FAMILY RECORDS

THE GOODRICH FAMILY, From the Clapp Family Papers in the Local History Department of the Berkshire Athenaeum, Pittsfield, Massachusetts.

William² Goodrich, b in or near Burg St. Edmunds, Suffolk County, England. He came to America about 1648 and settled in Wethersfield, Conn. Was a general in King Philip's War, 1675. Married Sarah Marvin, b Oct 4, 1648.

John³ Goodrich, b May 20th 1653, d Sept. 5, 1730, Wethersfield. Conn. Married Rebecca Allen, b Mch. 28, 1678.

Allen⁴ Goodrich, b Nov. 13, 1690, Wethersfield, Conn., d Apl 8, 1764, Farmington, Conn. M Elizabeth Goodrich b Dec 29, 1709, and Hannah Lyman.

Elisha⁵ Goodrich, b Sept 2, 1712, lived in Berlin, Conn., m Rebecca Lyman.

Josiah⁶ Goodrich, b Jan 15, 1740, d Oct 24, 1793. m Ruth Gilbert and Abigail (Wolcott) Wright. Levi⁷ Goodrich, b Dec 9, 1785, d Aug 8, 1868, m Wealthy Whitney b Feb 27, 1806.

William was second son of a man named Goodrich and sister of Duke of Marlboro. His father died and his brother brought William and his older brother John to America and bought a farm for William in Wethersfield, Conn. The Duke, being childless, sent for John to return to England and inherit his estate. John died on the passage.

CLAPP FAMILY RECORDS.

Roger¹ Clapp and Joanna Ford were married in 1633. Their daughter Elizabeth² Clapp and Joseph Holmes were married in 1658. Their daughter Aurelia Wait³ Holmes and John Simpson were married in 1695. Their son John⁴ Simpson and Mary Randall were married in 1724. Their son John⁵ Simpson and Elizabeth Hardee were married in N.C. in 1758. Their son Samuel⁶ Simpson and Penelope McElwaine were married in 1785. Their daughter Mary Nixon⁷ Simpson and William F. Biddle were married in 1810. Their daughter Susan A.⁸ Biddle and Rich'd G. Cobb were married in 1848. Their daughter Mary⁹ Cobb and Jno. C. Wooten were married in 1870.

Roger Clapp (our first ancestor) was born in Salcomb Regis, Devonshire, England. He married Johanna Ford in 1620 [sic. discrepancy in this family record. Ed.] Thaddeus Clapp, 3d married Lucy P. Goodrich, May 1st 1845. Thaddeus, 3d died Nov 5th 1890 in Pittsfield, Mass. He had a remarkably honorable descent of eight generations, the direct descendant of Roger, the first Clapp, 1620 to the present time, 1926, 306 years.

When Roger Clapp married Johanna Ford in 1620, they came to America and settled in Wethersfield, Conn. When they died both were buried in Boston, Massachusetts - or rather in the graveyard close to the King's Chapel and the old South Church.

A brother of Thaddeus, 3d graduated as a Capt. at West Point and served with honors in the war with the South.

The uncle of Thaddeus was for years a professor of mathematics in Williams Coll. Massachusetts. Your [we have no antecedent for the pronoun. Ed.] great, great, great grandmother was a Whitney of the distinguished branch of the New York family. Her daughter Wealthy Whitney married your great, great grandfather Levi Goodrich, who died Aug 8th at Pittsfield, Massachusetts. He was the 7th generation from William Goodrich, who was born at Bury [sic] St. Edmunds, Suffolk, England. William came to America in 1648. His wife was Sarah Marvin. He was a distinguished general in King Phillip's War with the Indians in 1675. The 1st William, the second son of a Goodrich who married a sister of the Duke of Marlborough. The 1st William died, and his brother brought William, 2d and John the older brother to America. The Duke of Marlborough being childless sent for John Goodrich to come to England to inherit the estate, but John died on the passage and William came into the property. The ruins of Goodrich castle still stands in Wales, and has been visited by some of the Goodrich family who have photographs of it, which I have seen.

S. B. Goodrich and uncle of your great, great grandfather Levi Goodrich was an author of many books of travel, writing under the nom de plume of Peter Parley. He was at one time American Ambassador in Paris, France.

