

Morrioge Records - 1867-1882 SAGINAW COUNTY, MICHIGAN by Maxime E. Fishel Saginaw Chapter Chairman, NSDAR, March 31, 1987

When this marriage list was originally compiled and copied by Col. Mark Ireland in May 1950, all courthouse record numbers were omitted, and entries included only the month and day of marriage with the year typed in the upper left page corner. Marriages on the first page, dated 1867 were performed in 1868. Either some of the pages were lost, or the marriages for the year 1867 were not copied. After carefully checking every entry with the original record in the Courthouse in Saginaw, Michigan these dates were changed to correctly read 1868.

Many hours were spent searching through the 1867-1882 marriage records, and for accuracy and ease of use, wherever possible we have added the original record number to each marriage entry. An alphabetical surname index of the Bridegroom and Bride has been included.

This is a true copy of the typed copy of the records of Col. Mark Ireland. The only dates changed were verified in the original court house record books.

# Research Aids

RECORD BOOK OF PIONEER FIRE COMPANY NUMBER 1 East Saginaw, Michigan (Continued from Volume XVII, Issue 1, Page 22)

> Constitution and Bye Laws of Pioneer Fire Company No. 1 Adopted Novbr 3, 1858

> > Constitution Article I

Section 1. This Company shall be known as Pioneer Fire Co. No. 1.

Article II

Officers

Sec. 1. The officers of this Company shall consist of a Foreman, first and second assistant Foreman, Secretary, Treasurer, Foreman of Hose Company, & 2 Trustees.

Sec. 2. The officers shall be chosen by ballot and the candidate, having the majority of all the votes cast shall be declared duly elected.

Sec. 3. The officers of the Company shall be elected annually, on the first Wednesday of October, except the Trustees of the Fire Department, one of whom shall be elected on the second Monday in January of every year, to serve two Years—except the first year, when there shall be two elected, and to hold the office for one Year, and the other for two, to be decided by lot, which shall hold two years.

Sec. 4. In case any office become vacant, by the death, resignation or absence of the incumbent, the company shall, at their next regular meeting, proceed to fill said vacancy in the manner prescribed by Sec. 3.

Article III
Duties of Officers

It shall be the duty of the Foreman to preside at all meetings of the company, to direct and control at all Fires, parades, and elsewhere while on duty, and to exercise a general supervision over the affairs of the Company.

Sec. 2. In the absence of the Foreman, the First Assistant shall perform his duties; and in the absence of both, the second Assistant shall act as foreman.

Sec. 3. The Assistants shall be designated as First and Second, and they shall rank accordingly. It shall be the duty of the first Assistant to attend to the Engine and Hose on the days of Exercise and at Fires, under the direction of the Commanding Officer, and they shall perform such other duties as are designated in the Constitution and Bye Laws.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a record of the proceedings of the Company, of all fires, alarms, parades, and meetings of the Company, to keep a correct Roll of the Company, to call the same after every fire or alarm of fire and at every meeting precisely at the hour appointed for a meeting,

(Fire Company #1, continued) and at its close; to keep a file of all such papers relative to the business of the Company; to notify members of the meetings of the Company; all Candidates elected of their election as members the Company; and all members of Committees appointment; to furnish the Treasurer a correct list of all absentees, and all fines; to see that every newly elected member is furnished with a Copy of the Constitution and Bye Laws; report to the proper officer of the Fire Department the names and dates of Election of members of the Company and perform all other duties pertaining to the office, and such as a majority of the Company or the Foreman may direct. And he shall also assist the Treasurer and perform his duties in case of his absence; shall also report to the Company at the annual meeting the number of the members of the Company at the time; the number withdrawals, and additions since the last report; a report of all fires and alarms, and such other things as may concern the welfare of the Company; and shall, also, perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Constitution of the Fire Department.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to collect all dues and fines; to keep a correct account with each member of the Company; to pay all bills and accounts when ordered by the Company and countersigned by the Foreman; to render a correct account of all monies received and disbursed in each semi-annual meeting, in October and April, or when ordered by the Company, and alsoat every regular meeting of the amount due from each member. He shall also assist the Secretary, and perform his duties in case he is absent.

