Programs in Review

At the meeting of 14 October 1985, Lynn Clark discussed the development of Ontario from 1600 to the 1900s. He gave a geography lesson and explained land and soil conditions as a basis of settlement through the years. He noted that the first settlers were Indians, of course, in three main groups-Hurons, Algonquins and Ojibways. Champlain was the first explorer to arrive in the Great Lakes area from the East and Henry Hudson from the James and Hudson Bay Area. The first missionaries were Catholic and the French built the fur-trading business for which the area was famous. Much of the land was opened by settlers who obtained land by barter or sale from Indians or by Crown grant; they were also required to provide a reserve army for the British. Prior to 1858, the only records are in church or, in some cases, local records. After 1858-1869 period, county registers were started. Usually marriage records are available from this period and most provincial records date from this period. Birth and death records are not to consistent.

Charles F. Hoover, director of the Historical Society of Saginaw County provided the program for 11 November 1985 when he spoke on the Society's holdings, purpose and future. Chuck started out by mentioning the upcoming deer season, with a hunting camp, founded by Saginaw people. He detailed the five divisions of the Historical Society. 1. The Archaeological Division is to better acquaint the community with pre-history. Many of the stone artifacts can be examined for clues as to uses, culture, of the peoples of the area. The Historical Society has the only private archaeological repository in the midwest. 2. Living History Division-Company E, Michigan 23rd Infantry, "Saginaw Braves", trained and bivouaced near the present water works on the east side. They have also formed the Saginaw Brigade-fur trading voyageurs-for an annual presentation during the summer. He noted that French maps of 1688 shows a cross-state waterway, which presumably could be used for transportation across the state. 3. Historical Museum. He stated that it was the finest in Michigan and has been kept up to date, despite funding problems. It serves as a repository for historical artifacts. It is also a historic photograph repository for the county, as well as providing a repository for maps of the area. 4. Activities. Money Making Division. This division is presently

pushing a Sawmill Theme Park as one means of bringing historical lumbering days to the present-day residents of the area. 5. Preservation Division. This division works with property owners to preserve buildings, historic sites, and homes.

Record Book of Pioneer Fire Company Number 1,

Sect. 4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a record of the proceedings of the company, of all fires, alarms, parades, and meetings of the Company, to keep a correct roll of the Company, to call the same after every fire or alarm of fire, and at every meeting, precisely at the hour appointed for such a meeting, and at its close; to keep a file of all papers relative to the business of the Company; to notify members of the meetings of the Company; all candidates elected of their election as members of the Company; and all members of Committees of their appointment; to furnish the Treasurer a correct list of all absentees, and all fines; to see that every newly elected member is furnished with a copy of the Constitution and Bye-Laws; to report to the proper officers of the Fire Department the names and dates of election of members of the Company, and to perform all other duties pertaining to the office, and such as a majority of the Company or the Foreman may direct. And he shall also assist the Treasurer, and perform his duties in case of his absence; shall also report to the Company at the annual meeting, the number of the members of the Company at the time; the number of withdrawals and additions since the last report; a report of all fires and alarms, and such other things as concern the welfare of the Company; and shall, also, perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Constitution of the Fire Department.

Sect. 5. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to collect all fines and dues; to keep a correct account with each member of the Company; to pay all bills and accounts when ordered by the Company and countersigned by the Foreman, to render a correct account of all moneys received and disbursed at each semi-annual meeting, in October and April, or when ordered by the Company, and also at every regular meeting of the amount due from each member. He shall also assist the Secretary, and perform his duties in case he is absent.

(Pioneer Fire Company #1, continued)

- Sect. 6. It shall be the duty of the Hose Captain to see that the Carriage and Hose are kept in good condition, and in readiness at all times, and shall command the Hose Company when on duty; but in all cases, the Hose Captain, and Hose Company, are to abide by the command of the Foreman. Such Hose Department being under the jurisdiction, and subject to all the penalties of the Constitution and Bye-Laws of Pioneer Fire Company; provided no person shall be eligible to the office of Hose Captain unless he shall be a member of Pioneer Hose Company.
- Sect. 7. It shall be the duty of the Trustees to represent the Company in the Board of Trustees of the Fire Department, and make reports of the same to the Company in writing.

