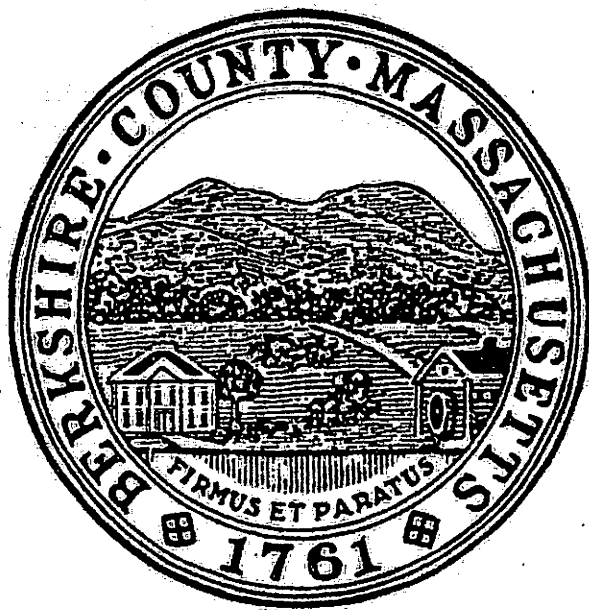

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SWEETS

Compiled by Helen Louise Sweet¹

[This article is a continuation of material published in Volume 17, Number 4. At that time there was no indication that more material would become available. Ms. Sweet intends to carry the data on to David⁵ Sweet's son Elnathan⁶ and his son Jonathan James⁷ Sweet Squire and his children, some of whom ended up in Berkshire County. Ed.]

The reference in my previous article to "David Sweet, 1738" appears to have been found in the book *Descendants of John Irish The Immigrant 1629-1963*, by Willis Luther Irish and Stella Bertha Putman Irish, 1967, viz.,

"The David Sweet born 1738 is the son of Benjamin⁴ Sweet and his wife 'Susanah spencer dau of Robert spencer.'

"XII. David⁵ Sweet, b December 2 1738 in East Greenwich, RI." [Benjamin⁴ (Henry³, John², John¹) was a brother to my John⁴, "weauer"].

To date I have not found the recorded births of David⁵ nor of his brother, Jonathan, but in the will of their father, John⁴, "weauer" dated November 8, 1731 and probated December 15, 1731 [North Kingstown, RI Probate Book 7:6-8, also NK LE 8B:52], the five surviving children of John⁴ Sweet and his wife Catharine are made known. David⁵ Sweet was referred to as "eldest son."

In an effort to have some idea of David's birth year, I used the following: David⁵ Sweet was made a freeman of North Kingstown after March 2nd 1735/6. Due to the severely burned vital records of N.K. all that is left of the right side of page 328 is "David Swe" [Town Council Meetings N.K., R.I., Book I, pp 327-333], but from Vol. IV, p. 518-519 *Records of the Colony of Rhode Island 1707-1740*, edited by John R. Bartlett, the following appears: "Proceedings of the General Assembly held for the Colony of R.I. ... at Newport the 4th day of May 1736" - the eleventh name appearing is "'David Sweet' of North Kingstown, admitted freeman of this colony." A man had to have reached his majority; hence, 1736 minus 21 years = 1715. It is possible David might have been born a few years before.

The marriage of David Sweet to Marcey Sweet took place in North Kingstown. The burned page fragment, as previously published in *Berkshire Genealogist*, reads:

Sometime during or before June 1753, David^s Sweet and his
 growing family of daughters and sons left the area of North
 Kingstown/Exeter to East Greenwich and took occupation of the 20
 odd acres that had been given to his brother, Jonathan Sweet (he
 died intestate as records of North Kingstown and Exeter will
 show), in the will of his father John^s Sweet. Jonathan having
 made no will, the land would pass on to the eldest son, David^s
 Sweet. This homestead farm had been where Henry^s Sweet had lived
 for many years. The current location now is east bounded by Rte.
 2, with the south by the Middle Road and on the north by Division
 Road. This is but a rough description. It is my understanding
 that in the area where Henry Sweet's homestead farm was located
 now stands a shopping mall.

