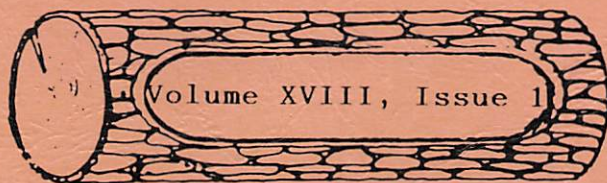

M. Hilsrad (Hiesrodt?); Taymouth, Henry S. Edget, Horace K. Sloan, T. F. Trumble; Zilwaukie, Charles Lewis, George Lewis, Benjamin F. Fisher; David H. Jerome, Darwin H. Pettibone and Charles T. Disbrow were elected state delegates and Morgan L. Gage, William H. Sweet and Augustus S. Gaylord, congressional delegates; Henry S. Edget, Benjamin F. Fisher, Thomas C. He had held several important positions in public life; having been a member of the Legislature from this county, and Postmaster at Saginaw City for thirteen years. His death is universally lamented, and throws a deep gloom over the community.

Frozen to death - On Monday afternoon last, Thomas O'Hara and his son James O'Hara, started from this place, each drawing a hand sled with a lot of Mill feed, on their way home at Swan Creek. On Tuesday morning they were found in the road, within two miles of home. Mr. O'Hara, the elder, had been employed in Whittier & Merrill's Mill and is spoken of as a faithful hand.
