A FAMILY HISTORY GOLD MINE: AS NEAR AS YOUR LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL

Imagine a genealogical resource that shows granddad or grandma as a kid with a unique nickname you have never heard of; a favorite quote; a character suggesting phrase under a photograph taken when he/she was only 17 years old. Think of a source where we could actually see Aunt Charlotte or Great Grand Dad in athletic uniform or dressed for the school play; or where their youthful hopes and ambitions were listed for all to see. All this and much more is readily available to researchers who happen upon one of the twentieth century treasures: high school class yearbooks. These are the same books you and I paid a lot of money for when we graduated from high school or when each of our kids reached that milestone in their life.

There has been a remarkable evolution of the class yearbook in this century. While maintaining its core or basic content many unique and valuable features have been added that could enhance and revitalize the family history. The yearbook has been a by-product of our public and private educational system since - and in some cases before - the turn of the century. The early yearbooks were often produced twice a year, with the focus often in January, on the literary achievements of the class as represented in personal essays or poetry or the class play or musical; and the June edition devoted solely to the members of the graduating class. This latter publication reviewed the class' achievements and academic, athletic and social highlights; and usually identified the class leaders, characters and clowns. Wouldn't a blush come to grandma's face to be reminded that she was the "class flirt" or had a special interest in somebody in the nearby town or was always "watching for a certain V-8 no. 463-351; while grandpa lived in town and didn't yet own a car. Oh! What questions we could pose to our older, straight and true family members who talk a good standard of behavior to their grandchildren, but, who's yearbook definitely suggests that procrastination, gum chewing, eating in class, listening to pop music and avoiding homework seems to have a genetic base.

The Pittsfield High School Senior Log of 1938 had a section entitled Who's Who in 1938 and included an alphabetical listing of the class with the seniors' class activities and favorite pastimes. Elizabeth Armstrong's favorite pastime was "corresponding with the U.S. Navy, while Lois Ashe's was "flaunting Vermont's virtues". Some of these are really timeless and bring grandma/grandpa to life: "dancing my troubles away", or "running around the diamond", "daydreaming", or "listening to Sammy Kaye swing and sway". Where else can

one get the "pulse" of our ancestors without actually living with them?

Yearbooks have names that more often that not stayed with them with the life of the school. For example the Suffield (Conn.) High School yearbook was first called the Arrow and a couple of years later it was Latinized to the Sagitta (of course, meaning arrow. Norway (Me.) High School yearbook from 1914 was known as the Caduceus. New Britain (Conn.) High School had the Beehive while in Pittsfield they could never agree on the same name more than two years in a row. Here are some of those titles: Pre-Historian ('15 & '16), Calendarium ('17), the Annual ('32), the Pendulum ('36), the Purple Mirror ('37), the Senior Log ('38), the Purple Beacon (Jan. '39) and the PHS Pinafore (June '39) and Snickersnee ('40), the Purple Knight ('41), the Dome ('42 & '43) and the Tick Tock ('44).

The yearbook structure is revealing. The title can, as we have seen, be a serious tradition or vary from year to year. Next, there are photographs of the high school and/or of favorite spots in town followed by the dedication of the yearbook to some faculty member including a brief thanks or biography, especially if the person was retiring after many years of service. Representative school scenes are shown interspersed with these and other sections. Next comes the faculty section with pictures, subjects taught, schools attended and in the Pittsfield High School Calendarium of 1917 even faculty addresses were shown. Mr. Goodwin, for example, taught math and lived at 112 Appleton Ave., Pittsfield; while Ms. Downs, who taught Commercial Branches, lived in Lenox. The 1932 Pittsfield High School Annual gave

student addresses as well.

