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President's Message

Dear Fellow Members;

The following written report was presented at the Annual Meeting on 14 June 1982:

As President it was my responsibility to perform the following duties:

1. Appoint members to serve in seventeen separate capacities within the Society.
2. Attend and prepare an agenda for each Executive Board and Regular meeting.
3. Write a President's message for each edition of the TIMBERTOWN LOG.
4. Prepare and present an introduction and/or welcome from the Society at Workshops and the Annual Seminar.
5. File a Non-profit organization state income tax report when requested by the State of Michigan.
6. Perform Special duties when called upon to do so by the Executive Board or its officers such as the writing of a letter to the Michigan Council President informing him of our upcoming 1983 Seminar.
7. Maintain a notebook with copies of monthly minutes, officer reports, etc.
8. Arrange for the auditing of the 1982 Treasurer's records through April 1982 by Vera Van Riper.
9. Prepare a list of Presidential duties and/or responsibilities for the new officer.
10. Make reservations by letter for 1983 Seminar at the Bavarian Inn in Frankenmuth, Michigan.

It has truly been a pleasure serving as your President these past two years. During this time I have seen our group expand in membership from 194 in May of 1980 to 270 in May of 1982. I have been privileged to see our Society's Editor and his member helpers maintain not only the usual excellent quarterly publications of the TIMBERTOWN LOG but also publish the HISTORY OF FRANKENMUTH by T.J. Pollen and the four mini-volumes of the Society's cemetery readings from Birch Run, Bridgeport, Chesaning, St Charles, Brant and Taymouth Townships. In addition, since 1980, our Society has sponsored four educational workshops, two trips to Burton in Detroit, and two of the largest and most widely attended Seminars in its history. Also, I have seen the establishment of a new Area of Study Chairman and the reviving of an old position, the Research Chairman. Finally, I have enjoyed the experiences which I have shared with members Gertrude Peabody and Peggy Lugthart when we introduced a new dimension of publicity to our Society and to Genealogy by appearing on the OPEN LINE program of WSGW Radio. The questions we answered from our listening audience were encouraging and highly indicative of a growing curiosity in family history throughout the Tri-County area.

Before closing, I would like to suggest a few ideas for you to consider. To begin with, I would like to suggest that in addition to our usual workshops for Beginning and Advanced genealogists, we consider a third workshop for those people who are doing foreign or ethnic research. I have noticed a great need for information on the American Indian, Blacks, Mexicans, German, Polish, Italian, French, English and Irish ancestries, etc. Whenever asked on written forms at the current workshops, the students always list a desire for more information about this type of research. I feel that we have a number of members who have


acquired a lot of experience in these areas and could capably act as our staff members. Secondly, I would like to suggest that our Society arrange a long distance trip for members to large genealogical collections such as the one found in Salt Lake City, Utah, to the New England States, or Canada. It could be a trip planned through a local travel agency and someone who is well versed in that area of study could be the tour guide since the trip would be designed with the genealogical researcher in mind. These trips could be planned in conjunction with other Michigan Societies. Places to visit could include cemeteries, local libraries, courthouses, funeral homes, newspapers, etc, in an attempt to get specific information about one's ancestry. Finally, I would like to urge you once again to continue contributing to the newly formed Area of Study Chairman. A file of valuable information has begun to accumulate and it would be a shame to waste it. We all have need of information about certain areas such as Connecticut, California, Canada, etc., and can appreciate help from those who have traveled there or have had experience researching there.

I would like to say a special thanks to each member of my Executive Board and to all Society members for the help, encouragement, and understanding that you have so graciously extended to me throughout the two years. I have learned something from each of you about dedication and unselfish service to others.

I would also like to express my best wishes to the new officers for 1983. You are the chosen leaders of a fantastic group of people and I know the Society will grow with your capable guidance.