Sec. 6. It shall be the duty of the Hose Captain, to see that the Carriage and Hose are kept in good condition, and in readiness at all times, and shall command the Hose Company when on duty; but in all cases, the Hose Captain & Hose Company, are to abide by the command of the Foreman. Such Hose Department, being under the jurisdiction and subject to all the Penalties of the Constitution and Bye Laws.

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# Programs in Review

The Annual Meeting of 12 June 1989 found the director of the Saginaw Public Library, Kathy O'Connell appearing to give some bad news in that the library's fiscal situation is not in the best condition; despite the millage vote, moneys have not increased to keep pace with salaries and some staffing has been reduced. The Eddy Room will drop off in hours open with only two mornings and two nights per week; it will be open afternoons. One full-time staff member will still be available during those times. She answered many questions brought up and received comments.

Jeanne White had announced a sharing program. Nancy VanWormer showed an obituary she had received concerning a clergyman ancestor, as well as additional information from another source. Bonnie Dole also reported on an obituary she had run across of which half was missing: after much effort, it was discovered that the person was an ancestor, when the complete obituary came to light. Jeanne White gave many items of Loyalist information; she had left some family group sheets in a Canadian library and discovered a cousin as a result. Lillian Bluemlein husband went to a college reunion and met a man who had rescued a number of pictures from a flood in Saginaw many years earlier. Chuck and Genevieve Molenaar attended a seminary of the National Genealogical Society: he discussed many of the faceets and he and Genevieve bought tapes of several of the talks given. was also interested in software for a computer genealogy program. Theo Klisch mentioned that she had a notebook of information, which she had collected and turned this over to the library. September 1989, Jeanne White introduced speaker Berriman of Midland. A retired history teacher with some Ottawa Indian ancestry, Berriman talked about the "real" Indian, a decent human being with a culture not understood by persons who have gained their knowledge from movies and TV. The Indian hunted, fished and provided food; the women did everything else, and had no voice in most decisions, although that was not the case in some western tribes and the eastern Iroquois. Stan was in full and genuine Ottawa buckskin garb. The Ottawas have given him the name "Bear Man" which has meaning shared with some other Ottawas.

For our meeting of 9 October 1989, Jeanne White introduced speaker Louis Economou, who spoke on emigration to the United States, covering a space of about 400 years. Speaking as an emigrant himself, he went on to say that few ancestors were rich - most left to try to better their lives. Herman Melville wrote that "we're not a nation, but a world," indicating that Americans are a people with a varied past. The first native Americans arrived across the Bering Straits some 30,000 years ago, but the origins of present American have changed over the years. government founded by the Colonials arriving from 1620 to 1650, provided the foundation of our country today. The first census was taken in 1790, and most of the citizens at that time living along the coast. Emigration to America was created by religious persecution, poverty and wars. Between 1790 and 1820, very little emigration took place because of restrictions on the peoples of Europe, but from 1840 on, millions of people moved to (Programs in Review, continued) the United States. Lou detailed the emigration patterns up until the very recent past, and answered questions which arose. Our speaker for the evening of 14 November 1989, was Thomas Garikes of Chesaning, who spoke on "Royal Lines." Coincidentally, our speaker has, like last month's speaker, Greek roots. Tom has been fascinated by the history of royalty since childhood, and has collected facts, legends, books and memorabilia since that time. Sticking pretty much to England, he was able to start with Elizabeth I and talk for an hour, holding the interest of the audience. Elated after a recent trip to England, where an invitation from a religious leader had put him in the same buildings with royal family, standing next to the queen and then coming home to an undreamed visit to the Oval Office, the speaker projected his enthusiasm to his listeners.

The new year began with the regular meeting of 8 January 1990, during which President Himmelein introduced the guests and asked them to state their interests. He then introduced society member Charles Molenaar, who started out by stating that he expected all present to become computer experts, since that was the purpose of his talk. Chuck showed off a Petoskey stone, explained that it could be a tool if used in such a way, and, of course, the computer was also a tool. He then explained the terms, "floppy disk", showed an optical scanner and talked about software programs and what you can do with them. He also explained the differences between word-processing and data base, and their purpose, as well as mentioning various computer models and genealogical programs.
