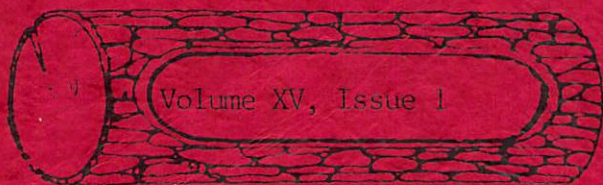

BROWNE, William H. 1861-5 Rank Pvt. Co. "I" 6 Maine Inf. 6 Army Corps 1st Division Died April 25, 1922 age 81 Buried April 27, 1922 Lots 5,6,7, blk 23, Private marker with Military inscription.

May 30, 1856

Died-May 24th, in the Village of Chessening in this county, Aurelia L., wife of James B. Terry, and daughter of John W. Turner, aged 31 years.

New Post Office established at Blumfield, in this county; George F. Veenfliet was postmaster. It was on the new mail route from Lower Saginaw via Vassar and Goodrichville (Richville?).

Probate Notice-In the matter of the Estate of Dr. George Davis, deceased, on May 12, 1856., H. L. Miller administrator of estate.

June 6, 1856

Dredging the river; We have at last a tangible hope that something will be done towards dredging the river. Norman Little, Esq., to whose enterprise, public spirit and energy, this valley is already greatly indebted, has so far recovered his health as to be able to take hold of the matter.

Married-May 25th, at the home of William Giberson, in the Township of Mt. Morris, Genesee Co., by F. Walker, Esq., Charles Lytle of East Saginaw, to Melissa M. Barger of the same place.

At Caryville, Genesee Co., NY, Thursday morning, May 20th, by Rev. Mr. Fithiah, Dr. Jay S. Curtis of this village, to Miss Elsie V. Bogart of the former place.

Died-In this village, on the 3d inst., Mrs. Lucy Brown, wife of Peter Brown, aged 32 years.

June 20, 1856

An ordinance concerning highway labor was enacted by the East Saginaw Village Council on June 2, 1856; signed by Morgan L. Gage, President and Charles B. Nott, recorder.

36 cargoes of lumber were shipped from Saginaw during May; names of ships, mills given.

Ordinance relating to pound keepers, fence viewers, etc., plus another ordinance relative to disorderly persons were passed by the village council; June 12th, 1856 and May 29th, 1856, respectively.

Chester B. Jones sued, got writ of attachment against property of Amos Miner.

June 11, 1858

Dr. J. K. Penney, physician and surgeon, was in business, having recently arrived from the city of Hudson, Columbia Co., NY, where he had practiced medicine for many years.

Christian Reitter of Blumfield, 11 Jul, 1856, advertised that his wife, Doris, left his house two years earlier, without his consent; he gave notice that she must return within four weeks, or he would not receive her or acknowledge her as his wife; also gave notice not to harbor her; said Doris was then residing at Sable River, claiming that she is not a married woman.

July 18, 1856

An ordinance relative to sidewalks and cross walks passed by the village council, 14 June 1856. Another ordinance relative to the use of streets and alleys was passed 23 June 1856.

New Post Offices; The following new post offices have been established in this county within a few weeks, viz: Jay PO, Jefferson Jaquith, PM; Tittabawassee Post Office, John B. Hughes; Blumfield Post Office, F. VanFliet; Bridgeport Centre, James Abrams, appointed postmaster in place of S. W. Smith.

We regret to learn that Capt. Pierce's steam tug was sunk in the bay, in 12 feet of water, Sunday night. She was run into by a vessel. The tug will soon be raised.

August 15, 1856

The German Republicans of Saginaw County met the prior Thursday at Fremont Hall; committees appointed: for Saginaw City, Dr. M. C. T. Plessner, Mr. Schulz and Mr. Moeller; East Saginaw, Messrs. Springer, Leidlein and Koehler; s/s (southside?), J. Schoen.

The second term of the Union School closed August 1st; at the program, singers were Misses Lucy Nelson and Ellen Varner; an original composition by Misses Emma E. Stearns, Ellen F. Varner, Lucy M. Nelson, Kitty Sherwood and Helen M. Disbrow; Miss Estella Varner delivered a valedictory; Miss Sarah M. Beaman was assistant teacher to Mrs. Stearns.

September 5, 1856

Application was to be made to the Board of Supervisors of this county at its next session, for the organization of a new township in this county, to be called Frankentrost.

Notice was also given that application was to be made to the Board of Supervisors of Saginaw County next October for a new town to be set off and organized, bearing the name of Portsmouth; signed August 15, 1856 by Martin Powell, Charles G. Southworth, Ira M. Rinny, William Daglish, Gottfried Knatch, Medor Tromble, J. Bird, J. M. Miller, Benjamin Bird, Robert Kerns, Joseph F. Marsac, Louis Henzmann, George P. Sholl, C. Mix, E. P. Welch. A brown horse, pledged to John H. Elsifer and William Walker by

Martin Mannion as security against payment of certain claims, was to be sold at auction on September 13, 1856.

October 3, 1856

Sutton, County Clerk; John Parrish, Jr., Register of Deeds; Judge of Probate, DeWitt C. Gage; Sheriff, Willard Packard; Circuit Court Commissioner, William J. Loveland; County Treasurer, Charles Post; Prosecuting Attorney, Stephen P. Wright; Surveyor, D. A. Pettibone; Coroners, Octavius Thompson and Dr. William J. Cranage. Stephen P. Wright of Lower Saginaw was a graduate of Hamilton College, NY and a member of that state's bar.

The names of those nominated on the democratic slate had been announced the preceding week, but were repeated: Representative, George Lord; Prosecuting Attorney, John Moore; Sheriff, Charles W.