In East Greenwich were born the other children of David Sweet by Marcey his wife:

"John Sweet: The fifth Son of David Sweet and Born of y^e
 Body of Marcey his wife in East Greenwich June
 y^e 20th 1753: and on the forth Day of the Weak
 "Amus Sweet: the Sixth Son of David Sweet and Born of y^e
 Body of Marcey his wife in East Greenwich
 December y^e 26 1755: and on the Seventh Day of
 the weak
 "Marcey Sweet: the fifth Daughter of David Sweet and Born of
 y^e Body of Marcey his wife in East Greenwich
 September y^e 29th 1760 on the Second Day of the
 weak" 2:23

With the severely burned birth records of North Kingstown,
 it appears that David and his wife Marcy had four daughters and
 four sons born and recorded there.

Their first born child Thankful was married and this record is as follows:

 and Thankful Sweet of S^d East Greenwich Daughter of David Sweet;
 was Married in East Greenwich February y^e Third: 1760 according

We now continue with David^s Sweet's son Elnathan⁶, his wife Mehitabel (Rogers) and their children:

As noted previously there is only a fragment left of the record of the children of David Sweet and Marcey, his wife, but according to Elnathan's grave stone in the Baptist Cemetery, Stephentown, Rensselaer County, New York, he died 25 Sept 1819 in his 73rd year, hence his birth year could be O.S. January 2, 1745-6 or 1746-7 (born January 13, 1746 N.S.)

To date I have found no records of the marriage of Elnathan to Mehitabel nor the births of their children

Elnathan⁶ Sweet was of Stephentown Precinct or District as early as 1775 for in that year on January 9th Jonathan Douglass, late of Jerico in the County of Berkshire, now of New Lebanon in the County of Albany, sold lot 15 for one hundred pounds to Elnathan Sweet of said Stephentown.

THE HIGH COSTS OF CONSTRUCTION - 1817

The prices of building supplies in Copenhagen, New York in 1817-18 were: Lime, per bushel, 2s, 6d; lath, hemlock boards, etc. \$6 per M; scantling and brace timber, \$8 per M; nailes, 19 cts per lb.; iron, 10 cts; shingles, \$2.50 per M; pine boards, \$14 per M; oil, \$1.50 per gallon; Spanish White, 12½ cts per lb.; white lead, 31 cts; and whiskey, \$1.25 per gallon.

