CREATURE MARKS AND OTHER LIVESTOCK RECORDS OF LENOX, MASS.

Provided by Mary Hoyt DeGiorgis

The following information is taken from a copy of Volume I of the Lenox Town Records (1759-1835) made by William D. Curtis, Town Clerk, in 1885. The registered creature marks immediately following are dated, although not chronological. They are followed by some undated records which are left to the reader's chronological interpretation. In the interest of brevity the phrase "Mark for his Creatures is" has been replaced by the dash following the owner's name.

CREATURE MARKS

Charles Bangs - Half a crop on the right ear happany or notch on the underside of the left ear and top cut off - Sept. 15, 1831.

Ebenezer Fitch - Square crop off the left ear and slanting crop on the under side of the right ear - June 5, 1832.

John M. Dryer - Slit in the end of the left ear - June 8, 1832.

Amos S. Washburn - June 18, 1835 - No description given.

Asaph Dewey, Jun^r - A half crop the upper side of the left ear - April 18, 1816.

Erastus Dewey - Swallow's tail in each ear - April 18, 1816.

Robert Worthington - Hole in the left ear - June 18, 1817.

James A. Smith - Hole in each ear - June 14, 1821.

Isaac Newton - Crop off the left ear & a slit in the same - June 28, 1821.

Nathaniel Cook - Half crop of the upper side both ears - Dec. 1, 1821.

David Ames - Crop off from the right ear & a slit the under side of the left - July 3, 1822.

John M. Brewster - Half crop the under side of the left ear - May 30, 1823.

Elijah Stevens - Square crop off the right ear & a slit the under side of the same ear - May 28, 1824.

John Butler - Square crop off the end of the right ear & a notch in the upper front side of the same and a hole in the left ear - October 11, 1825.

Samuel F. Parsons - Crop off the left ear and a half penny each side of the same - March 1, 1826.

Charles B. Steel - Square crop off the right ear - transfered from his Grand Father - March 7, 1826.

Thomas E. Steel - Square crop of the right ear & a slit in the left. Transferred from his Father, Thos. Steel, Jun. - March 7, 1826.

Jethro Butler - A half crop the under side of the right ear & a half penny each side of the left - June 7,

Edward Hays - Two Square Notches in the fore side of the left ear (see Mr. Zehaniah Davis mark) - June 19, 1792.

Abner Clark - A half penny under side the right Ear - May 12, 1793.

Amos Butler, Junr - A half penny on each side of the left ear & a slit in the end of the same - July 2, 1793.

Joseph Dunham - A slit in the End of the left Ear - April 8, 1794.

Isaac C. Goodrich - A half Crop & a half penny the fore side of the right Ear - June 20, 1795.

Samuel Collins - A swallow tail in the end of the right Ear & a slit the upper side of the same (1795?).

Isaac Sears - A square crop in the left Ear & a Slanting Slit the under side of the right Ear - Oct. 29, 1795.

Jeremiah Osborn - A half Crop the upper side of the left Ear - July 14, 1796.

Ebenezer Williams - A crop on the left ear - May 3, 1797.

John Willard - A crop on the left ear and a halfpenny on the upper side of the same & a slit on each side of the right Ear - May 15, 1797.

Eldad Lewis - A square crop on the right ear a hole in the same and a swallow tail in the left - Sept. 5, 1799.

Mathew Butler - A crop on the right ear & a half penny upper side of the same - March 20, 1799.

John Bennett - A swallow tail in the end of the left ear & a slit the upper side of the same - Nov. 8, 1799.

Samuel Shepard - A crop on the left ear - Aug. 10, 1800.

Daniel Butler - A square crop on both Ears and a straight slit in each - April 6, 1801.

Origin Sabin - A slit in the end of the right ear & a half crop the under side of the same - May 27, 1801.

Levi Cam--- - A slit in the end of each ear - May, 1802.

Lemuel Stocking - A slit in the end of the left Ear and a halfpenny the upper side of the same (1802?).

Edward Hatch - A crop off the left ear and a Slit in the end of the same (1802?).

Isaac Ellis - A square crop of the left Ear and a Slanting Slit the under side of the right Ear - June 7, 1802.

Samuel Gray - A Square Crop off the right Ear and a hole in the left Ear - July, 1802.

Daniel Dunbar - A Square notch the upper side the left Ear - Oct. 11, 1802.

David Butler - A crop off the right ear and a half crop the under side of the left - Nov. 11, 1803.

Nathaniel Miller - A Square Crop off the left ear and a hole in the right - Jan. 4.

Solomon Bodfish - A Swallow tail in each ear - May 10, 1803.

