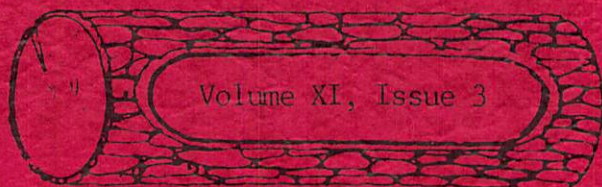

**ELEVENTH ANNUAL SEMINAR SPEAKER ANNOUNCED**

The Saginaw Genealogical Society is extremely proud and very pleased to announce that the speaker for the Eleventh Annual Seminar will be Meredith B. Colket of Cleveland, Ohio. He has served as the Archivist at the National Archives, Washington, D.C. from 1937 to 1957 and is currently Director and Executive Director Emeritus of the Western Reserve Historical Society in Cleveland, Ohio. He is a founder and director of the American Institute for Genealogical Research, is a Fellow in the Society of American Archivists, the American Society of Genealogists and the Society of Genealogists of London, England. He is also a member of the International Society of British Genealogy and Family History.

Mr Colket is the author of numerous articles on genealogical subjects as well as such books as The Marbury Ancestry, The Jenks Family of England, and a co-compiler of Guide to Genealogical Records in the National Archives, Founders of Early American Families and an Associate Editor of The American Genealogist.

Mr Colket has been our featured speaker before, in January, 1974, and presented such an outstanding program that he was invited back to speak on another subject with which he is very familiar: "Early New England Colonists and Their English Ancestors." One of his books, Founders of Early American Families, published under the auspices of The General Court of the Order of Founders and Patriots of America in 1975, has become a standard reference book for those searching out early emigrants of the time period 1607-1657.

Please turn out and do yourselves a favor by taking in this tremendous speaker.
