

# FAMILY HISTORY RESEARCH LIBRARY OF THE SHEFFIELD HISTORICAL SOCIETY

# By James Miller, Archivist/Director

The Family History Research Library of the Sheffield Historical Society houses a unique collection of genealogy and social history for Sheffield, Berkshire County, and, to a lesser extent, the Massachusetts-New York-Connecticut tri-state area. It is located at 161 Main St., next door to the Society's Dan Raymond House headquarters, and offers comfortable, climate controlled work areas with photo copying and fiche copy/printer facilities.

Major unpublished strengths include 175 folders of research on Sheffield families and topics, cemetery and church records dating from the town's founding, 13 loose-leaf volumes of obituaries and death notices, a complete collection of town and school committee reports, vital records, house histories, maps, letters, deeds, journals, ledgers and photographs, and early 20th century voting lists. Of particular value is a collection (100 lineal feet) of Sheffield tax records, 1762-1980 listing taxpayers on a year-by-year basis with poll tax, real estate and personal property valuation, school, highway, church, animal and vehicle excise tax categories; a large collection of indentures, pauper and poor farm records from the town's Overseers of the Poor, 1752-1870; extensive 19th century town financial records, and road and bridge reports, 1798-1862, including hundreds of names on petitions for the opening, closing and altering of roadways.

Published information includes genealogies on the families Church, Huggins, Joiner, Karner, Keep, Kellogg, Noble, Owen, Porter and Root. Additional volumes include Hamilton Child's Gazetteer of Berkshire County, Massachusetts 1725-1885, which is, substantially, a directory for the year 1885 containing historical and genealogical information on businesses, their owners and early Berkshire families. Additional directories include 1910-1911, 1929-1931, 1932-1934 and 1954-1956, plus the Berkshire Courier, 1864-1949 (several years missing). On fiche the library has town meeting records from the first held in 1733, miscellaneous vital and cemetery records of the tri-state area and the I.G.I. for New England and select states associated with emigration from Berkshire County. Also available are the usual reference books and histories of Berkshire County, its towns, and "self-help" genealogy books.

Inquiries are accepted by walk-in, U. S. Mail, E-mail, or telephone, with trained volunteers available to assist the beginning or advanced researcher. Hours are Monday and Friday, 1:30-4:00 or by appointment. Use of the library is free to the public with a nominal charge for copying. We ask for research results for our files. Southern Massachusetts Cemetery Collection, Volume 2, by Susan Salisbury, 1996. Soft bound, 467pp, 5½" x 8-1/8", full name index. Price \$25.00 plus \$4.00 S/H. Visa/MasterCard/checks/money orders. Order from Heritage Books, Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Pl., Suite 300, Bowie, Md 20716.

This volume contains material from seventy-two cemeteries in the towns of Attleborough, Dighton, Franklin, Holliston, North Attleborough, Plainville, Rehoboth, Swansea and Wrentham. These towns are in the area of Bristol County south of Boston. Dates as early as 1737 were noted but the bulk are in the 1800's and early 1900's. The index is very helpful in that it lists in full all of the names appearing on the stones.

In 1990 the Berkshire County Commissioners established the Berkshire County Historical Commission to conduct detailed inventories of all of the town records of the thirty-towns of the County and producing individualized brochures displaying the inventory data and other relevant material. Raymond W. Fischer, one of the Commissioners, conducted the Dalton inventory and produced the Dalton brochure which has become the pattern for future publications.

In the conduct of this inventory, Fischer discovered, in a seldom visited area, a metal box containing manuscripts dating from 1784 to 1800. This trove together with the rediscovery of another collection of nearly 200 documents provided about 500 manuscripts in all, dating from 1784 to 1840, for study.

Fischer analyzed these documents, exploring further the leads they exposed, to produce an enlarged view of the past. In particular there is an interesting sidelight on the formation of Williams College, a suggestion of blundering in preparedness during the French and Indian War and new insight into Shays' Rebellions as related to the Dalton area.

The work covers: Early Settlements, Industry, Town Government, Dalton and the Church, 1789/1790 Census and Vital Statistics, 1780/1790 Occupations and References, Family Sketches, Dalton Grievances and Shays' Rebellion, Dalton and the Constitution, Shaping the Town and Warnings Out. There is genealogical material on a number of Dalton families.

# **GUIDE TO INTERPRETATION OF THE 1855 MASSACHUSETTS CENSUS**

The taking of a census in 1855 was mandated by an act of the General Court of Massachusetts, 21 May 1855. The act provided that a census of each city and town be taken between 1 June and 1 October 1855. The census was to be "as of" the first day of June of the census year.

Reports on the taking of the census stated that the instructions were generally "well observed". Some enumerators, however, were so negligent or heedless that their reports were "scarcely fit to be received". Cautions, still appropriate, were given against relying too absolutely on the census because of "the great liability to error", and the "usual difficulty of arriving at the truth" arising from ignorance and prejudice.

To secure uniform reporting, blank forms were provided and the following data were to be recorded:

- 1. Dwelling houses numbered in the order of their visitation.
- 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation, ("family" being all those living in one house, public house or institution.)
- 3. Name of every person whose usual place of residence was in this family 1 June 1855. Note: Excluded were those born after 1 June. Included were those who had died after 1 June and those temporarily absent. Relationship of household members to the head of the household was not recorded. An aid in establishing relationships exists, nevertheless, in the requirement that the enumerator arrange names in a given order:
  - (1) Master
  - (2) Mistress
  - (3) Children in order of age
  - (4) Male domestics, etc.
  - (5) Female domestics, etc.
  - (6) Boarders, etc.
- 4. Age. To be given as of last birthday unless next birthday would be within four months, then age at next birthday.
  - 5. Sex.
  - 6. Color. B for Blacks, M for Mulatto, no entry for Whites.
- 7. Profession, occupation or trade for each male over fifteen. For clergymen, initial letters of denomination.
- 8. Place of birth. State or territory if native born; country if foreign born.
- 9. Whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper or convict.
