Programs in Review

The regular meeting of 8 October 1984 featured Bernard Spencer of Bridgeport, speaking on Indians of the Great Lakes. An interest in Indians has sparked much interest in allied fields, such as history, archaelogy, ect. Mr Spencer read a description of Indians of 1854, their housing and habits and customs. The pictures painted by different authors, vary as does their outlook on Indians. Bernie showed slides, which portrayed a different feeling than usually given and noted that as the glaciers, which had covered our area, retreated, Indians from further south gradually migrated north. A number of copper items came to this area, along with stone weapon tips and cutting tools. Mr Spencer also stated that weaving of cloth was also in vogue as early as 2500 B.C. Charles and Genevieve Molenaar were the featured speaking team for the meeting of 12 November 1984. They had spent three months last summer researching in the Scaninavian, Dutch and English archives. Chuck illustrated his talk with numerous color slides of various interesting facets which he had encountered and noted that as the English language was spoken in most of the countries which they visited, they had little problem in that department. Along with the slides, he narrated stories of persons they met and added anecdotes to go along with the slides.

GENEALOGICAL EXCERPTS FROM The Saginaw Enterprise May 25, 1854

The furnace of Messrs. Eastman & Co. was nearly completed, to start forging next week; proprietors about to erect a steam saw mill near their foundry. J. Pierson's circular saw mill was to be raised that week. Whitney & Vanston's Mill was ready to receive machinery; Whiting's Mill, built by C O Garrison, will be raised next week;

; ;

M. Jeffers' mill will be running in a few days; the new Methodist church will be raised next week-50 x 30 feet, with a steeple 95 feet high. The Rt. Rev. Samuel A. McCoskry, DD, Bishop of the Diocese of Michigan will preach at the new school house in Saginaw City on Sunday, May 28th.

Thursday, June 1, 1854

DIED. In this place, on the 1st inst., of pulmonary consumption, Mrs Caroline Eliza, wife of Joseph Lawrence, aged 29 years 7 months and 10 days.

MARRIED. On the 28th ult, at East Saginaw, by the Rev. A. C. Shaw, Mr. Frank A. Williamson, to Miss Clara P Dean, all of this place. June 8, 1854

We are pained to state a serious accident which yesterday happened to Mr S.B. Knapp, one of our most respectable citizens and mechanics. While assisting in raising some of the uppermost timbers of the frame of Whitin's new mill, now being erected, he fell from the top of the frame- a distance of some twenty feet or upward on the timbers below, cutting an ugly gash in his side and otherwise bruising him. We understand that his physicians do no pronounce his wounds fatal, unless there should be internal injuries.

One of the hands in Whitney's new mill, a Mr. Nelson, at about the same time of the above, had the fingers severed from one of his hands, in the lath works attached to the mill.

We regret to learn of the death of Capt. John Klaskye, commander of the new vessel "Jesse Hoyt" of Cholera at Chicago on the 9th inst., after but a few hours illness. He resided at Cleveland, and leaves a wife and seven children to mourn his sudden death. July 6, 1854

Another destructive fire took place on the morning of July 5, which burned the Irving House, store and warehouses of W L P Little & Co.; fire started in the roof of the kitchen and woodhouse of the Irving House and spread; all escaped from the hotel.

David Taylor, son of Mr. Charles Taylor of this place, engaged a hand in the planing mill of Messrs. Hoyt & Whitney, became entangled in the machinery and was crushed to death instantly-he was about 16 years of age and had lately been engaged in the machine. On the evening of the 3d inst., Hon. G. D. Williams' Mill at Saginaw City, was discovered to be in flames; prompt exertions of the citizens prevented the fire from spreading, but the mill was leveled. Loss estimated at \$9,000. The mill was said to be the oldest on the river, had lately been put in repair and was doing a good business.

Thursday, July 20, 1854

The Saginaw House was the name of the newest hotel; formerly occupied by H. Mapes; D. B. Wright had taken it over, refurbished it and renamed it.

August 10, 1854

Co-partnership existing under the name of W L P Little & Co., of East Saginaw was dissolved on August 10, 1854, by W L P Little & Jesse Hoyt.

George W Rice, US Marshal, was offering for sale to the public, the title and interest of John Pierson in the Steam Saw Mill and appurtenances, situated on the Saginaw River, opposite East Saginaw and 800 feet below the ferry from East Saginaw, said real estate being the same that was purchased from E N Davenport.

