

It would appear that he had, in his fright, seized of something under the water, as it required hard pulling to start him from his position. An effort was made to restore him, but unsuccessful.

Programs in Review

The regular meeting of 12 November 1990, started out with Anna Mae Maday, passing out copies of "Hoyt Trivia" quiz and answers. President Darlene Hudson presented two copies of a genealogy to Anna Mae, on behalf of the society. Roy Allen introduced our speaker, Lorraine Stindt, who spoke about the many ways to complete a family tree, such as the bare name, date and place type. A person can do family histories through letters if the person is luck enough to have had a relative who kept them. Another way is to keep track of family traits, such as size, foot size, ear lobes, etc. Some of the interesting facets is how the family keep holidays; health problems; eating habits; getting gray hair early; love of music or the arts. Many of a person's traits are a result of genes, for better or for worse. Family stories are probably the most fun to put into family histories. Some stories may be questionable as to truth, but may contain some provable information. She said to keep two notebooks - one for all the information you get and one filled with questions to be asked. Don't worry about your style when you write, just write the way you talk and express your opinions and use humor. Lorraine interspersed her sage advice with numerous interesting anecdotes and fielded numerous questions from those present. To start off the new year, on 14 January 1991, Charles Molenaar, pinch-hitting for a speaker, sidelined by surgery, brought some cassette tapes from a seminar which he had attended: "When the Original Sources are Wrong," by Henry "Hank" Jones, a well-known genealogist. After he had appeared on "Jeopardy", his mail increased to the point where he was receiving more mail than the host, due to the fact that he had mentioned his work in genealogy when on the program. Jones detailed some thoughts on "Record Source Failures very ably, giving some very good advice. Biographical Histories or "Mug Books", popular volumes printed nearly a hundred years ago, featured quite good accuracy on contemporary persons, but this accuracy dipped sadly on earlier years and persons. The earlier family histories did not feature high scholarship, and some are downright frauds. Jones suggested using primary sources, or figure on errors; some errors also appear in the primary sources, so be careful. Family traditions may contain a grain of truth, but some times this tradition is credited to the wrong ancestor. Chuck has a number of tapes of various speakers, and if sent a blank tape, will make a copy for those interested.
