GENEALOGICAL EXCERPTS FROM The Saginaw Daily Courier

Extracted by Anna Mae Maday

Information from article which appeared in the Saginaw Daily Courier April 6, 1872 page 2 ("The County Poor Farm" Where it is-What it is-and Who live there)

History & Descriptive Information Contained in Article 90 acres 7 miles nearly south west of city, within 1 mile of Tittabawassee River.

Purchased somewhere about the year 1850 from James & Murdock FRASER for \$1300 or thereabouts. Was in a wild state with a frame house on land. 1872 land was under cultivation.

Reporter thought the location was inconvenient, a great distance from cities and roads, railroads.

Present lessee John MONAHAN (keeper), a practical farmer. Position pays \$475 a year.

Reporter praises present administration for improvements (fences, wells, outhouses).

House description-36 x 90, 2 story, fine high ceilings, high broad windows, large dining rooms, one for each sex. Mrs. MONAHAN keeps house clean.

Dr. CROUSE employed as physician for them.

There is a "black house" 30 yrds from farm house- 1 story, somber exterior 16x20, with cells where those with boisterous tantrums are taken.

INMATES

At present there are 33 inmates, some are able-bodied, some partly sane. Some do household chores, saw, split wood, but their labor cannot be counted on. There were 3 deaths during past year. Abram, a dapper little white haired Frenchman has lived there some years, is very neat, is a character, says he is Abraham GIMMET, a Canadian, 88, but doesn't look that old.

There are 2 under lock and key in the "black house". One is Philip CUNIFORD, native of Canada, sent here from Spaulding Twp. Kept continually in "Black house". Has hair and whiskers long and matted, refuses to have them cut, is ugly and dirty. Once got hold of an axe and smashed doors and locks. Was rumored he tried to kill his wife.

Programs in Review The meeting of January 14, 1985 featured the new director of the Saginaw Public Library, Cathy O'Connell, in a get-acquainted meeting. After she introduced herself, she gave a short biographical sketch of herself and then spoke on genealogy and the public library and her perception of both. The libraries must be a vital force in order to survive. To do this, the libraries must be accountable to the public. Since many individuals have an interest in genealogy, the library must provide help in this area as well as well those interested in finances, collecting, reading, etc. A shortage of funds means a very careful selection of materials and personnel. Our society fulfils much of these criteria by helping with new books, records, classes and other assistance. Working together, the library and our Society can accomplish much of value to the community. A genealogical "Show and Tell" was presented by Alice Schiesswohl, Lynn Clark, Fred Pike, Nancy Van Wormer and Lee Watrous.

The eagerly-awaited visit of Dr William Bulger, a history professor at CMU speaking on trivia was called off at the last minute due to a snow storm, but we are assured of his visit later in the year. The regular meeting of 11 March 1985 took place, although a board meeting the previous Monday had once again been snowed out. We were lucky to have our own Peggy Lugthart speaking on the LDS branch library in Midland. She told us that there was lots of help in Midland for us, although it was mostly volunteer help and was available during their regular hours, but you must know what you want. Census, passenger recrods as well as many other types of records are available through their request service. An index to their holdings is available on microfiche. Their catalog lists author, subject, title, etc and some books are not available. A cost of \$2.50 is the rental fee for one reel of film for a period of two weeks, or an additional one dollar for a six month extension. Prints can be ordered from microfilm at 25 cents per page with a minimum order of \$1.00. The library does not have a printer for microfilm, so they must be ordered. She described the location of the library and passed out pamphlets designating their services as well as a map of their location.

GENEALOGICAL EXCERPTS FROM THE Saginaw Enterprise Leland R. Watrous May 24, 1855

Tuesday morning, a flue from one of the large boilers collapsed. J. Albro, fireman, was standing nearly in front of the boiler and was blown against the wall, scalded and mangled in a shocking manner. He survived on a few hours. Emery Williams, engineer, was badly scalded but jumped into the river to mitigate the effects. James Staples was also much injufred. (Name of the company was not given) T.B. Fox has taken possession of Willey's old stand and is prepared to furnish anything in the grocery line. "True" has some refreshments for the "inner man" and intends to enlarge that branch of his establishment.

Fred Koehler removed to his large, new blacksmith shop, opposite Enterprise office.

May 31, 1855

The sheriff was ordered to hold the goods of Hugh Dunlop until he paid \$528.17 to Timothy Battell, plaintiff in a circuit court case. June 7, 1855

The office of the Saginaw and Genesee Plank Road Co., had been moved to the New Brick Block, corner of Plank Road and Water Streets, signed by Charles B. Mott, secy.

Married. In this place on the morning of the 29th inst, by the Rev. S. Clements, Mr., Charles H. Brower of Zilwaukie and Miss Jennie E Mershon of East Saginaw.

In this village, on the 14th inst, by the Rev. H. N. Bissel, Mr. Gilbert R Chandler of East Saginaw, to Miss Sarah A Chapman of Mt Clemens-Advocate, Mt Clemens.

M. Jeffers disposed of his saw mill to a company from Maine, Mc Donald & Co., for the sum of \$15,000.

The "Mammoth Mill", the "Shepherd Mill", village property, including a large hotel and pine lands were to be offered at a sale to be held 22 May 1855 in Zilwaukie, by Disbrow & Gallagher.

June 14, 1855

The board of Supervisors of Sginaw County met May 15, 1855; present were H S Penoyer, Saginaw; Morgan L Gage, Buena Vista; Henry C Ashmun, Midland; Levi W Vaughan, Taymouth; Jefferson Jaquith, Tittabawawsee; David Joscelyn, St Charles; Luke Wellington, Zilwaukie; John G Schnell, Blumfield; George L Spice, Pine River; George Lord, Hampton. 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
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
