

PROGRAMS IN REVIEW by Leland R. Watrous

Our meeting of January 12, 1987, began with the presentation of a two-voume set of books, given by President Roy Allen to Anna Mae Maday, representing the Saginaw Public Library.

The membership list of the First Baptist Church of Saginaw, from 1853 to 1908, compiled by Chester Bocker and typed by Fred Pike, was presented by Chet and accepted by President Allen.

The highlight of the evening was a video tape presentation of the Sesquicentennial Pioneer Certificate Project, purchased by our Society and shown to interested gatherings throughout the area. This project is sponsored by the Library of Michigan and the Michigan Genealogical Council, and was viewed by those present and approved. The program noted the primary and secondary sources of the proof acceptable to the project committee. In addition, the presentation went through the application for the Pioneer Certificate Project.

The 9 February 1987 regular meeting found speaker Ron Putz of Bay City explaining his interest in the German language and his three trips to Germany for his own family history. He gave the history of German script from early times to the present. The current script is more legible with the modernization which has taken place over the years. The old spelling rules also made translation of that script very difficult. At times, Latin was also used, interspersed with the German, until the late 1800s. The first record-keeping was made mandatory in Germany on 1 January 1876, so that before that date, there may be gaps, depending on whether the records are from a civil source or churches.

Ron went through the German alphabet, pronouncing the letters, then gave out handouts, explaining the German characters, pointing out the characteristics of the letters and those that were likely to give problems. He noted that written material from two hundred years ago can often not be translated except by a person who has studied the writer's writing over a period of time. He answered many questions from the full room and explained the meanings and usages of German words and spelling.

Starting off the regular meeting of March 9, 1987, was a presentation to the Saginaw Public Library of a directory of the Scottish Settlers in North America, as well as volumes of Seventeenth Century Colonial Ancestors, Early Kentucky Tax Records and the final volume of the Irish Famine Immigrants.

Notice was also given of the publication by our society of the First Land Purchasers of Saginaw County; this has been sent to the printer and should be ready about April 1st, well before the annual seminar, to be held April 25th at the Frankenmuth Bavarian Inn.

Donna Hodge introduced our speaker for the evening, a descendant of an early settler of the Frankenmuth area, Anita Boldt, curator of the St. Lorenz Church museum.

Anita said she was a third generation German, as she introduced her subject to the group. She passed around copies of several church records of the Campau family, the earliest of the Frankenmuth records, and related some very interesting stories of

that family.

Anita showed a number of documents she had copied and gave some pointers in the translation of those documents. She noted that a couple of Frankenmuth residents went back to Germany to find the previous history of the Frankenmuth settlers' families and made some tremendous research finds through old records.

She also showed some Austrian records of the Wissmueller family, along with a family tree, reaching back to the 1500s. One of the members present, responded that she was a Wissmueller and just hit the jackpot with that family tree presentation. A question and answer period followed, in which many points were brought up for discussion.

Meeting of citizens of Saginaw City was held at the Webster House on Saturday evening last, H. S. Penoyer presiding; Jay Smith, Secretary, regarding the Amboy, Lansing and Traverse Bay Railroad.

At the Common Council held on Monday, March 16, 1857, L. H. Keeler was elected Marshall and William F. Hoyt as clerk.

March 27, 1857

At a meeting of the Midland County Board of Supervisors, held March 19, 1857, Timothy Jerome of Saginaw was awarded the contract for building a court house for Midland.

Died-In Bast Saginaw, on the 14th inst., of Dropsy, Emma B. Goulding, infant daughter of William S. & Olive A. Goulding, aged ten months and 16 days.

The Republican caucus met at Buena Vista Hall on Wednesday afternoon and nominated the following ticket for township officers: Supervisors, Morgan L. Gage; Township Clerk, Edwin A. Moore; Treasurer, Villiam F. Glasby; Justice of the Peace, William J. Loveland; Highway Commissioners, John Leidlein, full term; William Wadsworth to fill vacancy; Overseers of Poor, L. H. Eastman and B. Eggleston; Constables, A. Dann, --- Bates, Stephen Fall, Harvey Smith.

April 3, 1857

Fixtures and furniture for the land office had arrived; Moses B. Hess was Register and Col. W. L. P. Little was receiver. April 10, 1857

Narried-In East Saginaw, on Sunday, March 29th, by D. McIntyre, Esq., Mr. Daniel J. Cole to Miss Sarah A. Oliver, all of East Saginaw.

Our enterprising and somewhat enthusiastic townsman, Curtis Emerson, Esq., proposes to put in operation during the coming season, a steam ferry, to ply between the upper part of this village and Saginaw City, and is now in negotiation with the Council in reference to a license; Rev. V. C. Smith, pastor of the Congregational Church and Presbyterian Church of Lapeer was to preach at the Methodist Church of East Saginaw the next Sunday.

The following township officers were elected at the Annual Township Meeting in East Saginaw: Supervisor, Moses B. Hess; Township Clerk, A. J. Phillips; Justice of the Peace, Charles O. Garrison; Treasurer, Villiam F. Glasby; Highway Commissioners, John Leidlein, full term; Frank A. Curtis to fill vacancy; School Inspector, Chester B. Jones; Constables Adomiram Dann, Stephen Fall, Albert Bates, Harvey Smith; Overseers of the Poor, L. H. Eastman, B. Eggleston; Dr. R. H. Steel was appointed Notary Public.