Article IV-Removal of Officers.

- Sect. 1. If any officer shall neglect his duties, pervert his office, or disturb the peace and good order of the Company, his conduct may be a matter of complaint. Every complaint must be made in writing and signed by at least six members of the Company, and filed with the Secretary at the regular meeting.
- Sect. 2. If said complaint be entertained by a majority of the Company, a Committee of five shall be appointed, who shall impartially hear and try said officer to the end that justice may be done him. Every member having a knowledge of the case may be examined by said Committee.
- Sect. 3. The Committee shall report their decision. If said report sustains the complaint, the offender may be punished by a fine or dismission from office, at the option of a majority of the Company. If said complaint be not sustained, it shall be dismissed and so entered upon the record.

Article V-Membership.

- Sect. 1. All members of the Company shall be citizens of East Saginaw; shall be eighteen years of age or over; shall be of good moral character and temperate habits; and shall follow some reputable business or profession.
- Sect. 2. Every candidate for membership shall be proposed by a member at a regular meeting. At the next regular meeting thereafter, a ball ballot shall be taken upon the application, and if not more than four black balls appear against him, and he shall pay unto the Treasurer of the Company the sum of fifty cents, sign the Constitution and Bye-Laws, and make application for admission into the Department within sixty days thereafter, he shall be declared a member of the Company.
- Sect. 3. Any person may become an honorary member of the Company, with all the privileges of the Company, if elected as such, as directed in Sects. 1 and 2, Art. 5, by paying into the treasury \$5 in advance, every year of membership, for the legal term of a fireman; after which he shall be an honorary member, without further dues.

Sect. 4. The Company may elect proper persons honorary members of the Company, who shall not be subject to fines or dues, but who shall have all the privileges of the Company, except that of voting and being eligible to office.

Article VI-Duties of Members.

It shall be the duty of every member of the Company, immediately upon an alarm of fire, to repair to the Engine House, unless he shall know that the Engine has left the House, in which case he shall join it as soon as possible, and use his best exertions in working the same, and in the discharge of such other duties as may be assigned him by the officer in command; and he shall obey all orders of such officer, and shall not leave the Engine unless ordered, or by permission, until the Engine shall be returned to the House. He shall also attend all meetings of the Company, and use all proper efforts to promote its welfare.

Article VII-Expulsion of Members.

Sect. 1. Any member who shall neglect his duties, or disturb the peace and good order of the Company, shall, upon a motion sustained by two-thirds of the members present at a regular meeting, be expelled.

Sect. 2. When the dues or fines of any member shall amount to the sum of two dollars, it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to give him notice thereof in writing; and if the same be not paid within one month from the service of said notice, or a valid excuse for their non-payment be given, he shall no longer be considered a member of the Company, and his name shall be stricken from the roll.

Sect. 3. Any member who shall be in arrears to the Company for fines or dues, on the first Wednesday in October, shall not be allowed to vote at the election of officers, or on any question that may be before the Company, or be eligible to office.

Article VIII-Withdrawal of Members.

Sect. 1. Any member may withdraw from the Company by making application in writing, and producing a certificate from the Treasurer that he is clear of all fines and dues.

Article IX-Property.

All furniture, books, and other property purchased by the Company, shall belong to the Company, and be kept at the Engine House; and every person expelled, or who may withdraw from the Company, shall forfeit all interest in the same.

Article X-Uniform.

It shall be the duty of every member to obtain a uniform, as follows: a red shirt, black patent leather belt, properly lettered, and a hat or cap, as may be determined by resolution of the Company, and a pair of white and a pair of black pantaloons. He shall also within thirty days after his election report himself fully equipped to the Secretary.

(Pioneer Fire Company #1, continued)

Article XI-Meetings

- Sect. 1. There shall be a regular meeting of the Company on the first Wednesday of every month, and the hour of regular meetings shall be at eight o'clock P.M., from April to September, (both inclusive;) and at seven o'clock P.M., from October to March, (both inclusive.)
- Sect. 2. The foreman shall call a special meeting at any time he may deem necessary, or upon a written requisition, signed by at least six members of the Company.
- Sect. 3. The Secretary shall give each member written notice of all special meetings, at least twelve hours before the time of meeting.
- Sect. 4. At any meeting of the Company, duly called, ten members shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

Article XII-Appropriations.

