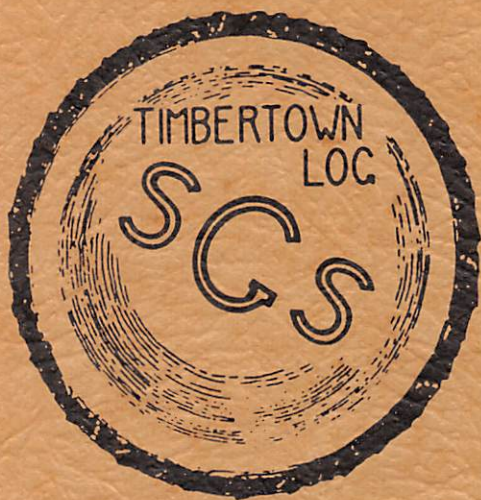
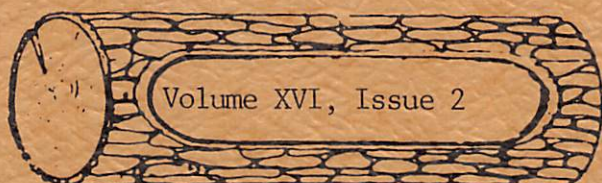

July 31, 1857

On Sunday afternoon last, between 3 & 4 o'clock, pm, a fire broke out in the warehouse of Beach and Moores, in this village; in less than an hour after the discovery of the fire, the roofs and

walls of the block had fallen; Beach & Moores were insured more than sufficient to cover their loss; building was owned by Jesse Hoyt, Esq., of NY and uninsured. Judge Josiah Turner was presiding over an unusually large number of circuit court cases, most of them contested wills.

August 7, 1857

Ten boats had arrived during a one week period and 6 the previous week.

Formation of a booming company on the Cass River was planned on October 1st to determine articles of association and elect directors of the company; subscribers were Wright & Cooper, Michael Jeffers, William Friend, Hess & Brothers, F. P. Sears, J. H. Richardson, Humphrey Shaw, Adoniram Dann, E. J. Mershon and Thomas Whitney; Z. W. Wright, who signed the notice also requested the attendance of Messrs Remick & Merrill, Edmunds and North, Martin, Watrous, Baldwin & Slafter, E. W. Perry, William A. Heartt, John G. Hubinger, E. G. Allen and others.

A little child of Thomas O'Hara, which fell from Cushing & Co's Dock into the river on Thursday, was saved by Thomas Foster, who quickly jumped in and caught the child, though unable to swim himself. Foster's cries brought aid to the spot and both were drawn up, though not until he was much exhausted in his efforts to keep above water.

August 14, 1857

Died-At the Farm House, East Saginaw, Monday, August 10, Henry Mortimer, son of Mr. & Mrs. J. H. Elsiffer, aged 3 months.

At Bangor Mills on Sunday morning, the 9th inst., Mrs. Laura M., wife of Leander H. Barrington, aged 41 years. The deceased, with her husband, came to this State about twenty years ago, from the township of Poland, Chautauqua Co., NY.

August 21, 1857

Mr. D. A. Pettibone had just completed a map of Saginaw and Tuscola Counties, and a part of Midland Co., representing every section of land in each township, and all the streams.

17 boats had arrived the previous week.

The Village of St. Charles was a new and promising village at the Forks of the Bad River. Also on the route of the Amboy, Lansing and Traverse Bay Railroad. J. T. Burnham had a steam saw mill near there and Frost and Bradley had a steam saw mill and shingle mill; three stores-Frost & Bradley, Mr. O. Doty and Mr. Oliver. One hotel kept by O. Doty, other by Mr. Hunt.

S. M. Holden, formerly of Saginaw, was shot and robbed of \$500 at Ann Arbor on Tuesday evening last. He came in from Detroit on the night train.

Emerson's Steam Ferry was then in successful operation.

August 28, 1857

Anthony Schmitz of Blumfield was agent for the sale of agricultural implements.

September 11, 1857

The *Magnet* was captained by George Stewart.

We learn that Charles L. Richman, one of the early settlers and well known citizens of Saginaw City, died on Sunday morning last. His health had been feeble for some time.

Stevens, John Old, Alonzo Taylor, Robert Hadden, D. McDonnell and A. Burt.

October 23, 1857

Dr. A. H. Crawford, Dentist, had taken the dental rooms formerly occupied by A. D. Lacy in Saginaw City.

October 30, 1857

A petition of Joel Draper and others prayed for the organization of Fremont Township, presented to the Saginaw County Board of Supervisors, October 12, 1857; the Township of Fremont was declared organized; petitions of R. Ure and others prayed that certain portions of the Township of Thomastown should be annexed to Saginaw Township; this was granted.

November 6, 1857

Attempted burglary on Tuesday evening of W. P. Patrick's Grocery Store.

Died-At Bridgeport, on Wednesday evening, at 10 o'clock after a painful illness of ten days, Edmund B. Bow, Esq., in his 64th year. Mr. Bow was one of the old settlers of Saginaw County -having resided here for the past 20 years-and a much respected citizen.

Foote was chairman of the chairman of the board of district canvassers; they determined that Augustine S. Gaylord beat out Robert Ure for representative in the State Legislature's first district.

Obituary-James G. Birney died at Eaglewood, NJ, November 25th. He was born in 1793 at Danville, Kentucky. His father, a native of Ireland, was a man whose enterprise had accumulated wealth, which, employed with generosity, conferred upon him popularity and social position. His mother was a beautiful and an accomplished American lady of the name of Reed.

At the age of 19, 2 years after graduation at Nassau Hall, NJ, Mr. Birney became a student in the office of Mr. Dallas at Philadelphia. Returning to his native state in 1814, he commenced the practice of law and at age of 22 was chosen a member of the legislature. He also served in the legislature of Alabama. When he was 22, he was married to a lady of distinguished family. Just before the death of his father, his

wife died, the mother of 11 children. In 1841, he married the sister-in-law of Hon. Gerritt Smith, a lady of the family of Fitzhugh, who survives him. During the last 12 years he has suffered from several attacks of paralysis, which were aggravated by hear disease.