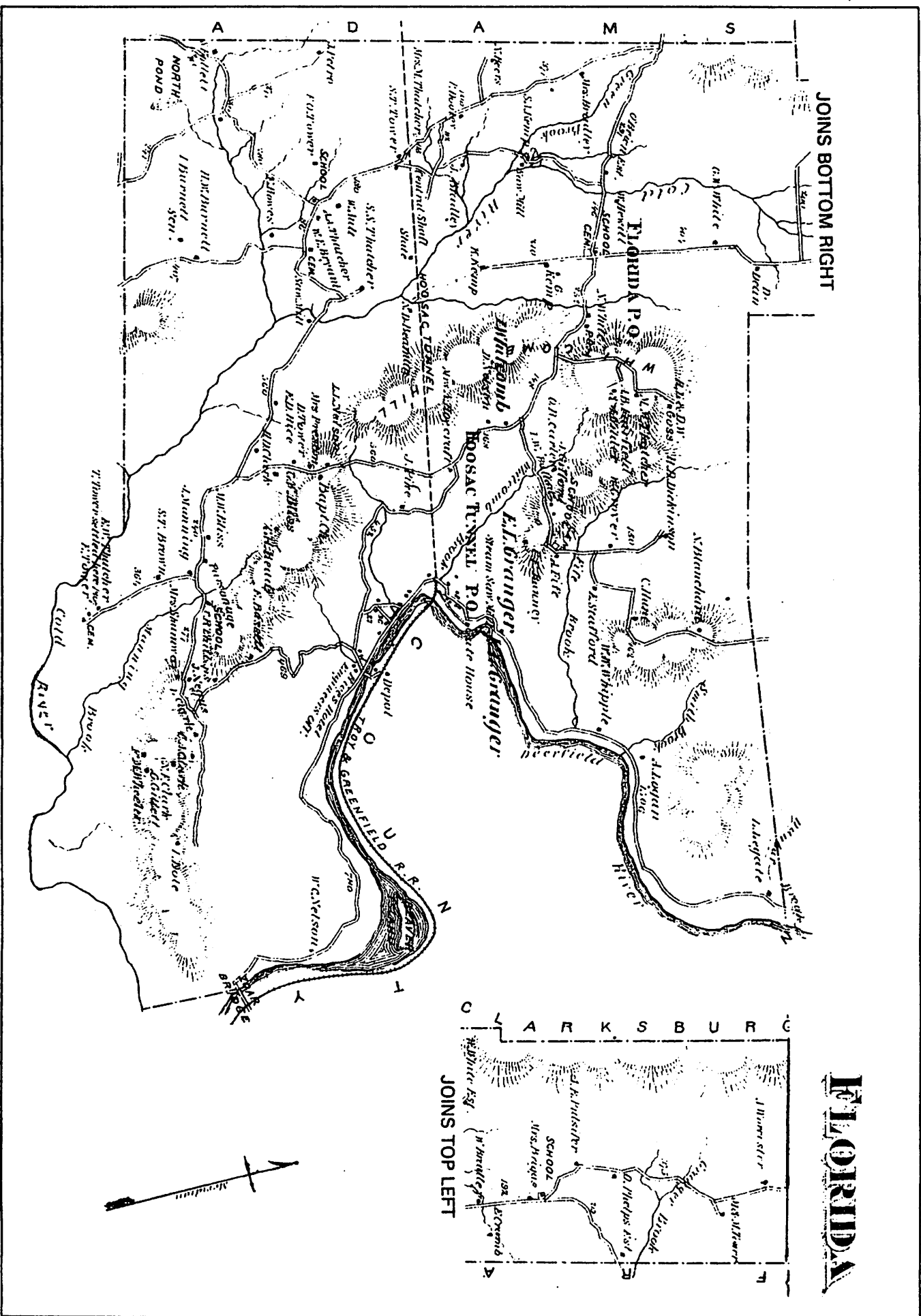

"There were no 'credits' prior to the payment of State Bounties in 1863. The town of Lee, Massachusetts has absolutely had no dispute with any other town as to her credits and quota. Under the call of the President, in July and August, 1862, Lee paid the following bounties: \$3,500 to thirty-five men in the 37th Regt.; \$5,800 to fifty-eight men in the 49th Regt.; Total, \$9,300. Lee got reimbursed from the State for the same amounts given; received from Great Barrington \$100 for one transfer - Lee re-funding to Great Barrington the \$100."

A CUMULATIVE CENSUS OF NEW ASHFORD, MASSACHUSETTS, 1790-1920

UNDERSTANDING THE CENSUS

The index books made to help the research of Federal Census records easier have eleven pages devoted to explaining why there are so many mistakes found on Census sheets. The following are listed as possible causes.

1. How well educated was the Enumerator? Penmanship, etc.
2. Spelling by sound.
3. Multiple lettering.
4. Reduction of letters.
5. Vowel interchanging.
6. Mis-formed letters or look-alike letters.
7. Listing of ethnic names
8. Nicknames and abbreviated names variations.
9. Voluntary and involuntary information from the resident.
10. Americanizing and aliasing of names.
11. The small "F" and "S" bloopers. (Jesse-Jefse, etc.)
12. Missing a letter or letters
13. Resident not home. Neighbors answered questions.

The Census of New Ashford has many of the above errors and probably others that are not listed above. If the name was legible it was copied as it was written on the Census sheet. I did not correct the Enumerator's mistakes even though I knew many of the correct spellings. I will leave this to the reader's interpretation.

Census lists of the years 1790 through 1840 give only the name of the head of each family listed by the Census Enumerator. These years also list by number the males and females who reside with the family head in that house. Census years 1850 through 1870 list all individuals in each home by name, age and sex, but not their relationship to each other. Years 1880 through 1920 adds relationship and other things which could be useful to the researcher. There is a sheet with each Census year showing what information was asked by the Census Enumerator. This can be found by checking the Census itself at any Federal Archives. Space does not allow it to be done here.

