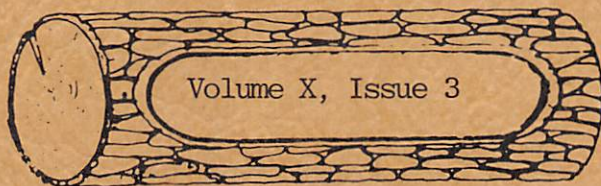

TENTH ANNUAL SEMINAR SPEAKER ANNOUNCED

The Saginaw Genealogical Society is very proud and extremely pleased to announce that the speaker for the Tenth Annual Seminar will be Dr. Robert E. Ward, Ph.D., of Cleveland, Ohio. Dr Ward is a direct descendant of French Huguenot and German stock and holds B.A., M.A., and Ph.D. Degrees in German as well as a doctorate in law. He has taught German language and literature at various American colleges and universities from 1961 to 1973 and passed the Ohio Bar Examination in 1975, then began private law practice. Dr Ward has served as editor of the *Journal of German-American Studies* since its inception in 1969; created and edited the *German-American Genealogist* and has served as an associate editor of the *Genealogical Journal* published in Utah.

Dr Ward has returned to us by popular demand after his outstanding appearance at our Ninth Annual Seminar, held last year. He is the author of numerous articles and books on German-American history, literature and culture, as well as genealogy.

Dr. Ward served as the first president of the International Society for British Genealogy and Family History, the Society for German-American Studies. He is also a member of the Steuben Society of America and vice president of the Federation of German-American Societies of Greater Cleveland. He also is the donor of the extensive Ward Collection of Americana Germanica housed at the Western Reserve Historical Society, which contains periodicals, books and other items relating to German family history and genealogy.

Dr. Ward will cover the finding and using genealogical records inside Germany as well as Guild Records and lesser known sources in Germany, Poland, Austria, Czechoslovakia and Switzerland. He has also suggested that all who have a question regarding researching in Germany or its territory should submit this question with their registration prior to April 17th so that these questions can be forwarded to him and answers prepared for the Seminar.

2nd Annual Report of the Commissioner of Railroads - Year Ending December 31, 1873

### Accidents -

- January 15      Birch Run - C. F. Jackson, brakeman, left hand squeezed while coupling cars.
- February 13    Birch Run - J. B. Gillett; instantly killed; was passenger, and got off train at depot; attempted to get on again while train was in motion and fell under the cars.
- April 10 -      East Saginaw - Sam'l Mook, yardman, right arm broken above the elbow. Died April 19th from disease combined with injury
- June 18        Birch Run - -----Hillard (boy), instantly killed. Supposed to have been run over by some train during the night.
- July 15        East Saginaw - J. Ferguson, switchman; two ribs broken while coupling cars.
- July 17        East Saginaw - James Brown; instantly killed. Supposed to have fallen asleep across the track, yard engine passing over him.
- August 15      Bridgeport - W. Hitchins, brakeman; leg broken.
- December 29    East Saginaw - S. C. Allen, yardman, instantly killed.

### Michigan Central, Jackson, Lansing & Saginaw Branch

- April 28        James Moran, employee; killed at Chapin's switching cars.
- June 4         Frank Rislow, a young boy run over and killed at Saginaw City.
- July 9          Johanna Sullivan, in attempting to drive her geese off the track at Carrollton, run over and killed.
- August 25      Albert Lebo, employee; foot badly crushed at East Saginaw coupling cars.
- November 11    Charles Decker, employee, killed at Zilwaukee, coupling cars.

### Accidents-

Flint & Pere Marquette Railroad Co

- January 20      East Saginaw, Michael Murphy, finger crushed, amputated.

September 16 Saginaw City - Owen Cowley, a boy, was instantly killed in the attempt to get under the tender of a locomotive in motion - missed his hold.

December 31 Birch Run - Charles M Miller. Run over by the cars, instantly killed.
