

Cemeteries

McCARTY, now called SAGINAW TOWNSHIP CEMETERY

Located on Freeland/Midland Road and recorded on Land Records in Saginaw County as T12N R3E Section 11. Acres: 1.45

The markers in this cemetery were read 10 November 1969 by Ruth Fisk Zorn and Lenard S Zorn . Reference is made to a marker: 4 Children of H.D. Rogers and his wife Rebecca, who died 1859.

In a biographical sketch of Lewis Rogers (1), it states that his mother, Rebecca, wife of Henry D Rogers, had 14 children, four born at one time and died in the same month as born.

Therefore, the four children of Henry D Rogers and his wife Rebecca, were quadruplets, known now as the first quads born in Saginaw County, Michigan, 1859 and died 1859, before they were one month old.

H. D. Rogers was township clerk of Tittabawassee in 1855 and in 1860; he also served as treasurer of Tittabawassee Township for the year of 1857 (2).

BACON CEMETERY

Located on land north of Hospital Road, East of Tittabawassee River towards Shattuckville, Section 13, Saginaw Township, T12N R3E, Eastern part of the Northeast Fractional quarter, 102.55 Acres. Filed 30 Jul 1830 by Artemus Bacon.

Reference is made to two burials on Sand Knoll, between the Tittabawassee River and Midland Road in Michigan Heritage, Vol XIII, Number 1, Autumn 1971, page 32.

The probate of the estate of Artemus Ward Bacon, 1852-54, when Artemus Ward Bacon Jr became of age states that: Artemus Ward Bacon died 29 August 1838 and his daughter, Sarah J Bacon died 11 December 1838. Both were buried on the property. There were no public cemeteries in the area at that time. Artemus Ward Bacon evidently arrived in the area after the 1830 Federal Census of Saginaw County had been taken and had died prior to the 1840 and 1850 Federal Census of the county, since he does not appear on any of the three. A letter from Mr. Douglas B Whiting, a member of this Society, to Mr Lemard S Zorn dated 25 June 1980, states in part: In October of 1974, I was working in the Eddy Room, looking for information about my maternal great grandfather, Artemus Ward Bacon, who was one of the people who took part in organizing Saginaw Township in 1831 and was told that there were two unmarked graves on the farm. Since then, I have obtained a print of the microfilm of Saginaw County Probate Court file #8, concerning the probate of his estate. The evidence given states that Artemus Ward Bacon died 29 August 1838 and that a daughter, Sarah J Bacon, died 11 December 1838. It seems to me likely that the two unmarked graves are theirs.