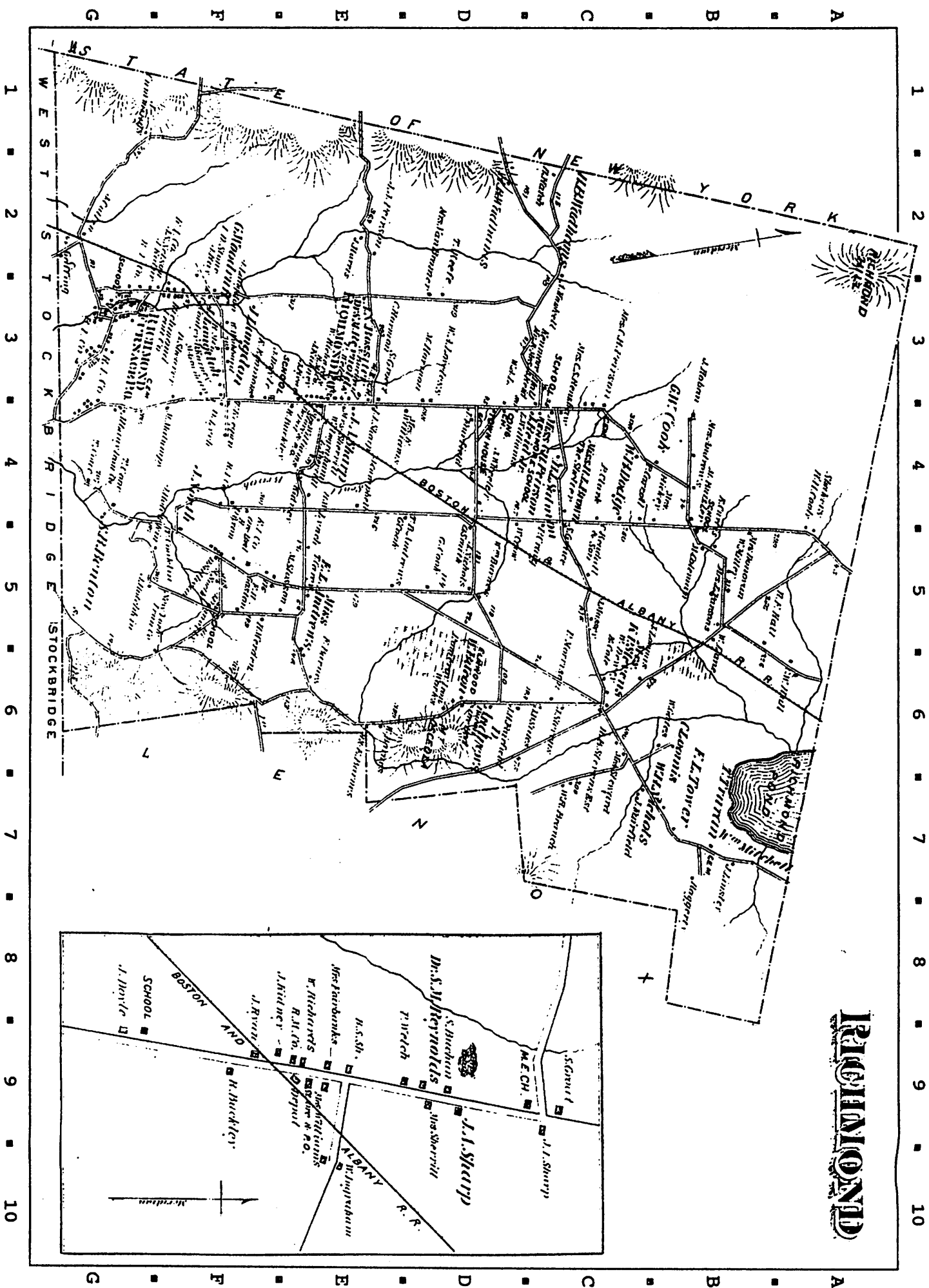

THE TREMAIN FAMILIES IN EARLY BERKSHIRE COUNTY, MASSACHUSETTS

The Tremain family members who resided in what is now Berkshire County, Mass. during the 18th century were all descendants of Philip and Rebecca (Grainger) Tremain, of Westfield, Mass. After the death of Philip in 1743, and Rebecca's marriage to Daniel Cooley in 1746, four of the seven adult Tremain children, John, Benjamin, Rachel and Violet, moved to the Berkshires.

It appears that the first to seriously consider moving into the western wilds of what was then Massachusetts Bay Colony was the oldest son, John, in 1742. He purchased lot 29 south in the Pontoosick Settlement, now the site of Pittsfield. The sale was conditioned on the seller securing approval of the land division and the buyer making specified improvements. (Would you believe a lawn of English grass!)

In 1748, John decided not to develop lot 29 and sold it to his brother Benjamin, who still lived in Westfield at the time. This hundred acre lot was well located by today's standards, being a few hundred feet south and west of the Berkshire Athenaeum. There is no evidence that Benjamin ever visited lot 29, for he is found in the Town of Sheffield, at the southern end of the county only a year later.

Benjamin Tremain married Rhoda Pier, the daughter of Sgt. Thomas Pier, in Sheffield on 15 May 1749. Records indicate he entered the lands west of Sheffield in May of 1750. There he built a house and cultivated 13 of the 20 acres he fenced. He and his neighbors acted to clear title to the lands they occupied, first by acquiring the rights held by the Stockbridge Indians and then seeking the creation of a District. He eventually took title to lots 19 and 45.

