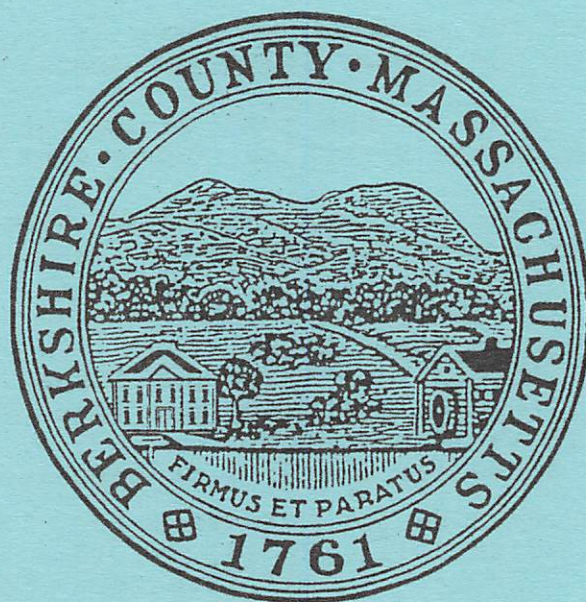

## THOMAS INGERSOLL AND PARTY

Up to 1820 there were only 719 souls in all of Oxford County. Among these people were Thomas Ingersoll and the 40 settlers and their families that he brought with him from Great Barrington, Massachusetts.

Thomas Ingersoll had made application for a tract of land under terms set up by Gov. John Graves Simcoe in 1793 whereby inducements were promised to settlers from the United States. The terms were that the settlers and families become permanent residents of Canada West. In answer to the prayer of petition of Thomas Ingersoll, an order was passed, dated March 23, 1793, giving Mr. Ingersoll 64,000 acres. He made the choice of land in Oxford-on-the-Thames, (East, West and North Oxford).

Having located land to his satisfaction Thomas Ingersoll, although not an U.E.L., returned to Great Barrington, Mass. to find settlers from Massachusetts and New York, sympathetic to the British. The Ingersoll family had emigrated to Salem, Mass. from England in 1729 and were themselves pro-British.

Thomas Ingersoll's family was large. He married three times. Thomas Ingersoll, 1749-1812, married Elizabeth Dewey, 1758-1784. They had four daughters:

Laura 1775-1868, who married James Secord.

Elizabeth 1779-1811, who married Rev. Daniel Pickett.

Mira 1781-1847, who married Julius Hitchcock.

Abigail 1783-1821, who married Guy Woodsworth.

On the death of Elizabeth, Thomas married Mercy Smith. They had no children.

On the death of Mercy, in 1789, Thomas married Sarah Whiting. They had seven children, who were:

Charles 1791-1832, married Anna Merritt.

Charlotte 1793-, who married Mr. Marigold.

Appy 1794-1872, who married Mr. Carroll.

Thomas 1796-1847

Samuel 1798-1861

James 1801-1886, who married Catherine McNab.

Sarah 1807-1826, who married Henry (?).

The eldest daughter was the famous Canadian heroine of the War of 1812. Laura Secord is beloved by all Canadians for her walk through the woods with her cow to save Canada West.

By 1795, Thomas Ingersoll was back in Oxford with his settlers, who received 200 acre lots at 6 pence per acre. These lots were finally surveyed in 1799 and deeds issued in 1800 to the owners.

Below will be found the names of the persons included in the original settlement, with the number of the lot located by each, and with the date of the patent. These lots were the only com-

During his stay in Oxford County, Thomas Ingersoll not only administered his settlement scheme but was a very active Justice of the Peace, Administrator of Oaths and as well, Commissioner of Roads. To Thomas Ingersoll we can credit the building of the Stage Road from Brantford through Burford to Oxford. Without him settlement in southwestern Ontario would have been much slower, indeed.