Elijah Northrup, Junr - A Swallows tail on the right ear & a halfpenny the under side of the left ear - May 3 (1803?).

Widow Abigail Walker - A half crop & a half penny the fore side of the right ear - June 7 (1803?).

Nathan Messenger - A half crop the upper side of the left ear - June 7 (1803?).

Sherman Bozworth - A Crop on the left ear & a slit in the end of the right - July 1 (1803?).

Sherman Bozworth - A half penny the under side of the right ear - July 15 (1803?).

Sherman Bosworth - A Doubleyu at the end of the right Ear - Dec. 20, 1811.

John Gregory - A hole in the left ear - July 15, 1803.

Azariah Egleston - A Crop off of the right ear and a half penny the under side of the left - July 15, (1803?).

Charles Worthington - A half penny the upper & under side of the right & a half crop the under side of the left ear - Sept. 19 (1803?).

Zephaniah Davis - Two square notches in the fore side of the left ear - Aug. 28, 1804.

Zephaniah Davis, Junr - Two slits the under side of the left ear & a half penny the under side of the right Ear - Nov. 17, 1804.

Joel Davis - A Square Crop on the right Ear and a Slanting Slit the under side of the left Ear - Nov. 17, 1804.

Ashbel Hills - A W on the end of the right Ear and a Crop off of the left Ear - Feby. 9, 1805.

William Perrin - A hole in each ear - March 22 (1805?).

Jesse Newell - A slit in the end of the left ear - June 16, 1806.

David Osborn - A swallow tail in the end of the right ear & a Slit the upper side of the same - June 30, 1806.

Daniel Folliott - A hole in the left Ear - July 30 (1806?).

Joshua Arnold - A Square Crop off from the right Ear and a half penny the under side of the same and a half crop the under side of the left Ear - March 9, 1807.

Enos Stevens - A square Crop off the right Ear and a hole in the left Ear - May 11, 1807.

Thomas Curtis - A Crop on the left ear & a half penny the fore side of the right face a half penny the under side of the left - June 4, 1807.

Samuel Judd - A Square Crop off from the right Ear & a hole through the same & a Slanting Crop on the under side of the left Ear - June 15, 1807.

Beriah Wells - A Crop on the right Ear & a half penny the under side of the same & a slit in the end of the left Ear - June 18, 1807.

Eldad Post - A Swallow's tail on each ear & a half penny on the fore side of the left Ear - June 2, 1808.

Caleb Hyde - A Square Crop on the right ear & a slit the fore side of the same Ear - June 22, (1808?).

Collins Miller - A half crop on the under side of each ear - May 19, 1809.

Jethro Fuller - A half penny the under side of the right ear - May 15, 1810.

Dan Worthington - A slit in the end of the left ear - July 20, 1810.

Joseph Tucker - A crop on the left Ear & a Slit in the end of the same & a Slit in the end of the right

Ear - Aug. 14, (1810?).

Edmond Howe - A slit in the left ear - Sept 17, 1810.

Justin Griswold - A Square Crop off of the right ear & a Slit the under side of the same ear - Oct. 6, (1810?).

Caleb R. Walker - A slit in the left Ear - May 27, 1814.

Ebenezer Chapel - A Crop off from the right Ear & a half penny on the fore side of the left - May 6, 1811.

John Sedgwick - A half crop on the under side of the left Ear - July 24, A.D. 1812.

Frederick Perry - A Crop off from the right Ear and a Slit the under side of the left - July 27, 1813.

William Fitch - A Swallows tail in the end of the left Ear and a half penny on the upper side of the same - Sept. 22, 1813.

Gad Worthington - A Square Crop off the right ear & a slit the under side of the same Ear - Jan. 27, 1814.

Timothy Haskell - A Slanting Crop off the right ear the under part of the ear cut the shortest - June 7th, 1815 - Recorded.

William P. Walker - A Crop off from the left ear & two half pennies on the fore side of the same - April 6th, 1816.



Taking the High Road - A Two Hundred Year History of a Hilltown, Savoy, [Mass.] 1797-1997, by Jane Benedict Phinney, 1997. 168pp, softbound, 8½" X 11". Price \$18.00 plus \$2.00 S/H. Order from Berkshire Family History Assn., Inc., P. O. Box 1437, Pittsfield, MA 01202-1437.

This nostalgic work celebrates the two century existence of Savoy, not only from its first town meeting in 1797 but also presents data on earlier land transactions. The stories accounting for the naming of a town are always interesting. That of Savoy is no less so. The intimate interweaving of text and photograph effectively displays the beauty of the area and the interesting events which have taken place. There are some reflections of our country at large. That Savoy was the home of three CCC camps during the "Great Depression" is such a reminder.