Names in each ten year Census 1790 through 1920 are listed alphabetically by last name, first name, line number and page number. Also for the years 1850 through 1920 the residents of each household are listed in the same order as shown on the Census taken by the Census Enumerator; page, line, first name, last name, age and place of birth. Each house listed will begin with [1] first name last name. From that name to the next [1] are the only residents of that house. The first name which has a [1] in front of it is listed as the head of that house.

The years 1870 and 1910 were the most difficult to inter-

pret. When the name could not be read on any of the Census sheets, the line number will still appear on the index sheets with a question mark and possibly the first or last name and sex of the individual. Every possible town record was used to check names that were difficult to read. Assessor's, Birth, Death, Cemetery and Vital records. Please note that as was written in the first part of this introductory that the spelling was copied as written unless it was so far removed that it seemed best to help the poor dead and departed Enumerator write what he should have in the first place.

THE ELMER I. SHEPARD CORRESPONDENCE FILES

The collection of Elmer I. Shepard, which has been described in detail heretofore (see *Berkshire Genealogist* Volume 9, Number 2, Page 102, and Volume 16, Number 2, Page 39) contains numerous pieces of correspondence with other genealogists, as well as bits and pieces of his notes from documents he researched. Reading most of his correspondence that we have is like making sense of a phone conversation to which you are privy to only one side. However, as we believe that even the tiniest snippet may provide valuable clues to families being researched by our membership, we will publish them here.

The following is the content of a letter dated October 7, 1946 to Mr. Shepard from William A. Day, of Bradenton, Florida. Data in italics represent marginal notations by Mr. Shepard.

Thank you very much for your answer to my query in the Hartford Times in regard to Abraham Burrell. I wonder if your information is complete. According to the Kellogg Genealogy Abraham Burrell was born at Lynn, Mass. on April 1, 1729 and died at Sheffield on November 18, 1798. If he died in 1798 why was his estate not probated until 7 Dec. 1815? I have a copy of the bible page of a bible presented to Jonathan Burrell by his father Abraham; in it the daughter Anna born 8 Oct 1764 was listed as Arnold; a son Arnold was born 5 May 1766. Was there another Abraham Burrell in Sheffield?

RESPONSE TO QUERY 98003

Among others sailing out of London on the *Christian* in March (no year stated) and arriving in Boston in June (no year stated,

but probably before 1640) were Henry STILES 40 of Millbrook, County Bedford bound for Windsor, CT; Francis STILES 35 of Millbrook, Bedford bound for Windsor; Mrs. Rachel STILES 28; John STILES 33 of Millbrook, Bedford bound for Windsor; Mrs. Joan STILES 35; Henry STILES 3; John STILES 3/4. [Source: *Planters of the Commonwealth*, Banks)

Sir Richard Saltonstall, an English nobleman, had a grant of land in the Windsor, CT area and engaged the Stiles party to establish and maintain a settlement there. However, there were a number of groups competing for the same territory and the Saltonstall activity dispersed to more favorable locations. My immigrant ancestor Thomas Cooper, a member of the party, moved to Springfield.

On a more recent note, Ephraim Stiles, a gg-grandson of John Stiles, of Westfield, was one of the eight men who, in 1764, founded the First Church of Christ, Congregational, in Pittsfield. [Source: Records of First Church]

SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR WRITING QUERIES

1. Give the full name, including middle name or initial, of the person subject to enquiry.
2. Establish identity of the person by giving place and date of birth, place and date of death, parentage, place and date of marriage and identity of spouse to the extent these data are known, as:
John DOE b Hartford, CT 12 Jan 1900; d Fairfield, CT 19 Mar 1967 s/o Richard & Abigail (WESTON) DOE m Hartford 11 June 1923.
3. If unable to give a complete description of the person under enquiry, start with a son or daughter for whom more information might be available and ask for that person's ancestry.
4. Identify spouse in manner described in (2) above.
5. State what information is desired, as:
Need ancestors of John and Abigail.
6. Place the question at the end of the query.
7. Do not abbreviate the names of persons or towns.
8. For any locale outside Massachusetts, be sure to identify the state.
9. Dates should be written: day, month, year as: 13 Oct 1743.
10. Use multiple queries rather than several parts to the same query.
11. Queries should not exceed four or five lines and each should be printed or typed on a 3"X 5" index card. One query per card.
12. Well-known abbreviations may be used but elaborate use of them is not required.
13. Address for reply should be stated on each card so that the Editor is not obliged to keep their envelope as well in order to have a complete record.
14. Acknowledge receipt of all replies and reimburse respondent for postage and the cost of any material copied. One should not be left out of pocket for having answered a call for help. If the submitted material is of little use, that is the risk assumed in transactions by correspondence.
15. When requesting information, always include a SASE.
16. Help your query editor judge the effectiveness of this section. If you make a contact that provides significant help with your search, won't you let us know?
