### Programs in Review Leland R. Watrous

Our meeting of 14 Feb 1983 featured Society member Dr Richard Mudd speaking on "The medical Aspects of Lincoln's Assassination", noting that few events in American history have had such a dramatic impact upon the American people. When people hear the term "medical aspects" they think only of Dr Samuel Mudd, but there at least 25 other doctors who had been involved, in one way or the other. Dr Mudd stated that both John Wilkes Booth and his father had exhibited pathological traits which filled them with grandiose ideas and bizarre interests; this later developed into paranoia. A question has arisen in light of the assassination, is how long Lincoln might have lived, if not for the fatal shot. Lincoln had Marfans Syndrome, an inherited disease, which also produces high intelligence. One authority has stated that Lincoln had only about six months or less to live and had a defective heart, and would either have died from this heart ailment or become physically and mentally disabled. The shot by Booth into Lincoln's head above the left ear, resulted: in Lincoln's death at 7:22am on 15 April 1865. The slow moving, heavy derringer missile caused a wound, which while, fatal, permitted Lincoln to survive nine hours. An Army doctor, the first on the scene, found Lincoln not breathing, placed him on the floor and gave mouth to mouth resuscitation. He was then removed to a private house across the street. The doctors kept the wound open and bleeding; when brandy and water were administered, it was found that Lincoln could not swallow. All Lincoln's clothes were removed to look for other wounds, although there were no signs. Doctors who have studied his wounds, state that even with modern surgery, his life could not have been saved. Five hours after death, an autopsy was performed. Other injuries at the time were the stabbing of a Major in Lincoln's booth and the broken leg of Booth. Dr Mudd also spoke of the injury to Booth's leg and later the gunshot wound which finally killed him 26 April 1865.

The speaker for the meeting of 14 March 1983 was Lawrence E Glynn, Jr, associate professor of History at Delta College, speaking on "Some things about the Civil War that we did not see in Gone With The Wind or The Blue And the Gray". Mr Glynn discussed some of his family history relating to the Civil War and noted that many Irish and of Irish descent and Afro-American served in the US Navy during that conflict. Although society was segregated, the Navy was not. The Army, however, did retain segregation. Both of the groups exhibited fervent patriotism, despite being rivals for unskilled Professor Glynn showed enlistment records jobs in Civilian life. from Erie, PA for the Navy in March 1862, including his great grandfather John Sweeny. One quarter of the Navy, during the Civil War were black or of African descent. Whites were attracted to the Army because of bounties which were paid-the Navy paid \$10 per month to start while the Army paid only \$2. Mr Glynn went through the job titles available in the Navy, including the fact that many blacks served as pilots, a rating equal to that of commissioned officer. This was in direct contrast to the Anti-Draft Riot of New York City when rampaging Irish killed large numbers of blacks. After the war, those who had served well together in service, went back to their same racially-motivated behavior.

Dorr Wiltse, Society member from Caro spoke at the 9 May 1983 meeting on "Writing and Publishing a Family History" told us that

(Programs in Review, continued) although he has completed a family history, he still does not consider himself a genealogist. He had started in 1952, without all the present-day help which is now available, and finished his book for publication in 1980, because he got side-tracked along the way. His reasons for the project were partly to satisfy himself and family and also present to the public for sharing. Mr Dorr gave a number of anecdotes regarding his activities in genealogical research which proved why he is so popular as a speaker. He suggested that to start compiling a family history, a person should collect and write down all family stories and anecdotes that can be recalled, before relatives can slip away. A good place to start proving out the stories and information would well be the Eddy Room of our local library, or possibly a larger library, such as the Burton Collection in Detroit. When writing down the history, try for accuracy and truthfulness.


