

## PROGRAMS IN REVIEW

The regular meeting of 14 November 1988 found Merlin Allen, program chairman, introducing Ron Putz, who spoke on "Researching German Genealogy." He noted that he knew some of the topics he would talk about would be familiar to us, but that there was need for them to be repeated. Ron suggested that the German Research Association in San Diego, California, was very helpful but possibly they are not completely meshed with German genealogy. He showed several publications on German script and mentioned that the German Genealogical Digest is another very useful publication, although they do not answer questions. Both organizations welcome written articles. The German Genealogical Society of America is another good organization, although they are behind in publications, but will accept questions for publication but not answer letters. The Augustine Society also publishes a German genealogical section. The LDS church has the new International Genealogical Index on film and you may submit a name to them for their registry. Ernst Thode sells detailed maps of German and has authored an atlas of Germanic genealogy. It is easy to get information on present Germany, but not for the former Silesia, Posen, Pomerania., etc.; however, societies do exist for those areas. Dr Robert Ward, a frequent speaker at the Saginaw Genealogical Society's seminars, has published many good issues on German research. Palatines to America are also devoted to German genealogy.

The main source of information on Germany is through the church; the earliest civil records start in 1876. No Lutheran records were filmed due to disagreements with the LDS regarding filming. Land and tax books go back 400 years in the Salzburg area, about 200 years, otherwise. Ron has been informed that the Russian and Polish governments are planning on turning in documents relating to Germany. Many German communities have published church and civil histories and many records have been gathered in Leipzig in East Germany. Friends and relatives are a very great help in gathering information. Ron has suggested sending German stamps in the amount of two marks--the price of a stamp--which he has friends in Germany buy and send to him. He cautions that even German scholars cannot read the old script, especially the abbreviated records.

On 9 January 1989, we started off the new year with Peggy Lugthart, introduced by Jeanne White, speaking on "Migration Trails." Peggy began her talk by displaying a plate, which came to Michigan in 1838; this featured drawing from the New York state area. She stated that her ancestors started out in that area, migrated past the Erie Canal, to Buffalo and then on to Detroit and from there to the Ionia area. From there, the family walked from Ionia to Nawaygo and later to Mecosta county where they settled for many years. The back of the plate contains a listing of the names and dates of the owners. Peggy displayed an atlas of early railroad maps as an indication of the train routes, and talked and displayed other books which were available for specific areas. Many of those present had questions which were brought up and answered by those present, having specific

knowledge; Alice Schiesswohl was one of those adding additional input to the subject.