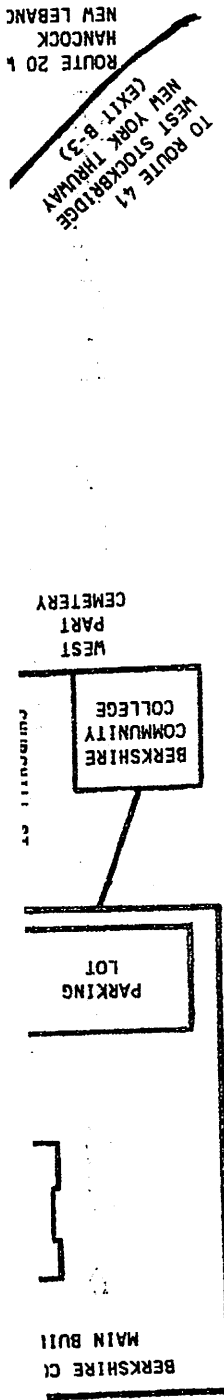

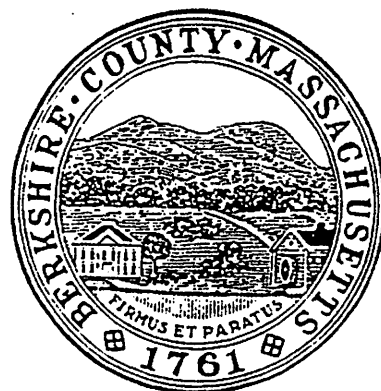

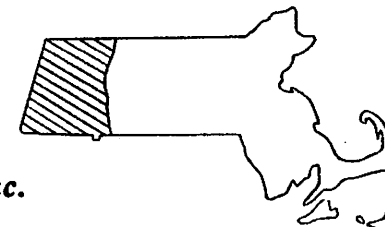

## THE BOOKSTALL

Reviews by J. Bradley Cooper

*Cemetery Inscriptions of the Town of Barnstable, Massachusetts and Its Villages 1600-1900*, by Fred J. Bunnell, 1995. 434pp, illustrated, soft bound 5-3/8" x 8-3/8". Price \$32.00 plus \$3.50 S/H. Heritage Books, Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Pl., Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716.

This is a revised edition which includes data from thirty-three cemeteries, ten more than the original edition. The cemeteries covered are in Barnstable, West Barnstable, Cotuit, Marston's Mills, Centerville, Hyannis, Hyannisport, Cummaquid and Oesterville. The material is arranged alphabetically by surname and coded in a manner to identify the cemetery where the grave is located. Additional comments identify the family plot of the grave and adjoining graves to facilitate determining family relationships. The condition of the stone is stated and a note made if the inscription is difficult to read. The compiler has provided additional information as to family relationships, military service, age at death, religious affiliation or status-as occupation, widow, infant, etc. There are three cemetery photographs.

*The Town of Roxbury: Its Memorable Persons and Places, Its History and Antiquities, With Numerous Illustrations of Its Old Landmarks and Noted Personages*, by Francis S. Drake, 1878. 1994 reprint, 493pp, soft bound 5-3/8" x 8-3/8", illustrations, maps, new index. Price \$32.00 plus \$3.50 S/H. Heritage Books, Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Pl., Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716.

Each of the twelve chapters is prefixed by a succinct index of the text material. The first chapter deals with the emigration to America, settlement of Massachusetts Bay Colony, early colonial affairs, Indian conflicts, the Stamp Act, Revolutionary War and Shays' Rebellion. The text treats of the topography of the country, the daily lives of the settlers, their occupations, domestic and social pursuits, politics, education and religious beliefs. There are numerous anecdotes and biographical sketches relating to the more prominent people of the time. The text is flavored by excerpts from public and private documents, and quotations from individual interviews.

More than eighty illustrations of prominent community people add interest to the work. The treatment of the various subjects is enjoyable for its own sake, whether or not one may have a genealogical connection with the area or its inhabitants.

The ship "Griffin" in 1634 brought Deacon William and Alice Crocker from England to Boston, living first in Scituate. When their pastor Rev. John Lothrop moved to Barnstable in 1639 some of his parishioners, including the Crockers, took up their residence there also. Of their seven children, five married and had children of their own, establishing a family continuing into the present. When he died in 1692 Deacon William had at least 48 living descendants. Male and female descendants to the fourteenth generation are covered, with some births as late as 1993. An individual person numbering system enables the tracing of generations both backward and forward.

Sometimes families connected to the Crockers by marriage are provided with short histories to facilitate tracing them to other lines. Information as to birth, marriage and death dates, name of ship providing transport, children and cause of death is often listed. Some of the allied families are: Bourne, Crosby, Bursley, Cobb, Davis, Fish, Fuller, Goodspeed, Hallett, Hamblin, Hinckley, Howland, Jenkins, Jones, Lovell, Nyes, Parker, Phinney, Sampson, Scudder, Smith, Thacher, and Winslow. There are separate indexes for those born Crockers and of women who married Crockers.

*Lenox and the Berkshire Highlands*, by R. DeWitt Mallary, 1902. 1995 reprint, 355pp, illustrated, index, archival hard binding, acid free paper, 6-3/4" x 9". Price \$42.50 plus \$4.75 S/H. Higginson Book Co., P.O. Box 778, Salem, MA 01970.

This is a series of essays and discourses on the Berkshire country and Lenox in particular. The first chapter discusses the early settlement of the area, relationship of the first settlers, in 1750, with the Indian natives and their French assistance from Canada. Formed from a part of the town of Richmond, Lenox was incorporated in 1767 and twenty years later became the county seat of Berkshire County. The development of the local newspapers, railway lines, building of roads and the creation of a literary culture are discussed in detail.

Reference is made to many prominent figures of the time; authors James Fenimore Cooper, George Sand, Nathaniel Hawthorne, and William Cullen Bryant, the actress Fanny Kemble and the famous preacher Henry Ward Beecher; in the arts, the painters Samuel F. B. Morse and Thomas Cole. There is a great deal of material on Catherine Maria Sedgwick as one of the famous writers.

