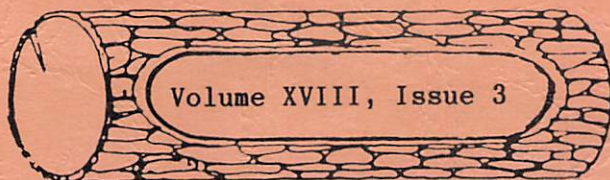

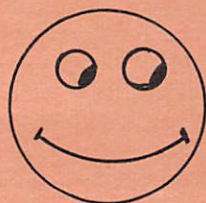

Thursday, 20 January 1859

James Stone recently opened a boot and shoe shop on Washington Street.

The fire department completed organization on 28 December by an election of officers; President, George J. Dorr; Vice President, Hosea Pratt; Secretary, Fred N. Bridgman; Treasurer, Charles B. Mott; Trustees were F. T. Hall, G. C. Sanborn, D. D. Keeler, Charles Allen, J. A. Whittier and L. H. Eastman.

Thursday, 10 February 1859

In the State Senate on 7 February, a bill to incorporate the City of East Saginaw was read a third time and passed.

Thursday, 17 February 1859

Died - At the city of Albany, on the 20th of January, of Consumption, Mrs. William L. Sherman, wife of William L. Sherman of Bay City.

Thursday, 24 February 1859

Col. D. W. C. Gage had been appointed by the Commissioner of the State Land Office as an agent to take affidavits of pre-exemption claimants upon the swamp lands.

Republican nominees for East Saginaw offices, under the new charter: George A. Lathrop, Mayor; DeWitt C. Gage, Recorder; Solomon B. Bliss, Treasurer; Franklin A. Curtis, Marshal; William J. Barton, Comptroller; James S. Webber, Director of the Poor; Morgan L. Gage, William J. Loveland, Seth Willey and Perry Joslin for Justices of the Peace.

Thursday, 3 March 1859

Democrats had nominated their candidates for East Saginaw offices: Col. W. L. P. Little, Mayor; A. H. Mershon, Recorder; James F. Brown, Treasurer.

Thursday, 10 March 1859

The first election under the new city charter of East Saginaw came off on Monday, 7 March. Col. W. L. P. Little was elected Mayor, a Democrat, over George A. Lathrop; DeWitt C. Gage over Augustus H. Mershon as Recorder; James F. Brown over Solomon B. Bliss for Treasurer; Franklin A. Curtis for Comptroller; Justices of the Peace were Morgan L. Gage, William J. Loveland, Seth Willey and Perry Joslin; James S. Webber was

Director of the Poor; in the first ward, Perry Joslin was Supervisor; School Inspector was Chester B. Jones and Asahel Disbrow; Aldermen were John S. Estabrook and Charles B. Mott; Constable, Joseph A. Wiest. Second ward, Supervisor, John H. Spring; School Inspectors, George J. Dorr and John J. Wheeler; Aldermen, William F. Glasby and Alexander Ferguson; Constable, Adoniram Dann; Third Ward, Supervisor, David Lyon; Aldermen, George W. Merrill and George W. Wilcox; School Inspectors, Stephen B. Knapp and Volusin Bude; the Constable was Austin L. Rankin.

PROGRAMS IN REVIEW

Our regular meeting of 12 February 1990, found Dr. Richard Mudd speaking on "The Legal Aspects of the Lincoln Assassination Trial." Dr. Samuel Mudd is still waiting to be freed from the verdict following his "trial." After a letter from President Carter, people thought that this had taken place, but so far it is not true. In November 1864, John Wilkes Booth was introduced to Dr. Samuel Mudd and was invited to his home on a horse-buying expedition; the horse later was used by one of the conspirators. Dr. Samuel Mudd saw Booth later in Washington, when Booth asked Dr. Mudd to introduce him to John Surratt, another of the conspirators. After Booth broke his leg during the assassination, he stopped off at Dr. Mudd's to set his leg. After learning of Lincoln's death, Dr Mudd still did not suspect his visitors. He was later arrested and treated badly, unable to get to an attorney for 19 days. The military commission, which tried Dr. Mudd, was not ordained by law and only 8 persons were tried for the crime; four found guilty and sentenced to hang and four sentenced to Fort Jefferson. Dr. Mudd was later pardoned

and died at the age of 49 of pneumonia. Granddaughter Laura Vargas, an attorney with the city of Saginaw, presented her case on the legal aspects, regarding the current court usages and found that he was forced to make statements without counsel; no access to counsel during the trial; his house was searched without a warrant; his right to a speedy trial was not given; he was unable to testify in his own behalf; he was tried in Maryland for a District of Columbia crime; and there was no appellate review of the trial.

The March 12, 1990, regular meeting found member Alice Schiesswohl speaking on "Researching in Michigan," a topic which drew a large crowd of interested genealogists. She mentioned several sources of information in Michigan, citing the following collections:

Burton Collection, Detroit Public Library; census, plat maps, English resources, county histories from the US. Photo copies can be ordered there.

Bentley Library, Ann Arbor; on the University of Michigan campus; unpublished manuscripts, church records, Indian records.

Clements Library, University of Michigan; Revolutionary War records, English and early American and Canadian records.

Clarke Library, Central Michigan University; Old Northwest Territory records, old Michigan manuscripts and newspapers; Indian reference collection.

Library of Michigan, Lansing; state archives, census, plat maps, family histories, French-Canadian references.

State Archives of Michigan, Lansing; any material relating to Michigan mental institution, prison records, other public records.

Allen County Library, Fort Wayne, Indiana; 3d largest in the United States, contains an extensive number of resource material.

LDS Library, Salt Lake City and the Stake Libraries; information available through the branches on all phases of the main library material.

Courthouses and their departments; don't overlook townships. You need to know when the county or townships were organized.

Drivers' License Bureau of the state in which you are interested.

Draper Collection; trans-Allegheny records of Ohio Valley, Virginia, etc; located at Wayne State University in Detroit.

Michigan Technological University has mining records.

Alice went on to note that Baptist records can be found at Kalamazoo College; the Works Progress Administration Records contain an inventory of records for most of the counties in the United States, but were compiled in the 1930s and are not completely up to date. Railroad records can be found in Cleveland, Ohio; the Soo Line records are in Minneapolis, Minnesota and the Penn Central in New York City and Philadelphia. The Great Lakes Museum in Detroit has much information about boats of the Great Lakes. There is also a Jewish Connection Holocaust Memorial in Bloomfield, Michigan. Many Methodist records can be found in the Shipman Library at Adrian College and Albion College has many of those records for the western side of the state.
