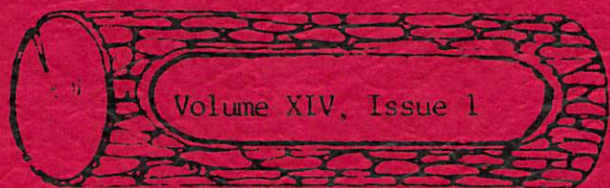

Record Book of Pioneer Fire Company Number 1, East Saginaw, Michigan

Recently, information additional to that found on pages 56 and 57 of Truman B. Fox's 1858 History of Saginaw County turned up, regarding the early history of Pioneer Fire Company #1 of East Saginaw.

The small (7½ x 10 inch) blue booklet, consisting of 136 pages (several blank), contains the first 1½ years' history of this pioneer fire company. Interestingly enough, this company responded to only four fires in the nearly two years covered. There were other fire companies in East Saginaw at the time--Jesse Hoyt Engine Co. #2, its companion Hose Company, Hook and Ladder Company #1, and a company known as Excelsior Company, but mentioned only in minutes of the Pioneer Company; one of these other companies may have covered other fires in the town. Chapman mentions the big fires of 5 July 1854 and 7 May 1861; neither of these occurred during the time frame covered by these minutes--16 October 1857 to 25 March 1859.

The condition of the minutes book leaves much to be desired, but is in remarkably good condition for its age. The ink has faded, the penmanship is difficult to read and the binding consists of string and glue. The low contrast between the blue pages and the ink makes deciphering an eye-watering task but the information is so interesting that it more than makes up for these inconveniences.

The book turned up in 1979, was retyped during the following months and both a typescript copy and the original was donated to the Saginaw Historical Society Museum to accompany the exhibits of

fire equipment on display there.

Truman Fox gives a nearly complete list of members of the company; however, the information in these notes fills in some holes and adds greatly to the knowledge of this early fire company.

The minute book contains copies of the Constitution and By Laws of 1857, 1858 and 1862. each of which closely resembles the others. naturally. Along with names of members. as members. it also lists absentees from regular and special meetings. The Constitutions specified that a roll call be taken at the start of each meeting: to this was added a second roll call. near the end of the meeting. possibly to recognize that some people were bound to be tardy and miss the first call; possibly this was to keep people from sneaking out of meetings which they found boring. It is quite interesting to note their preoccupation with roll calls, notes as to absentees and the fines assessed therefor; 12¢ penalty for each of the roll calls (one bit?). Some of the absences were excused because of illness or the person being out of town; some of the fines were remitted, probably because of extenuating circumstances. Fines amounted to \$94.37 overall through this time period, although some of this was remitted from time to time.

On 3 December 1857, Pioneer Hose Company Number 1 was formed from the Engine Company, with the Engine Company giving up nine of its members. This Hose Company was dissolved at the meeting on 3 November 1858 but was re-formed on 5 January 1859 with 11 members, again taken from the Engine Company; apparently politics played some part in this maneuvering.

There are a wealth of names to be found in these pages; the first problem is to decipher the handwriting, the second to attempt a determination as to when each individual became affiliated with the company. The first problem is difficult but in most cases can be solved. The second is fairly simple in most of the cases but there are several undated pages which offer no clue as to when the names were inscribed. Those members, where it can be demonstrated that they were charter members are quite close to those names given by Truman Fox in his history. Since there is no way of determining the exact publication date of Fox' history, it must be assumed that Fox can be correct on his charter membership of the company and the hose company, but is incomplete as to membership until the last date in the minute book.

In any case, the book adds several names to our knowledge of the residents of East Saginaw for 1858 and 1859--names that probably would not have been known without the information on the pages of this booklet. One can only wish that continuations of this booklet might still be in existence and will see the light of day some day; possibly other notebooks of this type were kept in early days and just maybe some still survive. Maybe.

The reader is invited to use the following pages as a research aid to the residents of East Saginaw of that time as well as for the insight it gives into the early fire companies of the town.

CONSTITUTION OF PIONEER FIRE COMPANY NO. 1

Article 1

Sect 1. This company shall be known as Pioneer Fire Company No.1.