During the 1750's, lands west of Sheffield were subject to disputed claims by the Colony of New York and the Massachusetts Bay Colony. Representatives of each group often charged the other of trespass or similar offense. In February of 1755, Benjamin Tremain and two other men were taken prisoner and abused by a band of men who carried them to Court in Claverack, NY where they were charged with "riot" and transported to the Albany "gaol". After two days, friends came and posted bond for them. Since the border war was a dispute between provinces, the three released prisoners petitioned the Province of Massachusetts Bay to take up their defense. No record has been found of the response.

Two of Benjamin's younger sisters, Rebecca and Violet, left their step-father's home in Westfield, each marrying Great Barrington men. Rachel Tremain married Benjamin's brother-in-law, Thomas Pier, on 12 Dec 1751 at Sheffield. They had several sons and left Berkshire County by the early 1790's. Sister Violet

married Timothy Younglove in Sheffield on 27 Apr 1757. They reportedly had several children, but only Ruby lived to maturity. Ruby married David Wainwright 19 Feb 1776 and remained in Great Barrington the rest of her life. Timothy Younglove was once considered a Tory but served in the Berkshire County Militia during the Revolution. Timothy died 31 Dec 1796, Violet on 13 Oct 1823.

Benjamin and Rhoda Tremain had nine children. The family affiliated with the Great Barrington Congregational Church, where at least five of their children were baptized. Rhoda died 28 Jan 1768. By mid-1771, Benjamin had joined the Egremont Church, perhaps due in part to the lack of a full time pastor in Great Barrington. It appears that Benjamin remarried, but little is known of his second wife. The 1771 Tax Valuation List cites Benjamin as having an annual net worth of ten pounds, with 20 acres under cultivation. Three of Benjamin's five sons served in the Revolutionary War, Joseph, Solomon and Reuben. By 1785, all but Reuben had moved westward into New York State. The other two sons were Benjamin and Julius, respectively born first and sixth.

The economic difficulties of western Massachusetts in the 1780's no doubt influenced this move. The remaining brother, Reuben, no doubt faced these same pressures and in the autumn of 1786 allied himself with Daniel Shays' patriots. He led the band of Egremont men who occupied the Great Barrington Court House in October 1786 to prevent the Court from sitting. He was later one of the 31 men indicted by the Supreme Judicial Court in Great Barrington on 20 Mar 1787. In the indictment his occupation was cited as Gentleman. No record has been found as to the disposition of his case. Reuben was in Vermont by the 1790 U.S. Census, while his father and brothers were enumerated in New York.

In 1750 John Tremain again considered a move to Pontoosick and purchased lot 14 south, adjacent to the parcel that he had sold to his brother in 1748. However, delays in securing approval of the land division and increased Indian hostility probably discouraged him. Both he and Benjamin sold their Pontoosick holdings at a loss in 1752.

John Tremain did at last move from Westfield to Berkshire County, in about 1763, when he settled in Egremont. Both he and his son John purchased lands of Nicholas Van Gelder. John and he with sons Philip and John, Jr. were enumerated in the 1771 Tax Evaluation Roll with modest holdings. John's mother and stepfather also moved to Egremont where Daniel Cooley was one of the first members of the Egremont Congregational Church, established 20 Feb 1770. John's mother, wife and two children also affiliated with the Egremont Church.

Five of John's sons saw service during the Revolution as Berkshire County militiamen. Sons Jonathan and Abner later went to New York where they joined the Second Regiment of the Line. Gaius moved to New York, where he was listed in the Eastern District of Claverack tax list in 1779. Other sons followed. Abner returned a war hero in 1783 and married Mary McLellan of Alford in 1785. The 1790 U.S. Census enumerates John's sons Philip, Gaius, Daniel and Jared in Hinsdale, NY, John in Canandaigua, NY and Abner in Rensselaerville, NY.