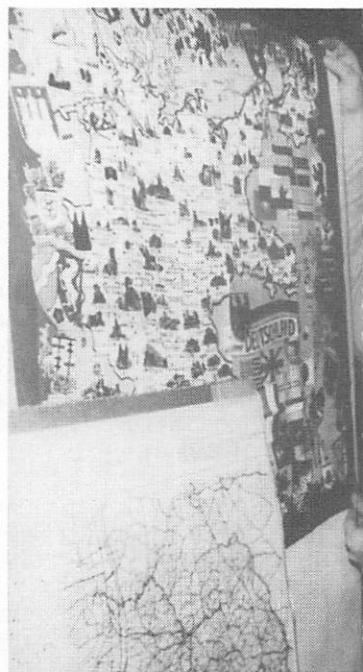

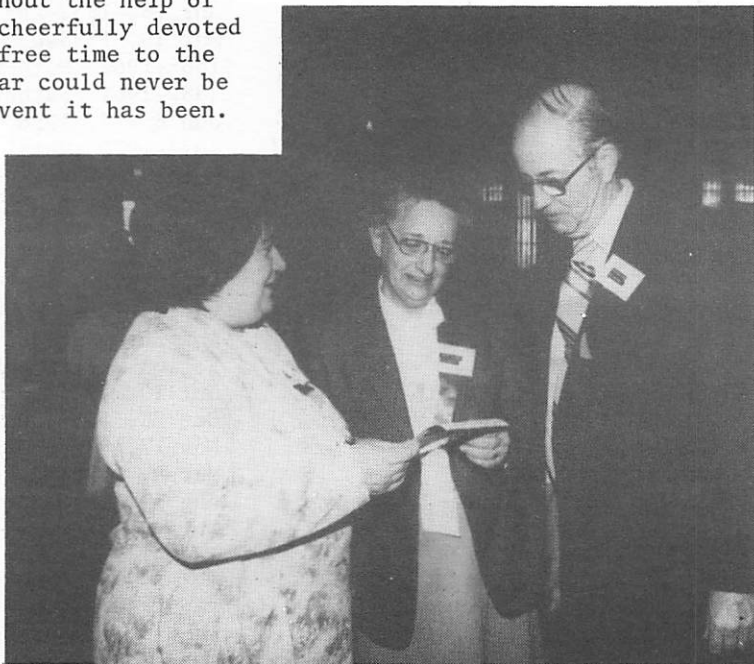


A Decade of Service to Genealogy

ORGANIZATION OF THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN SOCIETY (NEW SCHOOL) OF SALINA

Notice is hereby given that there will be a meeting of the persons of full age of Salina on Monday Evening, Jan. 4th, 1864 at the School house at 7 o'clock for the purpose of agreeing upon and signing Articles of Association and organizing a New School Presbyterian Society and Corporation pursuant to the laws of this State and of electing a suitable number of persons as Trustees to take charge of the property belonging to and transacting the affairs relative to the temporalities of said Society.

Know all men by these present, THAT we whose names are hereunto subscribed being persons of full age and desirous of forming ourselves into a Presbyterian Society understand by virtue of the Statutes of the State of Michigan do hereby agree to the following Articles of Association for that purpose:

Article 1st: This Association shall be called the First Presbyterian Society (New School) of Salina in the State of Michigan.

Article 2nd: This Association shall elect six Trustees who shall be called "The Board of Trustees of the First Presbyterian Society (New School) of Salina", one third of whom shall be elected each year at the Annual Meeting which shall be held on the second Monday of January in each year hereafter.

Article 3rd: Immediately after the first Election of said Board of Trustees, they shall be divided by lot into Three Classes, the first Class to hold office one year, the second class two years, and the third class three years, according to the Statute in such cases provided.

Article 4th: This Society shall for the present shall be connected with the Presbytery of Saginaw and the Synod of Michigan.

Article 5th: At each Annual Meeting said Board of Trustees shall make a full report of all receipts and disbursements of the Society during the preceding year and of all the temporal affairs of this Society.

Article 6th: It shall be the Duty of said Board of Trustees to see that the financial matters of the Society relating to the preaching of the Gospel shall be settled with the Minister Quarterly and a receipt taken at the settlement.