Sect 2. The Officers of this company shall consist of a Foreman, First and Second Assistant Foreman and Secretary, who shall be ex-officio Treasurer.

(Pioneer Fire Company #1, continued)

- Sect. 3. The Officers shall be chosen by ballot and the candidate having the majority of all the votes given shall be declared elected and shall continue in office until his successors shall be chosen.
- Sect 4. The said officers shall be elected annually on the first Wednesday of October in each year after the first election.
- Sect 5. In case any office shall become vacant by the death, resignation or removal of the incumbent, The Company shall at their next meeting proceed to fill such vacancy in the manner provided in Section No. 3.

Article 2-Duties of the Officers

- Sect. 1. It shall be the duty of the Foreman to preside at all meetings of the Company. To assume command, whenever the company is called out and to have general Supervision over the officers of the company.
- Sect. 2. In the absence of the Foreman, The 1st As^t foreman shall perform his duties and in the absence of the 1st As^t then the 2nd As^t and in the absence of them all. The Secretary shall act as foreman.
- Sect. 3. It shall be the duty of the secretary to keep a record of the proceedings of the Company. To call the roll. To keep a list of members. To give notice of special meetings.
- It shall also be his duty as Treasurer to collect all dues. Keep all moneys belonging to the Company and to make such disbursements as he may be directed by a vote of the company.

He shall on the first Wednesdays of October & April in Each year and at any other time when required by a vote of the Company render an account of the state of the Treasury. The amount of fines Collected and the dues unpaid and standing against each member of the company at the time of rendering each report.

Article 3-Admission of Members

- Sect. 1. A Candidate for admission shall be presented by a member of the Company at a regular meeting and balloted for at the next regular meeting and it shall be required that a 2 thirds majority of those present to elect.
- Sect. 2. Every person admitted shall pay the Sum of Fifty-Cents as an initiation fee and sign the Constitution & Bye Laws.

Article 4-Expulsion of Members

- Sect. 1. If a member shall neglect his duties, disturb the peace & good order of the Company or neglect to liquidate his dues, it shall be deemed sufficient cause for expulsion and he shall, upon complaint being made, be cited to appear before the Company at a regular meeting and answer said complaint. But no member shall be expelled without the concurrence of 2 thirds of the voters present.

Article 5-Uniforms

- Sect. 1. It shall be the duty of every member to obtain a uniform as follows: A red flannel shirt, a black patent leather Belt fastened with a buckle and the word Pioneer in bronze letters on the back, a glazed cap with a silver plated figure 1 in front, a pr of Blk Pants and a brass key to fit the lock of the Engine house and he shall within thirty days after his election, report himself fully equipped to the Secretary.

(Pioneer Fire Company #1, continued)

Article 6-Meetings

- Sect 1. There shall be a regular meeting of the company on the first Wednesday of every month and the hour of regular meetings shall be at Eight O'clock P.M. from April to Sept inclusive- and at Seven O'clock P.M. from October to March inclusive
- Sect 2 The Foreman shall call a Special Metting at any time he may deem it necessary or upon a written requisition signed by at least Six members of the Company.
- Sect 3. The Secretary shall give each member written notice of all Special Meetings at least 12 hours before the time of the meeting.
- Sect 4. At any meeting of the Company duly called, Ten members shall Constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article 7-Amendments

- Sect 1. This Constitution may be Amended, Altered or revised by a vote of Two thirds of all the members of the Company.
- Sect 2. All Amendments, Alterations or revisions shall be made in writing and shall be proposed to the Company one month previous to the vote taken on their final adoption.

