Bakle, speaking on Genealogical Sources in the United States and Canada and on Migration Patterns. She will also be the speaker at an Early Bird Special, on Friday, April 18, 1986 at Frankenmuth High School, 525 E Genesee from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. discussing "People Who Made Their Living from the Seas and Water Ways".

Dr Bakle is president and founder of The Genealogical Institute, Salt Lake City and is a professional genealogist of more than twenty years experience. She has a wide experience in field research, having used manuscript collections in most state archives and many university and private libraries.

She holds both MA and PhD degrees in history, an associate degree in nursing and has attended the Newberry Library Community and Local History Workshop. She is one of the founders and original trustees of the Association of Professional Genealogists, serving as president, editor of the APG Newsletter & Green Sheet and currently edits Research News, Ancestors on the Move and Immigrant Origins the last two with John Cerny. She is also the co-author of Family History for Fun and Profit, Woods Cross: Patterns and Profiles of a City and is general editor of the award-winning The Source: A Guidebook for American Genealogy. Her newest book is Ancestry's Guide to Research, a manual on how-to.

Dr Bakle was a consultant to the Bureau of the Census in 1980 and a featured speaker at more than 300 seminars and workshops in the United States and Canada, including the world Conference on Records and the annual National Genealogical Society Conferences in the States.

Be sure to set aside Saturday, April 19, 1986 so that you can experience this very rewarding day with your fellow genealogists. Please turn out and do yourselves a favor by taking in this very wonderful speaker, not to mention the delicious luncheon and fine displays.

## THE NEW-FANGLED MARRIAGE LAW

*Gladiwin County Record, September 2, 1887*

After September 27, getting married will be rather serious business in Michigan, as the license law then takes effect. The Bay City Press says that the man will be expected to subscribe to an affidavit stating his age, color, size of his head, depth of his pocket, residence, habits as to staying out late at night, how much he owes for board and washing, how many wives he has alive, how much he spends for beer and cigars, what his income or salary is and whether he expects to live after his marriage with his father-in-law. The affidavit must also set forth the exact age of his intended bride, the color of her hair if she has any, the size of her feet, birthplace, residence, occupation, parents' names, how many times she has been married, how many husbands she has alive, what she expects from her father, and whether she

expects her mother to live with her after marriage. These affidavits are to be filed with the county clerk, before he can grant a license to marry. We haven't seen the form of affidavit supplied to the county clerk, but in the above description have tried to cover all important points of interest to the public in regard to the marriage of two persons.

Notice is hereby given that there will be Meeting of the persons of full age of the Townships of Saginaw, Thomsstown and Tittabawassee, residents of the region adjacent to the Tittabawassee River, on Monday evening at 7 o'clock, Jan. 11th, 1864, at the Ure Schoolhouse for the purpose of agreeing upon and signing Articles of Association and organizing a Presbyterian Society and Corporation pursuant to the Laws of this State and of electing a suitable number of persons as Trustees to take charge of the property belonging to and transacting the affairs relative to the temporalities of said Society.

Know all men by these presents, THAT we whose names are herunto subscribed being persons of full age and desirous of forming ourselves into a Presbyterian Society under and by virtue of the Statutes of the State of Michigan—Hereby agree to the following Articles of Association for that purpose:

Article 1st. This Association shall be called the First Presbyterian Society of the Township of Saginaw in the State of Michigan.

Article 2nd. This Association shall elect Six Trustees who shall be called "The Board of Trustees of the First Presbyterian Society of the Township of Saginaw"; one Third of whom shall be elected each year at the annual meeting which shall be held on the Third Monday of January in each year hereafter.

Article 3rd. Immediately after the first Election, they shall be divided by lot, into three Classes, the first class to hold Office one year, the second Class two years and the third Class three years, according to the Statute in such case provides.

Article 4th. This Society shall for the present be connected with the Presbytery of Saginaw and the Synod of Michigan.

Article 5th. At such annual Meeting of the Society and Board of Trustees shall make a full report of all Receipts and Disbursements during the preceding year and of all the temporal affairs of the Society.