The genealogist will be interested in the names of some of the villages comprising the town of Savoy in the early 1800's - The Brier, Spruce Corner, New State, Savoy Center, The Tannery, Savoy Hollow, The Bush, and Babbittville, later called Allenville. A listing of the town's veterans of our several wars is also helpful.

The nature of the terrain is more adapted to grazing, rather than the raising of crops. Lumbering was an active industry, with six sawmills at one time. An unusual industry was the distillation of spruce oil from 1800, well into the 1900's. A very remunerative vocation was "ferning" or the picking and packaging of fern fronds for floral displays. Good pickers could process ten to twelve thousand ferns a day. There are a number of illustrations on maple sugaring.

Attention is directed to the school budget of \$80 in 1797 to more than \$600,000 in 1997. There are a number of pictures of the several schools and their scholars.

There is much, much more, all illustrating that to the two traditional verities of death and taxes must be added a third - change.

Massachusetts Privateers of the Revolution, by Gardner Weld Allen, 356pp, softbound, illus., index, 5½" x 8½". Price \$30.00 plus \$5.00 S/H. Order from Heritage Books, Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Bowie, MD 20716.

This is a very enlightening book in that it dispels the notion that privateering was a form of piracy. With no existing naval establishment, controlled use of private shipping was a way of quickly marshaling force to counteract the shipment of supplies and armament to the British forces.

The sixty-three page introduction describes in detail the development of the privateer system in which the individual ships posted a performance bond to the Continental Congress and to the state as well. The commission granted the particular ship spelled

out in detail he scope of permitted activity and the responsibilities assumed by the master of the ship. There is a detailed explanation of the procedures for dividing the proceeds from a capture, and the exchange of prisoners who might be involved. It was usual to divide the spoils fifty/fifty between the privateer and the government. The crew of the successful privateer were rewarded by a share in the division. This became much more rewarding than being a foot soldier and the source of some difficulty in recruitment.

The remainder of the book is concerned with records of much of the privateer activity involving Massachusetts ports, from 1779 to 1781. Most of the accounts are very detailed as to dates, personnel, ports and activity involved in the action.

To Joseph Tucker Clerk of the Town of Lenox - This is to give you notice that on the first day of August last, broke into my enclosure two red Steers yearlings. Also one Brown White faced yearling Steer the owner whereof is to me unknown. - Daniel Collins, Lenox Sept 2d, 1816.

Berkshire S.S. Sept. 2d, 1816. Recd the above & Recorded from the original - Attst Jos Tucker, T. Clerk.

Berkshire S.S. Oct 16th 1820 - Recd the above & recorded from the original. Attst Robt. Worthington, T. Clerk.

To the Town Clerk of Lenox - You will please take notice that I found in the Barn of Daniel Dunbar on the morning of the 29th of March 1833 two Dressed Calf Skins supposed to be worth three dollars and fifty cents which you will please give notice of - Lenox March the 29, 1833 - Daniel P. Dunbar.

GUIDE TO INTERPRETATION OF THE 1855 MASSACHUSETTS CENSUS

The taking of a census in 1855 was mandated by an act of the General Court of Massachusetts, 21 May 1855. The act provided that a census of each city and town be taken between 1 June and 1 October 1855. The census was to be "as of" the first day of June of the census year.

Reports on the taking of the census stated that the instructions were generally "well observed". Some enumerators, however, were so negligent or heedless that their reports were "scarcely fit to be received". Cautions, still appropriate, were given against relying too absolutely on the census because of "the great liability to error", and the "usual difficulty of arriving at the truth" arising from ignorance and prejudice.

To secure uniform reporting, blank forms were provided and the following data were to be recorded:

- 1. Dwelling houses numbered in the order of their visitation.
- 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation, ("family" being all those living in one house, public house or institution.)
- 3. Name of every person whose usual place of residence was in this family 1 June 1855. Note: Excluded were those born after 1 June. Included were those who had died after 1 June and those temporarily absent. Relationship of household members to the head of the household was not recorded. An aid in establishing relationships exists, nevertheless, in the requirement that the enumerator arrange names in a given order:
 - (1) Master
 - (2) Mistress
 - (3) Children in order of age
 - (4) Male domestics, etc.
 - (5) Female domestics, etc.
 - (6) Boarders, etc.
- 4. Age. To be given as of last birthday unless next birthday would be within four months, then age at next birthday.
 - 5. Sex.
 - 6. Color. B for Blacks, M for Mulatto, no entry for Whites.
- 7. Profession, occupation or trade for each male over fifteen. For clergymen, initial letters of denomination.
- 8. Place of birth. State or territory if native born; country if foreign born.
- 9. Whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper or convict.