Bye Laws of Pioneer Fire Co. No. 1

- Rule 1. At the hour for meeting, The Company shall proceed to business. The Roll shall in all cases be called within ten minutes after the hour appointed for the meeting.
- Rule 2. Order of Business.
1. Roll Call
 2. Reading minutes of previous meeting
 3. Admission of Candidates
 4. Offering of petitions and Resolutions
 5. Reports of Committees
 - 6.. Collections of fines & hearing of excuses
 7. Miscellaneous Business
 8. Appointment of Committees for Succeeding Months
 9. Roll Call
- Rule 3. No motion shall be considered as before the Company unless supported and when required shall be reduced to writing.
- Rule 4. A motion to adjourn shall be taken without debate.
- Rule 5. Any member leaving the room without permission from the presiding Officer may be fined at the discretion of the Company, not exceeding One Dollar.
- Rule 6. Members absent from a regular or special meeting of the Company shall be fined twenty-five cents. If absent from Either Roll Call, twelve and a half cents. If absent from a fire (or from an Alarm when the Engine is taken the Distance of two blocks from the Engine House), Twenty five cents.
- Rule 7. Any member absent from any meeting of the company or from any fire, shall make his excuse at the first regular meeting there after, unless sick or absent from the village, when it shall be done at the first regular meeting after his recovery or return- and in case of neglect to do so, he shall not be entitled to any Exemption.
- Rule 8. No excuse shall be valid except sickness or absence from the village unless approved of by two thirds of the members present.

(Pioneer Fire Co. #1, continued)

- Rule 9. Every member shall pay strict attention to and obey the orders of the Foreman & Assistants. Violation of this Bye Law shall subject the offender to Expulsion from the Company.
- Rule 10. Any member leaving the Engine at a fire or on day of Exercise without permission of the Foreman or person in command, shall be fined One Dollar.
- Rule 11. Any Member appearing at a meeting or Exercise without his uniform shall be fined Twenty five cents and for General inspection Fifty cents unless excused by the Company.
- Rule 12. A Committee of three shall be appointed at Each monthly meeting whose duty it shall be to keep Engine House and apparatus in good order during the month for which they are appointed. The first named on the Committee shall be Chairman and it shall be his duty to report to the Company any neglect of duty on the part of any member of the Committee. This Com: shall be selected by taking the names on the Roll, in order as they stand on the roll.
- Rule 13. If any Member of said Com: neglect to perform his duty, He shall be fined One dollar.
- Rule 14. On the first wednesday of October and April, After the first meeting, there shall be an auditing Committee of two appointed by the Foreman whose duty shall be to audit all accounts and Examine & Report upon the Treasurer's Semi-annual statements.
- Rule 15. When a vote is being taken upon a question before the Company, The Foreman may, if he thinks proper--or if he be requested by any member of the Company, require any member of the Company present to vote.
- Rule 16. It shall be the duty of Every member at every regular meeting of the Company upon his name being called to show his Key and any one neglecting to do so shall be subject to a fine of five cents.
- Rule 17. These Bye Laws may at any time be Altered or amended by a vote of two thirds of the members of the Company.

Article 1-Name

Sect 1. This Company shall be known as the Pioneer Fire Company, No. 1

Article II-Officers

Sect 1. The officers of this Company shall consist of a Foreman, First and Second Assistant Foreman, Secretary, Treasurer, Foreman of Hose Company and two trusgees.

Sect 2. The officers shall be chosen by ballot, and the candidate having the majority of all the votes cast shall be declared duly elected.

Sect 3. The officers of the company shall be elected annually, on the first Wednesday of October, except the Trustees of the Fire Department for the year 1861, who shall be elected on the first Wednesday in January of that year; one to hold the office for two years to be decided by lot which shall hold for two years.

Sect 4. In case any office becomes vacant, by the death, resignation, or absence of the incumbent, the Company shall at their next regular meeting, proceed to fill said vacancy in the manner prescribed by section three.

Article III-Duties of Officers

Sect 1. It shall be the duty of the Foreman to preside at all meetings of the Company, to direct and control at all fires, parades, and elsewhere, while on duty, and to exercise a general supervision over the affairs of the Company.

Sect 2. In the absence of the Foreman, the First Assistant shall perform his duties; and in the absence of them both, the Second Assistant shall act as Foreman.