Article 6th. It shall be the duty of said Board of Trustees to see that the Financial matters of the Society relating to the Preaching of the Gospel shall be settled Quarterly with the Minister and a Receipt taken at that settlement.

Article 7th. These Articles shall not be changed, except at an Annual Meeting and by vote of Two-thirds of the members present entitled to vote, notice of the same having been given in the call for the meeting.

Ripley, said Trustees and their successors in Office to be forever known and called "The Board of Trustees of the First Presbyterian Society of the Township of Saginaw".

Immediately after the Election of said Board of Trustees, they were divided into three classes as the Statute provides of which Alexander McBratnie and Thomas C. Ripley form the first Class to hold their Office for one year; Thomas Parker and Benjamin McClellan form the second Class to hold their Office two years, and Robert Ure and Daniel Fraser form the third Class to hold their Office three years.

**Rule XVI.**

Every report, whether from a Select or Standing Committee, shall be made in writing.

**Rule XVII**

An Auditing Committee, to consist of three persons, shall be appointed to hold their office one year, whose duty it shall be to examine and audit, if correct, the annual report of the Treasurer, and report on all accounts, and such other matters as may be referred to them.

**Rule XVIII.**

The officer in command shall give all orders through his Trumpet when on duty.

**Rule XIX.**

Every member shall pay strict attention to, and obey the orders of the Foreman and Assistants. Any violation of this Bye-Law shall subject the offender to expulsion from the Company.

**Rule XX.**

No private member shall give any order except under the direction of the proper officer; and the members are hereby pledged to each other to sustain their officers in the discharge of their duties, and to discountenance all improper conduct in any member.

**Rule XXI.**

No noisy, profane, or abusive language, or any disorderly conduct going to, or returning from fires, or on turn out days, or at any meeting of the Company, shall be allowed under a penalty of fifty cents.

**Rule XXII.**

Any member may appeal from the imposition of fines, to the Company; provided he does so at the next regular meeting at which he is present after the fines are imposed, and in case of neglect to do so shall not be entitled to any exemption.

**Rule XXIII.**

Any member leaving the room at any meeting shall be fined at the discretion of the Company, unless permission be given him by the presiding officer.

Any member who shall leave the Engine, at a fire, more than one length of Hose, shall be fined 25 cents, and any member who shall leave the Engine more than one length of hose when at exercise or drill, shall be fined 12 1/2 cents. Any officer for neglect of duty shall be fined one dollar.

Any member absent from a fire or from an alarm shall be fined one dollar, except a reasonable excuse be given.

Any member absent from the semi-annual Review of the Department, shall be fined one dollar, unless a valid excuse be given.

Any member absent on days of exercise and drill shall be fined 25 cents, or 12 1/2 at either roll call.

Any member absent from a regular or special meeting of the Company, shall be fined 25 cents, if absent from either roll call 12 1/2 cents.

Rule XXIV.

A Committee of three shall be appointed at each monthly meeting, Foreman and Secretary excepted, whose duty it shall be to keep Engine, Engine House, and Apparatus in good order during the month for which they are appointed. The person first named on the Committee shall be Chairman, and it shall be his duty to report to the Company any neglect of duty on the part of any member of the Committee. This Committee shall be selected by taking the names on the roll in order as they stand on the roll. Any member of this Committee who shall neglect his duty shall be fined one dollar, unless a valid excuse be given.

Rule XIV.

No excuse shall be valid, except sickness or absence from the city, unless approved of by two-thirds of the members present.

Rule XVI.

A Bye-Law may be suspended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present.--Any alteration or amendment of the Bye-Laws shall be proposed in writing at a regular meeting, and shall lay over until the next regular meeting, when it may be adopted by a two-thirds vote.

Rule XVII.

If any member shall communicate the proceedings of any meeting to persons not members of the Company, he shall be fined one dollar or be liable to expulsion from the Company.

Rule XIII.

No Spirituous Liquors shall at any time be brought into the Engine House, nor shall any of the Money of the Company be used or appropriated at any time for the purchase of Spirituous Liquors to be used as a beverage.