Of the early Tremains, John, Benjamin, Rachel and Violet, only Violet's family remained in Berkshire County. The families of John, Benjamin and Rachel settled in New York State by 1800. In the 1790's cousins of those early Tremains also moved into or through Berkshire County. Most soon passed into New York. The most notable of the later Tremains to remain in Berkshire County was Capt. Nathaniel Tremain, a Gentleman of Pittsfield by 1810.

Although experiences of these early Tremains may have been unusual, their movement from the Connecticut Valley to the Berkshires and on into New York State was common during that era.

REGARDING BENJAMIN AND RHODA TREMAIN'S SONS JULIUS AND REUBEN

Benjamin and Rhoda Tremain resided in lands west of Sheffield at the westerly margin of Hampshire County, MA from 1750 until the establishment of the Town of Egremont and the County of Berkshire in 1760. Seven of their children were baptized. Their sons Julius and Reuben appear to have been born between October 1757 and July 1761, that being the period between the baptism of their second through fifth children at the Great Barrington Congregational Church and the baptism of Reuben. In reviewing all the source material concerning them, I was struck by the fact that these two sons never appear in the same record set.

Reuben was baptized 12 July 1761 but there is no record that Julius was baptized. There is evidence of militia service for Reuben but not Julius. The sale of Thomas Pier's land for the benefit of the children of his deceased daughter, Rhoda, cites Julius and wife Lucy, but not Reuben. The indictment of Reuben Tremain for participation in Shays' Rebellion describes him as Gentleman, but there is no record that he ever owned land. Julius did own land and is listed on the Egremont Tax Roll of 1783. Julius is not enumerated in the 1790 U.S. Census, but a Reubin Treman is found in Vermont, a haven for participants in Shays' Rebellion. His household had four young males and five females. That is very near the household composition that Julius would have had, based on the family described in Treman and Poole's history of the Tremain family.

While the children of Julius can be traced, there is nothing in the record as to the fate of the four young males in Reuben's household in 1790. Finally, there is an error-filled paragraph (pp 516-517) in Horton's *Gazetteer of Jefferson County, New York* stating that Reuben Tremain married Lucy Winchell. Because of the known errors, the linking of Reuben to Lucy Winchell had been given little credibility. However, as new information supports Lucy Winchell being the wife of Julius Tremain, perhaps Julius and Reuben Tremain are the same person?

I am at a loss to identify potential untapped sources which might answer the question. Are there suggestions of research to clarify the status of Julius or Reuben, or do the above facts reasonably establish their being one and the same person?

The records are presented in three sections 1773-1800, 1801-1825 and 1826-1850. The systematic recording of deaths did began in 1792 when Rev. Alvan Hyde included this information in records of his church. These started in 1775 and continue through 1800. He also recorded marriages performed by him from 1792 through 1799. This presentation is followed by a record of the epitaphs from the earliest part of the Lee cemetery. There are also photographs of many of these stones.

The 1801-1925 section was published in 1901 and covers Lee and South Lee. The concluding section was published in 1910 and covers 1826-1850. For the most part, the entries display the complete gravestone inscription and there are many photographs of the stones as well.

The text covers the first six generations of the ancestry of Elizabeth Winchell born 27 Mar 1771 in Great Barrington and died 25 Feb 1850 in Bluffdale, Greene Co., IL. It includes material published by B.F.H.A. in *The Winchell Family* in 1992, combining it with data from several sources by which the author "presents a proven family lineage for Elizabeth (Winchell) Spencer", correcting a number of lineages previously incorrectly reported.

The numbering and identification system provides food for thought. Elizabeth carries generation indicators of 1 and 6. Her generation is the first to be covered in the study and she is of the 6th generation in America.

Every transcription contains some or all of the following data, relating to the deceased: date and place of birth, date and place of death, cause of death, age at time of death and names of spouse(s). Where the deceased had performed military service, is noted. For a deceased wife, many of the inscriptions reveal her maiden name. Over eighty pages of index provide ready access to specific entries.
