The board of directors has also approved a change in the color of the cover of the *Logs*. The cover of our quarterly will be red; the annual index will be yellow.


The reading of Calvary Cemetery was completed 7 August 1982. Fred Pike was in charge of this project and directed members to its successful completion.

ORGANIZATION OF THE PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL CHURCH "ST PAUL'S CHURCH OF EAST SAGINAW"

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

We whose names are hereto signed, being persons professing Attachment to the Protestant Episcopal Church, in pursuance of an Act of the People of the State of Michigan, entitled "An Act to Provide for the Organization of Protestant Episcopal Churches", passed Feby 17, 1857, and for the purpose of becoming a Body Politic and corporate by the name set forth in these Articles, in accordance with canons, doctrines, discipline and worship of the Protestant Episcopal Church, by these Articles of Agreement, Executed and acknowledged in duplicate, do hereby agree to organize a Church, according to the usages of the Protestant Episcopal Church by name and style set forth in these doctrines as follows, to wit:

- 1st - The name of the proposed Church is "St. Paul's Church of East Saginaw."
- 2nd - The said Church is located in East Saginaw, County of Saginaw, State of Michigan.
- 3rd - The number of Vestrymen who shall have charge of the affairs of such Church shall be Ten and the time of the Annual Meeting shall be the Monday next ensuing the Festival of Easter in Easter Week. - In witness thereof we have hereunto set our hands the day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF EAST SAGINAW

Art. 1. The undersigned, being desirous of forming themselves into a Church and Religious Society, under the Act concerning Religious Societies being Chapter Sixty-eight (68) of the Compiled Laws of Michigan, do hereby associate ourselves together as such and for that purpose under the name and style of "First Baptist Church of East Saginaw."

Art. 2. The property belonging to such Church and Society and all temporalities of the same shall be managed by Five Trustees to be elected in accordance with said act.

Art. 3. The first Election for Trustees shall be held at Union Hall in East Saginaw on the 17th day of February A.D. 1864 at Seven O'clock p.m. of that day.

In witness whereof we have hereto set our hands at East Saginaw in the State of Michigan this 30th day of January A.D. 1864.

The undersigned being Inspectors of Election for Trustees of the First Baptist Church of East Saginaw, duly chosen at the First meeting of the persons associating themselves together, pursuant to the annexed articles, do hereby certify that at such meeting the following persons, who are laymen, were duly elected by Ballot and by a plurality of votes to serve in accordance with the Terms of said Act, to wit: Hiram C. Farrand, Lorrain C. Whiting, David E. Prall, Lucian H. Fox and Daniel W. Perkins.

We also certify that said Trustees and their Successors in Office shall be known and called by the name of the "First Baptist Church of East Saginaw" and the individual holding such Office shall be called Trustees.

In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals at East Saginaw this Seventeenth day of February A.D. 1864

Our Society has now finished eleven years of existence and *Timbertown Log* has completed its first decade of service to genealogists interested in the Saginaw area. Some time ago, the Board of Directors of the Saginaw Genealogical Society and the Editorial Board of the *Log* reviewed this decade of progress and decided on some changes to be made in this journal. Due to escalating prices of printing, it was decided to change the format from the former 7x8½ inch to that of 5½ x 8½ inches to bring it more in line with the average book on the shelf. The slightly larger width made it extremely difficult to shelve because it extended an extra amount. Due to a very slight reduction of type size, the same amount of material will be used. We have been assured by our printer that this size will result in the same quality of printing at a lesser cost; for years, *Timbertown Log* has operated in a substantial loss to the Society. We believe that we can cut this loss in this manner to one which we can live with, at least for the near future, barring another round of labor and printing material cost raises together with the Postal Service rate increases which seem to come on an annual basis. You will also notice a change of color in the cover on the quarterly issues as well as a corresponding change in the cover of the index next summer. It was felt that now was the time to change the color at the same time we changed the format, in the interests of a more interesting product. We all hope that this meets with your approval as members of our Society. We all will look forward to your comments on our changes with great interest.

Programs in Review

Leland R. Watrous

Following the election of officers at the annual meeting, 14 June 1982, Mr. Ramiro Gonzales spoke on the "Mexican-Mexican American Experience, 1917-1980." His interest in Saginaw began with his father. The first wave of immigrants from Mexico came directly to this area from Old Mexico. After interviews with over 80 persons, he concluded that the first Mexicans arrived around 1917; the majority of Mexican immigrants came from an isolated area towards the South of Mexico, recruited by agents of farmers, industry and the railroads. By 1930 the big centers of Mexican population in the midwest were Chicago, Gary, Detroit and Saginaw. Beginning shortly after 1924, Mexicans began arriving by the train load, until the great depression, when the population dropped sharply. Many of the first wave of Mexicans possessed some skills, were not farm workers. Mr Gonzales showed demographic studies of the locations relating to Hispanic families in both static and transient status. The influx of both Mexican and Black brought about a number of problems, including petitions against both of these groups.

The regular meeting of 13 September 1982 found Lloyd Cartwright speaking on the Churches of England. He suggested using the latest source of data when there is disagreement. He also mentioned to check the addenda at the end of a book to avoid mistakes. Another worthwhile suggestion was to contact or join a local historical or genealogical society in England, which certainly is cheaper than a trip to England. He explained at length quite a bit of the history of Rev John Wesley, founder of Methodism and showed slides of some of his various homes and churches at which he had preached. Many other churches were shown, famous and unknown, as well as other religious architecture. His family anecdotes were very well received as well as his scenic slides.

Donald Marquis was the featured speaker at the meeting of 11 October 1982 when he chose to speak on Research in Scotland. His Scottish ancestry is especially interesting since he and his wife share a common Scottish ancestor. Mr Marquis reviewed the geography of Scotland-the Highlands, Lowlands and the Southern Uplands, mentioning that these Scottish lands lie in the same latitude of Hudson's Bay, accounting for much of the miserable weather. The original settlers were Picts, followed later by the Celts. Many of the Scots came from Ireland, bringing Christianity with them. He related the history of Kings, battles and the eventual English rule. One of the many hints passed along was the fact that possibly the immigrants named a community in America to reflect the familiarity with an old world town of that name. Don discussed various records available-church records, marriages, births, funeral and mentioned that wills are available and indexed. Most of the land in Scotland currently is owned by a few large land-owners. Maps are available for locating obscure or vanished hamlets. Among the genealogical facts and Scottish foibles discussed were bagpipes, haggis, kilts and other noted Scots items of interest.
