Programs in Review Leland R Watrous

Our meeting of 8 November 1982, featured, as guest speaker, Fred Pike, who treated us to a very interesting program on cemetery research. Fred started out by noting that he has records on some 88 cemeteries in Saginaw County, including private, vacated, religious, corporation and family burying grounds. These cemeteries vary from one, two or three interments to several thousand, depending on the type. Much information is available from cemeteries, either from the headstones, the sexton's record or from records in the offices of the various denomination or municipality. When reading cemeteries, all information on the stone is recorded. In order to do a good job, these readings are then checked out against the records which are available. Sometimes, for some reason a stone is found for which no record can be found, and conversely, records show that burials have been made, but no stone can be found, either because of vandalism or the stone has sunk into the ground through the years. Mr. Pike was in charge of our Society's reading of the Calvary Cemetery, behind Hoyt Park over the past summer. There are Polish, French and Irish sections, among others. The cemetery was formed in 1856 and was taken over by the Catholic Church in 1868. The burial book starts in 1888, leaving 32 years which are not covered by the book. The burial book gives the cause of death and some additional information. Fred reviewed some cemetery regulations covered by Act 22, 1905 and then read from a book "Over Their Dead Bodies," a collection of memorable tomstone epitaphs.

Peggy Lugthart, a member of the Eddy Room staff, was the featured speaker for the meeting of 10 January 1983 and gave some helpful hints and information about libaries. She emphasized that librarians are human too, and like to be treated as humans in that some individuals expect not only instant results on their genealogy, but also like to monopolize the librarian's time when other people also need help. She also suggested that patrons be ready to leave when the library closes, rather than waiting to the last minute. Peggy noted that the LDS Stake libaries can save a lot of trouble because of the vast amount of material which they can order; even the smallest village library should be checked-they could possibly have only a handful of books, but just one might be your gold mine. She also noted that historical societies also have some genealogical information which could prove very helpful.