Article 7th: These Articles shall not be changed except at an Annual Meeting and by vote of Two-Thirds (2/3) of the members present entitled to vote, notice

Lockwood and John Ingledew constituted the first Class and whose term of office will expire in one year; Isaac Russell and H. Flagler constitute the second class whose term of office will expire in two years; and S. D. Allen and J. C. Humphrey constitute the third class whose term of office expire in three years.

The aforesaid Trustees and successors in Office are to be forever known and called "The Board of Trustees of the First Presbyterian Society of (New School) of Salina.

Programs in Review

Leland R. Watrous

The meeting of 9 November 1981 featured Tim Kingman choosing as his topic "On the Threshold of the Past". He spoke on his family history citing the fact that his father was from Friesland, an area of Europe which has had very little exposre. His own European family history meshed with his employment as an educator in European history. Genealogical societies have been formed in Europe

for many years, supported by the government, and is very strong in resources. Records in this area date from a very early period and are very complete, since the area was quite self-contained. There are two libraries in the area plus institutions of higher learning and much of the genealogy has been placed in computers so that in the future a researcher will merely push a button and receive a complete genealogy. He showed slides of artifacts of his family and discussed genealogy in various parts of the world, such as Alexandria, Constantinople, Greece, etc. Each major city in Europe has great facilities for research, most of which are not used to capacity.

No meeting was held in December and in January, Mother Nature dumped some miserable weather on us, forcing cancellation of the meeting.

Anna Mae Thompson was our speaker for the meeting of 8 February 1982, examining the Polish American Community in Early Saginaw. By using various sources, such as census reports, city directories, church records, she had been able to locate much information. By 1882, the Polish community was stabilized around Sacred Heart Church and by 1885 a number of Polish families had settled in Saginaw City. Before 1888, most of these families in East Saginaw were north of Perkins Street and in Buena Vista Township. They worshipped with Germans at Holy Rosary and were mostly Democrats in political persuasion. The "Polish Echo" was the only Polish newspaper published in Saginaw. During World War I, some local citizens recruited Poles for service with the Polish army in France. She also related a number of anecdotes of early Saginaw including Genesee bridge disaster and others concerning early Saginaw Polish residents.

Lydia Schmick presided over a panel of speakers from the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia, consisting of Margaret Kren, Marie Schuster, Lorraine Stiffel, Kathy McGill and Lydia Lichtenwald, who spoke of their ancestors' travails while in Russia. Fourteen years ago, only one half page of print existed in the Saginaw Library on this group and now several books are in the Eddy Room collection. This society was started by a couple from Colorado who had researched in Germany, then organized the society. The Volga Germans were invited to Russia by Katherine the Great to settle in the southern Volga area in 1763 and offered land for this purpose. Other inducements were free board and transportation loans, farm implements and the freedom to pursue any occupation without military service and without taxes for a specified number of years. Eventually the climate changed from earlier droughts, seed arrived on time and the living became better. The Black Sea Germans settled through the invitation of Alexander I and formed 209 villages, containing 50,000 people, mostly from Southern Germany and mostly the various religions formed their own religious villages, their own school system, but ran into land problems with over population. By the early 1880s and into the twentieth century, many of these people had once again started migrating-this time to the United States, where many settled in South Dakota and Nebraska and spread out from there. The group known as Mennonites came from Holland and Switzerland.

The meeting of 10 May 1982 found Mrs Janice A Beebe speaking on "Are you a Mayflower Descendant and can you prove it." This very interesting speaker related the history of the Mayflower movement which culminated in the establishment of the Plymouth Colony. She gave names of those passengers who died in "The Great Sickness", during the winter 1620-1, as well as the names of the survivors with their short histories. Mrs Beebe also evaluated some of the

legends as well as educational opportunities of our forefathers. Only 25 Mayflower families left descendants which the Mayflower Society has recognized. The General Society was founded in 1898, with the Michigan Society being founded in 1901. The Mayflower index is no longer used as a reference for those wishing to join. A newer index, published in September 1981 is more useful as well as more accurate. The Society recognizes as sources of proof printed histories and genealogies as well as the Five Generation Mayflower Families books, of which three have been published to date. Also recognized are the usual proofs, such as photocopies of vital records, bibles, etc.