The passage of years brought about many changes - from a group of settlers to a farming community, to the manufacture of glass and iron, to becoming the county seat - a position held for a century until transfer to Pittsfield. The final and most drastic change in its history was the arrival of wealthy financiers and industrialists and the development of large estates and handsome, but expensive, "cottages".

*The History of Prescott, Massachusetts.* One of four town-

ships in the Swift River Valley which was "born, lived and died" to make way for the Metropolitan Water Basin. Prescott was in the northeast corner of Hampshire County which as one of the original counties of the state was organized from virgin territory rather than being set off from an existing county. The town of Prescott, composed of the southern part of New Salem and the East Parish of Pelham, was incorporated in 1822. The text contains a listing of the early settlers of the town, the taverns, stores and post offices. Early industrial activity was in grist mills, sawmills, a vinegar factory, a cheese factory and a soapstone factory. Short histories are given of the Congregational, United Brethren, Baptist and Methodist churches. The oldest cemetery was laid out in 1744. The undated map is keyed to show the location of 185 families or activities.

There are several lists of vital records: Births - arranged alphabetically, earliest noted was 1797 and latest 1930. Intentions of marriage - arranged chronologically, from 1822 to 1842. Marriages - alphabetical arrangement, from 1821 to 1926. Copy of certificates of marriage - alphabetical, from 1845 to 1849. Deaths - alphabetical, from 1791 to 1928. [n.b. these lists are but a portion of the vital records of Prescott.]

Genealogical material is given for the following families: Aldrich, Converse, Haskins, LaPlant, Lawless, Pierce, Shaw, Upton and Vaughn. Also, there are a number of obituaries from 1901 to 1943.

In 1926 the legislature authorized work on the Enfield reservoir as a part of the water supply for the city of Boston. The Metropolitan Water Commission bought the town in 1927 and bodies from three cemeteries were relocated in a new Quabbin Park Cemetery.

*Norwalk [Connecticut] After Two Hundred Fifty Years: An account of the Celebration of the 250th Anniversary of the Charter of the Town 1651-1901*, published under the auspices of the Norwalk Historical and Memorial Library Association, 1901. 1995 reprint, 387pp, archival hard binding, acid free paper, 7" x 9", illustrations. Price \$44.00 plus \$4.75 S/H. Higginson Book Co., P.O. Box 778, Salem, MA 01970.

A large part of the area constituting the town of Norwalk was purchased from Indians in 1640 by Roger Ludlow who came from England in 1630. In April of the following year fellow passenger, Daniel Patrick, purchased adjoining land. During the ten years following this purchase Patrick was killed. Ludlow, then a resident of Fairfield, CT, reserved lots for his two sons and disposed of the remainder under terms suggesting more than a commercial interest in the venture. Thirty families must constitute the settling community, these must be "approved" and an

"orthodox" minister placed over them. The first minister's wife was the daughter of Ludlow's New England partner, a Windsor neighbor and close friend. With the growth of the town came the offshoots Wilton, Canaan and Saugatuck.

Following this introductory material is a recounting of the events of the four days of celebration. The first day, Sunday 8 September 1901, was a ceremony at the meeting house of "ye Prime Ancient Society on the Green". The principal address was given by Rev. Charles M. Selleck, a devoted local historian. This contains a great deal of historical data and references to people involved in the settling and development of the area. Similar addresses were given in twelve other churches of the area, with additional bits of history. The remainder of this section covers the area schools and the remaining events of the celebration.

The second section of the book presents information on the Indian Wars and the activities of various patriotic, civic, political and industrial organizations, recounting incidents relating to persons, places and events.

However, with Gov. Simcoe's return to England and the collapse of his project for settlement in Canada West, Thomas Ingersoll's own future became gloomy and disappointing. He moved to Port Credit in 1806 where he stayed until he died in 1812.

Beside Laura Ingersoll Secord, of the War of 1812 fame, several other members of the Ingersoll party distinguished themselves in Oxford County.

Charles Ingersoll volunteered in the Oxford Militia at the outbreak of the War of 1812, and saw much military activity. He returned in 1815 and in the course of time acquired the old homestead of his father, Thomas. Charles later became Postmaster in Ingersoll. Unfortunately, he was a victim of the cholera epidemic of 1832. His brother James, became Registrar of Oxford County and left extensive collections of life in Oxford County which were published in *Woodstock Sentinel Review* newspaper.

The stories of the other settlers that came with Thomas Ingersoll are also interesting. They became the backbone of the county and deserve articles by themselves.

[While *Berkshire Genealogist* does not normally use previously published material, we feel that Mrs. Evans' article gives some valuable information concerning the fortunes of migrating Berkshireites. It was published in a Canadian journal, and we think it deserves a wider U. S. circulation as well. Thomas Ingersoll's settlement is now Ingersoll, Ontario. Ed.]