No funds shall be appropriated, or paid out of the Treasury, unless by a two-thirds vote of the members present at a regular meeting.

Article XIII-Assessments.

An assessment may be levied upon all the members equally, at any special or stated meeting, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

Article XIV-Admission of Expelled Members

No person expelled from any other Company shall be admitted a member of this Company. No person expelled from this Company shall be re-admitted, unless he shall receive the unanimous vote of the members present at a regular meeting after one month's notice shall have been given.

Article XI-Amendments and Alterations of the Constitution.

- Sect. 1. The Constitution may be amended, altered, or revised by a vote of two-thirds of all the members of the Company.
- Sect. 2. All amendments, alterations or revisions shall be made in writing and proposed to the Company one month previous to the vote being taken on their final adoption.

BYE-LAWS

Rule I-Order of Business

At the hour appointed, the meeting shall proceed to business.

Rule II-The order of business shall be as follows;

1. Roll Call
2. Reading the minutes of previous meeting.
3. Collection of fines and hearing excuses.
4. Offering Petitions and Resolutions
5. Reports of Committees and Officers
6. Unfinished and Miscellaneous business.
7. Admission of Members.
8. Election of Officers
9. Appointment of Committees for ensuing month.
10. Roll Call.

Rule III.

(Pioneer Fire Company #1, continued)

Every member about to speak shall rise and address himself to the presiding officer, confine himself to the subject before the Company, and avoid all personalities.

Rule IV.

When two or members shall rise at the same time, the Chair shall name the member to whom precedence shall be given.

Rule V.

If an appeal be made from the decision of the Chair, the presiding officer shall put the following question: "Shall the appeal be heard?", which shall be decided without debate.

Rule VI.

When a question is put by the Chair, every member shall vote, unless the Company for special reasons, shall excuse him.

Rule VII.

The yeas and nays shall be called upon the requisition of the Chair, or of any member.

Rule VIII.

If a division of the House be called for, the Secretary shall count the number voting upon either side, and the result shall be announced by the Chair.

Rule IX.

When a motion has been made and decided upon, it shall be in order for any member of the majority to move, at the same or the first succeeding meeting for a reconsideration thereof, but no discussion of the main question shall be allowed.

Rule X.

When a question is under debate, no motion shall be in order, except to adjourn, to lay on the table, for the previous question, to postpone, to commit or to amend; which several motions shall have precedence in the order in which they are arranged.

Rule XI.

Motions to lay on the table or for the previous question shall be taken without debate.

Rule XII.

When the previous question is called, all further debate upon the main question shall be precluded until it is decided.

Rule XIII.

All motions shall be reduced to writing when requested by the Chair, or by any member of the Company.

Rule XIV.

When a member is called to order, he shall immediately take his seat unless permitted by the Chair to explain.

Rule XV.

Any question may be discussed in Committee of the Whole, the presiding officer appointing a Chairman, who shall report to him on the rise of the Committee its decision, which shall be entered in the minutes. (to be continued)

Bible Records

GROH FAMILY

This Bible is currently in the possession of the Frankenmuth Historical Association; the transcription from it was forwarded by Mary Nuechterlein, Registrar of the Association, with a request as to whether it might be a local family. The Bible was published in Philadelphia by Kimber & Sharpless without date, but probably printed before 1850, written in German. It was purchased at an estate sale several years and passed through several hands before its donation to the Frankenmuth Historical Association.

May 16, 1856.

A Shot-About 10 o'clock on Wednesday evening of last week, Mr. Norman Miller, of Saginaw City, was shot at through his window, while about retiring to bed. The gun was loaded with buckshot. The perpetrator of this reckless attempt was not discovered. It was supposed to be some one affected by the liquor prosecutions.

Liquor Suit-Last week suits were tried against Hugo Wiesener, Peter Bauer and Joseph Halstead, for selling liquor, against the provisions of the law. The suits were instituted on the complaint of Rev. Mr. Miller and E. Newell before Justice A. S. Gaylord. In each case the defendants were found guilty and fined \$10 and costs.