The main feature of any yearbook is the graduating class and they all seem to include photographs. Back in 1914, however, the photograph may have been a group shot, but usually they were individual photographs. Sometimes, as in the case of the Norway (Maine) High School Caduceus of 1915 the photographs are there, but not the names. Thanks to the work of the Norway Historical Society their copy was labeled. This was a rare incident, however, as graduates were almost always identified along with their nickname, a favorite quote, the school they came from, their town of residence, their sports, clubs and academic achievements for their four years; even where they expected to be after graduation. Seldom do we find all these things provided in any one yearbook or all the time, and some yearbooks are far better than others for this information. The PHS Annual of '32, for example, Delpine Tagliaferro, nickname "Elfie", who lived at 1012 East St., went to Hibbard, then Plunkett Junior High before coming to the high school. She participated in the posture club and baseball team, got an award for shorthand and had the interesting ambition "to be naughty, but nice". Some of these "ambitions" made me laugh. One girl's ambition was "to be as beautiful as I am dumb", while another wanted to "invent a muffler for my laugh". Did grandpa become the "super salesman" or "chase rum runners" or, like Russel B... "marry a girl with lots of money"?

Following the graduates section are the social and athletic sections. There are group photos of the debating or Latin club, school dances, the play or musical (there usually is one and it seems to be a highlight of the year and involves most of the graduating class). Too often, individuals in the group photographs are not identified. This seems to be true with the

school candids taken for contemporary yearbooks as well.

The yearbooks almost always have a class history, a class will and class prophesy. These are sometimes very revealing. The PHS Pendulum of 1936 had a section called Class Statistics", wherein are found the "Most Popular" (Robert Hopkins and Mary Conry), Class Musician (Joseph Dastoli and Helen Gay), Best Athlete (Stephen Trepacz and Rita Cullen), The Woman Hater (Stephen Trepacz) and Man Hater (Roberta Paul)". (The latter I can imagine having gone together only to have broken up just before the yearbook went to press. You will just have to ask them.)

The final section of any yearbook were the ads that helped cover the costs of production. Usually the main businesses in town contributed, but, in recent years money has been raised by adding a "congratulations section", with quotes, often from family members. In the Suffield (Conn.) High School Sagitta of 1994 there were even family photographs along with a message from the folks in the photo. A recent trend has been to include baby pictures of the graduates, sometimes next to the graduates' more formal poses, sometimes they are found with the candid shots. Yearbooks offer the researcher unique views of the people they are looking for which are not available anywhere else.

Another trend making yearbooks even more valuable to the family historian is the inclusion and expansion of the undergraduate section. Economic reality has dictated this expansion. Almost twenty five percent of a yearbook is devoted to the underclasses or at least shared with them. Sports, etc., photos are often mixed although seniors, or for spring sports, last year's juniors, would get individual coverage. Underclass photos first

appeared as group shots with no names. Later, small, individual photographs were presented in alphabetical order sometimes along with the class shot. Candids of underclassmen have been added in recent years to make the yearbook more attractive and more interesting - and

more saleable at \$40.00 a book.

Today it is not uncommon to hold yearbook assemblies at which hundreds of slides of students and faculty are shown to stir up interest. It has become a big business. Yearbooks have always been a big, expensive, and time consuming effort by students and faculty. Like so many things requiring special knowledge and skills it seems yearbooks have become somewhat institutionalized to the point where part-time faculty staff must be provided and course credit given for yearbook editorial and production staff. The results, however, are amazing and somewhat unique to each school and each graduating class. The learning is real and useful to the students when they leave school.

Some of the unique features are especially valuable to the family researcher. The Norway (Maine) High School Caduceus, for example, contained an extraordinary chronicle on the fate of the alumni. Every year, for a time, all the previous classes were reviewed and the names (married and maiden), occupations, schools and residence were given. The space required for this became too great and a system of listing every fifth alumni class was adopted. Each year different years were reviewed, but all were covered every five years. This was a terrific resource and I wish more yearbooks would devote a couple of pages to the alumni in this way. Here is just one page from the 1954 edition. The * denotes that the person had passed away.

At another time (Jan. 1919) in the same yearbook, and I found this in other year books as well, around the time of the major wars an Honor Roll was included with the names of the young men and women in the various services from 1895 to 1919. The Pittsfield High School *Dome* had an Honor Roll of Faculty and students from the Class of 1943 and the service they were in and their rank.

