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

Dear Priscilla,

We returned from a vacation in Maine this week and decided to spend the night in Norwich, Connecticut in order to see Lebanon and Voluntown where Anthony and Anna (Barker) raised their 14 children. It was such an unusual experience that I must write about it while it is fresh. Since we had 3 children with us we knew that our time was limited, and that there would be no time for record searching in dusty files. Early in the morning we drove 20 miles to Sterling, Ct.

to wander in the graveyard looking for Anthony and Family. All five of us read headstone after headstone, dating from 1750 to today. But many are missing so we decided that if the Eames' were there there were no stones. We continued on to the Town Clerk's office and inquired for death and burial records. There were no entries prior to 1880. On our way out a man asked us what we were looking for. He vaguely remembered seeing one stone somewhere with that name on it. I asked who had put the flags on the veterans' graves, since that indicated that someone had a record of the veterans' back to the Rev. War (the flags were in place in the cemetery.) We proceeded across the street with the nice man to see a very old gentleman who did indeed place the flags - as had his father before him - on the veterans' graves once a year. 200 of them. But he was hazy about the Eames'.. They talked about several family cemeteries hidden away here and there through the woods. It was also noted that Sterling, Ct. was really Voluntown until it was incorporated in 1794. Then the first man, Robert Jordan, who is 1st Selectman for Sterling, volunteered to lead us to a place where he thought he had seen the stone. [I mentioned that the family must be somewhere since Anthony had 5 sons and 9 daughters. Son Mark had 10 children, and another son, John, had 8 children.] We followed him behind his car for several winding and hilly miles and stopped on top of a pretty hill. He then volunteered that he had 5 sons and 8 daughters. He was beginning to identify. He led us across a field which had just been bulldozed - about 100 feet - and stopped at an old chipped black slate stone. But it clearly read: "In Memory of Anthony Ames Who died April 26th, 1793 in the 90th year of his age"! Eureka! There were 4 other stones: John Ames, son of Anthony, 78 yrs; Mary, consort of John, 40 years; John, son of John and Mary, 18 yrs; and William, age 25. The bulldozer had done alot of damage and Mary's grave had been neatly dug out, 3'x 6'. From the positions of the graves there was obviously a possibility of at least 30 or more graves in this family cemetery. It was surrounded by a stone fence which measured about 25' x 50'. Mr. Jordan then astonished me by saying that he had just bought all this hilltop property and had had his son clear the land to create pasture for his dairy herds. They had just discovered the cemetery, which has evidently been lost for many, many years since it does not show up on a list of town cemeteries. He disappeared for a few minutes and came back with a polaroid camera and took pictures. He then insisted on taking us to the site where a very old house had once stood - which he thinks could have been the original house. Since the cemetery was there, Anthony Eames and family must have lived on that pretty hill.... in that house. Mr. Jordan must have been amazed to have us show up so unexpectedly and I'm sure that the spirit of Anthony arranged that incredible meeting with Mr. Jordan in the clerk's office. How else on that day, at that hour and minute, in that room..... Mr. Jordan says he plans to put a fence around the cemetery. I hope so.

It was then 11 a.m. and we had to reach Washington, D.C. by evening so we gave up our plans to see Lebanon and drove into the center of Voluntown in search of the town office in hopes of a quick glimpse into land records in order to confirm what we'd learned. The office was closed - no one anywhere. We asked at the post office for the Historical Society (the library was closed) and were given the name of the chairman. She was hanging out the laundry but took time off to give us teasing glimpses into Voluntown history. We bought a history of the town of Voluntown which she has written - nothing in it about Anthony Eames, but very interesting from a general point of view. It was an interesting contact because we could tell her also about the cemetery in the hopes that the Society will keep an eye on it, as well as add it to their list of family cemeteries.

We shall go back soon and check on it. One disappointing note was

that we discovered, after arriving home, that our camera which had recorded the whole experience was not operating properly - no pictures! But Mr. Jordan did give us a map of Sterling, Ct. which I shall enclose to show you the pretty hill where Priscilla (b. 1747) played and worked as a child. School starts in a few days and I shall return to the marvelous record rooms here in D.C. to find more things. Cordially, Pat Eames

Among the early court records in the office of the Clerk of Courts in Pittsfield, Mass. is a thin, paper-covered book in good condition. On the first page of which is the heading: "Berkshire Co. Record of Marriages Solemnized. Began in May 1788." in the handwriting of Henry William Dwight, then "Clerk of Sessions." About -- pages are filled with copies of the certificates, filed usually about April of each year by the various town clerks, of marriages reported to them by justices of the peace and by ministers. The towns and those performing the marriages are as follows:


