### JOSEPH FARR, CLOCKMAKER

#### By Raymond W. Fischer

In 1786 Pittsfield had a population of 1100 people of which about 200 were voters. Among the population was a Joseph Farr, His name is on the dial of a handsome tall-case (grandfather) clock at the Berkshire Museum. Little was known about this man, but local research has provided some insight into Joseph, his father, also Joseph, and that of his son,

again, Joseph.

A Joseph Farr of Cummington surfaced with different birth-death dates than Joseph Farr, the Pittsfield clockmaker. Further research discovered yet another Joseph Farr of Cummington, a renowned surveying instrument maker. Relationships, if any, begged resolution. The results are three generations of Joseph Farrs. Their story is provided here. It is based on probate and church records, histories of Pittsfield and Cummington, and the book Makers of Surveying Instruments. The life of Joseph Farr, clockmaker of Pittsfield, has never been published.

### Joseph Farr<sup>1</sup> of Cummington, Massachusetts

Joseph<sup>1</sup> was born April 11, 1718, location unknown. He married Dinah Powers in 1740 in Middlesex, Mass. Although he was voted a proprietor of Township Number 5 (Cummington, Mass.) in 1765, he didn't settle there until about 1770. Joseph operated its first tavern. He died in Cummington, February 27, 1797.

## Joseph Farr<sup>2</sup> of Pittsfield, Massachusetts

Joseph Farr<sup>2</sup>, one of ten children of Joseph<sup>1</sup>, was born in Acton, Massachusetts, August

30, 1743. He died in Pittsfield, February 24, 1796.iv

Joseph was both a surveying instrument maker and a clockmaker. He was probably apprenticed in the Boston area before arriving with his parents in Cummington. He married 21-year old Sarah Susannah in Cummington, about 1768. A son, Joseph<sup>3</sup>, was born in Cummington in 1775.

A record of Joseph Farr's eight children was found in the Pittsfield Congregational

Church baptism records of July 1, 1781:

· Jonas

· Eliel

· Percy (Perez)

· Betty (Betsy) - later married

· Sally - later married Daniel W. Murphy

Pittsfield was a young and growing town during his early years, and he must have found greater opportunities there than in Cummington. Pittsfield affairs were conducted at the Congregational Church. "Existence of religious denominations other than Congregational was ignored. The town was simply a Congregational Parish."vi

Another male joined the family in Pittsfield between the July 1781 baptisms and a 1786

census. This brought the number of his children to nine.

From the 1786 census in the Pittsfield Congregational church records, a rough idea of the family ages appears:vii

Joseph Farr - One House - Two married Persons - One family. 2 males under 5, 1 male & 2 females under 10, 1 male & 1 female under 15, 2 males under 20, and 1 male & 1 female under 70.

In a 1797 Court Probate Record, viii William is not listed, but Bela, Asa, and Levi Farr

are added to his children.

Joseph Farr was a respected and prominent member of the Congregational Parish. Two

references appear which place him in a role of influence:

On August 20, 1784, a meeting was convened at the Congregational church to decide on a complaint brought by a Deacon Wright. The issue concerned determining if sufficient evidence existed to support a complaint against one Colonel Easton. Colonel Easton allegedly had a criminal conversation with a Mrs. Dexter of Boston. Joseph Farr voted with the nine yeas. There were ten nays. ix

On June 3, 1788, a church committee was selected to attend matters regarding "parochial dissensions" of a divided parish. The committee was to prepare a report of resolve concerning whether the parish should separate or remain united over issues concerning assignment of church pews and the political conduct of the Rev. Mr. Allen. It was to be a "committee made up of influence and sound discretion...by those with wise neutrality." Joseph Farr served on the committee. The report was sent to the town on June 26, 1788.\* All issues

appeared to be harmoniously resolved...for a while.

Joseph Farr would have needed a substantial source of income to support his large family. Aside from the one high quality clock surviving, no others are known to exist. His clock production must have been so low that he either had to be independently wealthy or needed other endeavors to provide an income. An evaluation of his estate inventory indicates that he was very resourceful. He kept bees and probably sold honey. The large amount of wool, flax, and flannel in his estate indicates that he and his wife probably made and sold cloth. Like other clockmakers, he may have provided blacksmithing services. If Joseph<sup>2</sup> did make and sell surveying equipment, none is known to exist.

At the time of his death at 53 in 1796, the Farr children would have consisted of five under 15, one male and two females under 20, one male and one female under 25, and two

males under 30.