Keep in mind not all of these are found in every yearbook or in every year. So much depended on the yearbook adviser who often did it for many years. The individual class and yearbook editors also had a lot to say about how their yearbook would look. The school's success, its very character, becomes clear in the way certain aspects of school life are emphasized in the yearbook. For example, the Pittsfield High School yearbook for 1939 highlights the annual musical. That year it was *H.M.S. Pinafore*. It evidently was the thing. The yearbook itself that year was called the *P.H.S. Pinafore* and the naval theme was carried throughout the yearbook even to the class prophesy; a fictional example will suffice: Chief Radio Mate... because Margie ...was always on the phone or gave her life to the local radio station, etc. Some of these were funny and some may have had hidden meaning.

Yearbooks then are productions of the schools. They are found at the college, high school and, lately, the middle school and even some elementary schools. They are found, often in complete collections at the local library and in the local school. Accessibility is better at the library, however, where there is also usually a copy machine available. The yearbooks themselves are removed from the general stacks and must be requested of the librarian. These dedicated people are well aware of the importance of this resource. They realize that it is a resource in great demand more often than not by people seeking clues to birth parents, that is adoptees; or even birth parents seeking those same children. Modern "people searchers" have been using these for years; it is only recently that genealogists have begun to wake up to the incredible potential of these sources.

Each yearbook is unique, but must be seen with all the other yearbooks that a school or school system produces. The trend toward *individual* photographs each year the student is in middle and high school makes these yearbooks more than a single time capsule; for they capture whole decades, changes, family groups, values, suggestions of character and skills; and those rare visuals of our "old ones" when they were just kids...and they were once.

One word of caution needs to be made here. This resource is unique and very valuable. The photographs alone chronicle many individual years of a person's life and these are often the only visual records available that are identified by name; so some people have yielded to the selfish temptation to take the original rather than accept a copy. This has resulted in yearbooks being cut up to get the pictures and thus partially destroying the yearbooks for others who come later. This is unconscionable, especially when quality copiers - those that actually enhance the photographs - are available (not to mention 35mm cameras and quality film). Librarians who are concerned about this feel forced to restrict access or even require that they do the copying. This is wrong. The person searching often doesn't want to identify

who they are looking for and should be free to copy anything they want from the yearbooks so long as the yearbooks' condition permits it. Restricting or signing for yearbooks and a quick review of condition prior to and after use might be in order, but this is often asking too much of very busy librarians. Discretion and common sense should prevail. Every effort should be made to build up the yearbook collections in our libraries and repositories and to preserve them for the future, for the future is now; and these yearbooks are to a great degree the cream of the genealogical crop of twentieth century resources.

THE BOOKSTALL

Memorial History of Hartford County, Connecticut, 1635-1884, (2 volumes), edited by J. Hammond Trumbull, LLD, 1886. Facsimile reprint, Volume I, 704pp, 7½" x 11", hard bound, archival paper and binding, illus., portraits, map, index to both volumes. Price: Volume I, \$71.00 plus \$6.00 S/H. Volume II, \$57.50 plus \$6.00 S/H. Both Volumes, \$119.50 plus \$7.50 S/H. Order from Higginson Book Co., 148 Washington St., Salem, MA 01970.

Part I of the book is a compilation of pieces by seventeen contributors on the early history of the County - the Indians, Dutch traders, development of the "River Towns", the Revolutionary War, medical history, literature, the militia, freemasonry and other fraternal organizations, emigration and the raising of tobacco.

Part II is devoted to Hartford - Town and City - with fifteen articles portraying the various phases of Hartford's development from an early settlement to a capitol of the insurance industry. Not only are the various pieces packed with information and numerous illustrations, they are very interesting reading as well. There are more than thirty portraits of important individuals of the time and specimen signatures of many people. For the genealogist there are hundreds of individuals mentioned in connection with various enterprises and frequently with some lineage relationship. This is extremely interesting reading.

Volume II (companion volume), 570pp, maps, illus., portraits. Town Histories - the development of each of the twenty-eight towns of Hartford County is set forth by individual writers covering the period from settlement or incorporation to 1886. The various narratives contain a wealth of detail and in particular naming the indiduals involved, and sometimes with additional family relationships. The description of clock manufacture in Bristol was particularly interesting as were the details of copper mines in East Granby, which later became Newgate prison.

These two volumes contain a vast wealth of genealogical information woven into extremely interesting historical narratives. The index provides access to around four to five thousand names.

