



Records in Book #1 which are records from 1892 to 1902 appear to be an accounts receivable book due to the interpretation of the entries and amount. This is only an assumption on the part of a researcher as it seems to follow the pattern of old system of bookkeeping where the accounts payable were kept in the first section of a book and accounts receivable were started from the back of the same book.

Books 2-3-4 contained much more information. The format of this book is not exactly same as original but changed for easier reading in regards to the deceased. Where the list, Estate, Spouse, Guardian, etc., is given this may have been the person responsible for payment or the informant.

#### PROGRAMS IN REVIEW

Our regular meeting of 13 February 1989, found Dr. Richard Mudd, an international authority on Abraham Lincoln, speaking on the "Love Lives of John Wilkes Booth and his father. Dr. Mudd has spoken many times on President Lincoln, so he decided on an entirely new topic-the Booths.

Junius Brutus Booth, father of John Wilkes, was born in 1796 in London, England, and one of his earliest deeds was to get a servant girl pregnant when he was 13; at 17, another young lady fell prey to his efforts; at age 18 he became attached to a group of players, went to Belgium and married in 1815. In 1820, he met Mary Ann Holmes in England, fell in love and married her also, then sailed for America with her. He had ten children by her and after his (first) wife found out about it, she came to America and finally divorced him. Junius married, legally, on John Wilkes' 13th birthday, and died in 1885. Junius was a farmer, went to town with Mary Ann to sell his produce. Dr. Mudd told a number of anecdotes about Junius and his antics; among these was threatening, in 1835, the life of President Andrew Jackson and was also known as an alcoholic.

John Wilkes Booth showed promise as an actor early in life-he was good-looking, and very attractive to women. No one will ever know the number of women he loved and seduced. In 1859, he met Isola Martha Mills, who followed him from then on. Two children were born to them; John Wilkes then fell in love with Louise Worchester, owner of bawdy houses. After his death, she claimed that he had written to her, and published his letters in a book. At the time of the assassination, he was in love with Bessie Hale, a daughter of a Senator Hale. Robert Lincoln, the son of President Lincoln, was also in love with Bessie; it is supposed that possibly the jealousy between Booth and Robert Lincoln may have been a reason for the assassination. In addition to these women, he was also known to register at hotels with other women, most of whom could be identified. Had he lived longer, he just might have become one of the world's great actors. There is no proof of children by any of his paramours, although many have Mudd stated that any letter claimed this for a fact. Dr. written by John Wilkes Booth is worth far more than that of President Lincoln. Anybody who missed this program, missed a great chance to learn more about the Booths and also much information of historical significance.

On 13 March 1989, the society had the pleasure of listening to Jeanne White, one of our members, speaking on French-Canadian research. It almost seemed that everyone should go out and look for French-Canadian ancestors just to have the wonderful time which she portrayed to us.

Jeanne gave much background information on Canadian history-France ruled Canada many years and the politics of France had little influence in Canada. The nobles of France became interested in Canada only because of the money to be made by fur trading. The three early cities were Quebec, Three Rivers and Montreal; land was granted to Seigneurs, who in turn, recruited people to whom the land was given in return for rent and labor. Louis XIV took control of the colonies in 1663 and started

immigration to New France. The church was very influential in the area; their records were well kept and very helpful. Baptismal records give not only the parents and parishes, also the godparents. The church controlled the schools and taught only religion and classics; it was the center of the peoples' lives. The British took over in 1760, although the church still had considerable influence. Jeanne listed three problems for researchers:

- 1. Dit-names, which were occasionally adopted as a family name.
- 2. Many names have been anglicized, and thus changed from the original.
- People did a lot of moving from one parish to another.

The Hoyt library has many good references on Quebec families, which she has made good use of. Jeanne also noted that since she does not read or speak French, she had some problems that others might not be faced with, although she seems to have surmounted these problems by use of intelligence and effort. This was a MUST program for anybody interested in French-Canadian research.