Thursday, August 31, 1854

A New vessel was building in the yard of Messrs Smith & Whitney for Jesse Hoyt of New York. 156 feet in length on deck, 29 feet 4 inch beam amidships, and depth of hold 11 feet 10 inches; three masted, brig rigged forward, to carry 500 tons.

The new mill of Whitney & Vanston had been in operation for a number of weeks; six mills had been built in this place this season. The Carrollton mill, a short distance below, was being rebuilt again by Mr. Westervelt.

MARRIED. At the parsonage in this place, on the 25th, by the Rev. A.C. Shaw, Mr. George Hubbard, to Miss Anne E Glover, all of this place.

In Flint, on the 17th by R. W. Jenny, Esq., Mr. Peter W. Kinney of this place, and Miss Anna M. Willson of Springfield.
September 7, 1854

The Engine for Pioneer Engine Co., No. 1, arrived with 500 feet of hose.

DIED. In this place, on ---(this date?), Mrs. Helen, wife of Col. W.L.P. Little. By her death, not only has a dreary void been occasioned in the family circle where she presided with so much grace and affection, but community and the Church have lost a loved and useful member. Noble and affectionate in her bearing, a lady and a Christian, she was beloved and honored by all who knew her. DIED. In Rose, August 28, after a long and lingering consumption, Miss Louisa Grant, of East Saginaw, aged 21 years and 4 months.--Fentonville Observer.

Partnership of East Saginaw Planing Company, was dissolved by mutual consent of Thomas Whitney and Jesse Hoyt on July 20, 1854. September 28, 1854

R. B. Hall, prosecuting attorney for this county had returned after an absence of several weeks for the benefit of his health.

Rev. Mr. Clements, appointed by the Methodist Episcopal Conference to this startion, will preach at the Academy next Sabbath.

The new church was nearly completed, was to be dedicated on the 8th of October; builder was Mr. Bude; minister was Mr. Shaw.

Fred Kohler had a son born to the family, no name given.

February 15, 1855

MARRIED. In Memphis, Tennessee, on the 3d Inst, Mr. J. Q. Keil, to Miss Kate Williamson.

In Flint, February 6, by the Rev. J M Arnold, Mr. Eugene Grant of East Saginaw to Miss Charlotte Dickinson of Thetford, formerly of this place.

Near Chicago, about the 1st Inst, Mr. A. H. Mershon, of this place, to Miss Hellen Johnson.

DIED. At Rogers, Tuscola Co., Jan 19th, after two months illness, Julia A., wife of J A Simerson and daughter of J A & Nancy Hamilton, aged about 18 years.

There will be a Donation at the house of Norman Little for the benefit of Rev. S. Clements, tomorrow evening, February 16. A general attendance is requested.

The new foundry of G.W. Merrill of this place is in "full blast". Thursday, February 22, 1855

An act, incorporating this place was passed near the close of the session of the Legislature. We have not a copy of the Act, but shall publish it as soon as received. It will undoubtedly soon take effect and it may be well for our citizens to begin to cast about

them for the proper men to fill the offices under the new arrangement. The Act may be production of much good to the place if the right sort of men are put in office to take the initiative, otherwise it will be of little benefit.

March 1, 1855

An act to organize the County of Gratiot was passed by the State legislature, February 3, 1855.

Quite an excitement was created in this place early in the afternoon of Sunday last by the alarm of Fire, which was just breaking through the roof of the dwelling of Mrs Mead on Washington Street. The fire caught from a Stove Pipe passing through the ceiling in an upper room, but by the prompt exertions of citizens was quelled before great damage was done. With a slight delay, or lack of water, it would not have been possible to have saved the house. We learn that a young man by the name of Eastman, employed in the lumbering camps of B F Partridge, on the south branch of the Bad River, fell from a load of hay near that locality, on Thursday last, and coming in contact with one of the horse's heels, was so badly kicked that his life is despaired of.

MARRIED. In this village on the 3d inst, by S C Munson, Esq., James L.T. Fox, Esq., to Miss Charlotte Taylor, both of East Saginaw. DIED. In Genesee, Mich., on the morning of the 1st inst, Mr Nathaniel Blackmar, late of this place. Mr. B. some time ago was attacked by that insidious disease, Typhoid Fever, which ended with quick

Consumption and his death. He will be missed by a large circle of relatives and friends.