History of Danby, Vermont, by J. C. Williams, 1869. Fac-simile reprint, 393pp, 9-7/8" x 6-3/4", hard bound, archival paper and binding, map. Price \$42.50 plus \$4.75 S/H. Order from Higginson Book Co., 148 Washington St., Salem, MA 01970.

The first two chapters discuss the early settlement of Danby in 1760 as a township of New Hampshire, with the text of the original charter and a listing of the original grantees. In 1764 the west bank of the Connecticut River was declared the boundary between New York and New Hampshire. At first this was looked upon as just a change in jurisdiction but soon complications

arose, to the extent of involving Ethan Allen and the "Green Mountain Boys".

In the early history of Danby several lists of "freemen" are presented. There are a number of interesting accounts of town meetings, with the history carried forward to 1868 with listings of the incumbents in the various town offices from 1764-1868. Short articles discuss Manufactures, Hotels, Merchants, Education, Church History and Cemeteries.

Of particular interest to the family historian is the 135 page "Family Sketches" section, listing some 350 named families. For many of these the treatment is extensive with reference to many people, probably several thousand. However, lacking an index of persons, surnames, other than those of named families, require searching the text.

This work collects into one volume the Society's four quarterlies for the year 1981. Several of the lead articles, by different authors, discuss research in England and there is a series on the various aspects of heraldry and coats of arms, including how to acquire one. Each quarterly has a question and answer section related to genealogy - in addition to the large query section. Various tools of the trade, such as American Genealogical and Biographical Index and N. E. Marriages Prior to 1700. A very helpful section is "Work in Progress" which displays, in detail, several generations of work being done [from one of them we filled in a few of our own blank spaces]. Each issue has an ahnentafel of two or three pages. Family names featured in the volume include Chadwell, Kelley, Everitt, Dearborn, Wilson(Wiswall), Graham-Vedoe, Hillman, Reed, Ramsdell, McIntosh, Eaton and Gray. A new index of persons has been added.



This volume contains tombstone data from sixty-four cemeteries in the towns of Blackstone, Douglas, Grafton, Hopedale, Mendon, Milford, Millville, Oxford, Sutton, Uxbridge and Whitins-ville in Worcester County and Bellingham and Medway in Norfolk County.

Each entry contains some or all of this information: dates of birth and death, place of birth and death, age at death, names of spouse and parents and names of military organizations and campaigns in which served. The data were copied from every legible tombstone in every known cemetery in the town listed. The earliest birthdate noted was 1785 and the majority of the death dates were in the 1800's.

GUIDE TO INTERPRETATION OF THE 1855 MASSACHUSETTS CENSUS

The taking of a census in 1855 was mandated by an act of the General Court of Massachusetts, 21 May 1855. The act provided that a census of each city and town be taken between 1 June and 1 October 1855. The census was to be "as of" the first day of June of the census year.

Reports on the taking of the census stated that the instructions were generally "well observed". Some enumerators, however, were so negligent or heedless that their reports were "scarcely fit to be received". Cautions, still appropriate, were given against relying too absolutely on the census because of "the great liability to error", and the "usual difficulty of arriving at the truth" arising from ignorance and prejudice.

To secure uniform reporting, blank forms were provided and the following data were to be recorded:

- 1. Dwelling houses numbered in the order of their visitation.
- 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation, ("family" being all those living in one house, public house or institution.)
- 3. Name of every person whose usual place of residence was in this family 1 June 1855. Note: Excluded were those born after 1 June. Included were those who had died after 1 June and those temporarily absent. Relationship of household members to the head of the household was not recorded. An aid in establishing relationships exists, nevertheless, in the requirement that the enumerator arrange names in a given order:
 - (1) Master
 - (2) Mistress
 - (3) Children in order of age
 - (4) Male domestics, etc.
 - (5) Female domestics, etc.
 - (6) Boarders, etc.
- 4. Age. To be given as of last birthday unless next birthday would be within four months, then age at next birthday.
 - 5. Sex.
 - 6. Color. B for Blacks, M for Mulatto, no entry for Whites.
- 7. Profession, occupation or trade for each male over fifteen. For clergymen, initial letters of denomination.
- 8. Place of birth. State or territory if native born; country if foreign born.
- 9. Whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper or convict.