From his estate inventory, we can surmise that the nest was emptied of the four older children, although his bed-count indicates that he could still sleep 10, if they did not leave. He had a good size fireplace with plenty of cooking utensils. The abundance of good furniture and

silverware describes a family living comfortably.

When Joseph<sup>2</sup> died he left a substantial estate to his widow Sarah, then 49, and the children. His will was probated September 6, 1797. Until the estate cleared probate, his wife collected unpaid debts and borrowed from creditors, dating back to 1794, in order to survive. The estate was probated in Lenox. Her expenses included travel and living in Lenox until the estate was settled. The value of the estate was \$766.70. After settling the estate, Sarah received one-third, and the children two-thirds of the \$577.32 remaining. XII

At the age of 53, Joseph was a relatively young man when he died. Evidently, Joseph had been sick since 1794. His doctor, Timothy Childs, recovered a fee of \$40.50 in the 1797

estate settlement.

His father died a year later at the age of 79.

## Joseph Farr Jnr.<sup>3</sup> Instrument Maker of Cummington.

Joseph Jnr<sup>3</sup>, b. Feb. 4, 1775, in Cummington, became a silversmith by trade and a manufacturer of mathematical instruments including surveyor's instruments. He likely learned his craft from his father, a skilled, but not very active, clockmaker. Joseph Jr's prominence in the making of surveying instruments is recorded in the book: THE MAKING OF SURVEYING INSTRUMENTS IN AMERICA SINCE 700. The book lists Joseph Jr. as a surveying instrument maker in Cummington, however, makes no mention of his father as a maker. xiii

It is likely that after his father's death, he and the family moved back to Cummington to live with his grandparents. His prominence as an instrument maker evolved at that time. He died in Manlius Village, NY on December 2, 1845. Joseph's instruments can be found in historical societies at Buffalo, New York; Madison, Wisconsin; and the Henry Ford Museum,

Dearborn, Michigan.


It is hoped that someday clocks and surveying instruments attributed to both father and son will emerge to be recognized.

## The Estate of Joseph Farr<sup>2</sup>, Pittsfield Clockmaker

An evaluation of the estate inventory provides an insight into his wealth and livelihood. The following shop tools were in the estate:

"One bellowsises 2D / One grindstone 2D / Three surveyors (comsrupes) & chains 66D / One turning lathe 3D 33C / Thirty pounds of ould iron 50c / One (canthses) 50C / One loopers jointer 33C / Job stock on hand 11D 95C / Mechanical tools in shop 39D 14C"... xiv The value of these items \$125.75, a considerable value for tools of that day. We assume that "Job Stock on Hand" and "Mechanical Tools" were surveying instrument and clockmaker's materials.



#### **GUIDE TO INTERPRETATION OF THE 1855 MASSACHUSETTS CENSUS**

The taking of a census in 1855 was mandated by an act of the General Court of Massachusetts, 21 May 1855. The act provided that a census of each city and town be taken between 1 June and 1 October 1855. The census was to be "as of" the first day of June of the census year.

Reports on the taking of the census stated that the instructions were generally "well observed". Some enumerators, however, were so negligent or heedless that their reports were "scarcely fit to be received". Cautions, still appropriate, were given against relying too absolutely on the census because of "the great liability to error", and the "usual difficulty of arriving at the truth" arising from ignorance and prejudice.

To secure uniform reporting, blank forms were provided and the following data were to be recorded:

- 1. Dwelling houses numbered in the order of their visitation.
- 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation, ("family" being all those living in one house, public house or institution.)
- 3. Name of every person whose usual place of residence was in this family 1 June 1855. Note: Excluded were those born after 1 June. Included were those who had died after 1 June and those temporarily absent. Relationship of household members to the head of the household was not recorded. An aid in establishing relationships exists, nevertheless, in the requirement that the enumerator arrange names in a given order:
  - (1) Master
  - (2) Mistress
  - (3) Children in order of age
  - (4) Male domestics, etc.
  - (5) Female domestics, etc.
  - (6) Boarders, etc.
- 4. Age. To be given as of last birthday unless next birthday would be within four months, then age at next birthday.
  - 5. Sex.
  - 6. Color. B for Blacks, M for Mulatto, no entry for Whites.
- 7. Profession, occupation or trade for each male over fifteen. For clergymen, initial letters of denomination.
- 8. Place of birth. State or territory if native born; country if foreign born.
- 9. Whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper or convict.