March 15, 1855

The legislature acted to organize the township of Millington in the County of Tuscola; approved February 10, 1855.

April 5, 1855

The Act to Incorporate the Village of East Saginaw, was printed in its entirety.

We are happy to welcome back Mr. Warner, Principal of our Union School after a short vacation. School will commence on next Monday, the 9th inst. It is desirous that the children should be sent at commencement of the term.

MARRIED. At Lower Saginaw, on the 18th ult, by the Rev. I Cogges-hall, Mr. J. D. Huckins, formerly New Hampton, NH, to Miss Cordelia Pierce, of the former place.

In this place, on the 19th inst, by S. C. Munson, Esq., Mr. F Dietrich of Cheboygan to Miss Eleanora Pirth, of this place. April 12, 1855

The first boat of the season, the "Traffic", made its appearance the previous Tuesday; commanded by Capt. Little; Capt Pierce's Propellor, the "John Lathrop", was also running.

Following were officers elected at Buena Vista Township election the previous week: Morgan L Gage, supervisor; Alex Ferguson, Clerk; Jay S Curtis, Treasurer; Loton H Eastman, JP; Franklin A Curtis and William Wadsworth, Highway Commissioners; Chester P Jones, school inspector; N. Little, D. Lyon, overseers of the poor; F T Hall, A L Rankin, Th. M. Birdsall, Ch. R. Taylor, constables. April 19, 1855

Planing Machine of Mershon, Whitney & Co. was in operation with about 1 million feet of lumber to be dressed and sent to Chicago; the new mill of S T Atwater functioning as well as the two foundries, Warner & Co., and G. W. Merrill, the former turning out a fine lot of plows. Beach, Moores & Co added to their Warehousing operations.

April 26, 1855

The frame for another Hotel, a short distance below the American, has just been put up by Mr. Leidlein. Hess & Brother have started building a 2-story building to be used as book store and postoffice; Mr. Eaton had grown in boot and shoemaking to the point where he started a two-story building. William Gallagher started building a steam mill, a few rods below his store.

Hess & Brother offered Bupuy Otard Brandy, Pure Port Juice and Pure Catawba Wine as a cure for the Cholera.

May 3, 1855

At a meeting at Buena Vista Hall on April 26, a committee of Curtis Emerson, W.W. Yawkey, Morgan L. Gage, William Gallagher and Capt. Those persons whose names were placed in nomination as officers of the East Saginaw corporation, were elected without opposition on Monday, May 7th.

The Saginaw Enterprise was preparing to move to another building,

We regret to state that C.A. Lull, proprietor of the Bridgeport Center House, at Bridgeport Center, had his leg badly broken, in place, last evening. He was driving a somewhat vicious horse through town and was sitting near the front part of the wagon, when the animal kicked through the dash board, breaking his leg a short distance above his ankle. May 17, 1855

John A Westervelt's Mill at Carrollton sawed 2547 feet of boards in 55 minutes the previous day, on a circular saw.

Officers of the Corporation (of East Saginaw) met the previous evening and appointed Voorhies, Mershon & Mott as a bylaw committee. Austin L. Rankin was elected Marshall for the coming year. L H Eastman was commissioner for roads in upper division and Franklin Curtis for the lower.

Accident-Merrick Joslin, a young man about 20 years of age, who resided at Vassar, came in with a load of lumber; while assisting in running the load on the dock, one wheel broke through, throwing the load against another adjacent load, crushing him to death between them.

The Saginaw Enterprise had removed to the room over the store of $C.M.\ Curtis\ \&\ Brother.$

William Kremer, a German, engaged in the planing works of Mershon, Whitney & Co., last Monday, in feeling the buzz saw to learn its temperature, had one of his fingers split nearly in two and his hand otherwise injured. The wounds were promptly dressed by Dr R C Newton and Dr Curtis

Judge Davenport deserves the compliments of our citizens for the neat and substantial manner in which he has put the ferry at this place, and the promptitude with which it is conducted. We learn that Hon. E N Davenport, of Saginaw City, had several sheep killed by a dog on Tuesday evening. The judge caught the animal in the act and sent it where all sheep-killing dogs go. Friend Warner, the popular teacher of our Union School was complimented