Sect 3. The Assistants shall be designated as First and Second, and they shall rank accordingly. It shall be the duty of the First Assistant to attend to the Engine and Hose on days of exercise and at fires, under the direction of the Foreman; and of the Second Assistant to take charge of the pipe under the direction of the Commanding officer, and they shall perform such other duties as are designated in the Constitution and Bye-Laws. At the meeting of June 10, 1985, Fred Pike presented the two-volume Famine Immigrants and Loyalists of Canada to Cathy O'Connell on behalf of the memorial committee of the Society. Following this, Robert Sylvester presented his program, "People of the Railroad". A good speaker with much interesting and informative information, he detailed the history of the railroad from the 1500s to date. Saginaw, because of the lumber industry and the attendant transportation needs, became the train hub of Michigan. He detailed the jobs in railroading; many have changed, but many have also remained the same. Bob went through the various jobs and terms used on the railroad, as well as the equipment. Fred Pike introduced the speaker for the meeting of September 9th,

as Arthur LaBelle, a life-long resident of South Saginaw, who responded in turn with information about Fred, and then began with some fine anecdotes. Mr. LaBelle spoke on the contrast between the present and the past and gave numerous examples of these differences. GENEALOGICAL EXCERPTS FROM *The Saginaw Enterprise*

Leland R. Watrous

February 8, 1856

Captain Raymond, of East Saginaw, lost a span of horses, sleigh and harness in the fire of the Northern Hotel in Flint the previous Tuesday.

Fire at a house on the east side of the river, opposite the Saginaw City Ferry, commonly known as the "Old Ferry House," was consumed by fire on Saturday evening last. It was occupied by a family named Sparks; a son about 14 years of age died in the flames.

MARRIED. In this village on the 5th instant by the Rev S. Clements, Jr., Mr. John Plant of Tittabawassee to Miss Susanna Skelton of Milford, Oakland Co.

DIED. At the residence of his father, in Orange Co., NY, December 5, 1855, Mr. S. I. Sayer, late of this place, aged 38 years.

February 15, 1856

The partnership of J. E. Burt and R. H. Loomis, in the painting Business, dissolved on December 25, 1855.

February 22, 1856

The paper of that date ran a list of mills and amounts of lumber they cut in the past season. The Republican Association of East Saginaw, held Tuesday, February 19, 1856 at the house of S. C. Munson, adopted a platform and constitution and elected officers: President, Joseph Lawrence; Vice Presidents: H. S. Edget, S. C. Munson, C. B. Mott; recording secretary; A. L. Bingham; corresponding Secretary, Perry Joslin; Treasurer, A. Ferguson; Executive Committee, John Leidlein, Norman Little, John Gallagher, A. L. Rankin and Moses Fournia.

Wealthy Fox cautioned persons about buying a certain property in East Saginaw to which she held title, from John Moore of Saginaw City or Henry A. Graves of New York City.

February 29, 1856.

MARRIED. At Cassapolis, on the 25th inst, by Rev. Eli Taylor, Mr. Thomas Whitney of East Saginaw to Miss Mary L. Clark, of Cornwall Bridge, Connecticut.

MARRIED. At Pontiac, on the 26th inst, by the Rt. Rev. Samuel A. McCoskry, Col. W. L. P. Little of East Saginaw to Sarah E. Sherman of Perry, NY.

March 7, 1856.

Executors Sale, in the matter of William Barie, deceased; land in Tuscola was to be sold at public auction; dated Jan 3, 1856 by Ann E. Barie and Francis T. Hall, executors.

Guardian's sale: Hugh Quin, minor; auction of property; James H.C. Blades, guardian.

March 21, 1856

B. F. Fisher of the Fisher Mill, Zilwaukie, was ready to contract for sawing. The Foundry and Machine Shop of G. W. Merrill was set up and fitted out.

Spirit of the Times mentioned that Dr. Birney had an egg of nearly 8 inches in circumference, while Alex Ferguson had one nearly as large. Republicans in Saginaw City organized with the following officers: President, Jay Smith; Vice Presidents, W. Packard and T T Battell; Recording Secretary, H. S. Penoyer; Treasurer, G. W. Bullock; Corresponding Secretaries, A. S. Gaylord and D. F. Mitchell. MARRIED. In this village, on the 19th inst, by Rev. S. Clements, Jr, Mr. Irwin Warner of Chardon, OH, to Miss Laura E.
