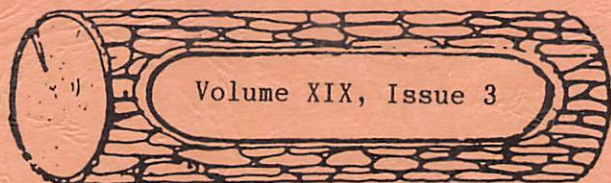

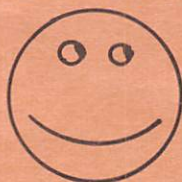

Programs in Review

Our regular meeting of 11 February 1991 was a "sharing" meeting and Gretchen Solesby, who at one time was about to dismiss a box in her basement, fortunately decided to check it out and found many items which she needed and which she discussed. Bonnie Dole's mother displayed an antique calendar plate, one of a number of advertising houseware items and noted that her great grandfather brought with him, confirmation certificates for

himself and his wife. Ron Swarthout stood to tell about University Microfilm's services and that he had obtained, from them, out of print books which continue his lineage back to the 1600s. These are Xeroxed, double-sided and bound. Debbie Barringer stated that her grandfather came to the United States, but she didn't know when. One time, at Ft. Wayne Library, she checked the Soundex for passengers. When the first try was incorrect, she found another, which turned out to be the right one, giving the city, etc., from which he came. Carlie Klump's great-grandmother was born in Canada, but her great grandfather was from Michigan, according to legend. When checking further in Essex Co., Ontario, she discovered the names she was looking for. Later at Ft. Wayne, she confirmed that the names were correct. Bonnie Dole wrote to a sexton of a cemetery, explained the 8 names she was looking for, and had 4 of the names confirmed by him. She displayed a stick, asking if anybody knew what it was. It turned out to be a "cheat-stick", or a lumber-scaler, used to figure how much lumber could be cut from a tree. Another item was an old, beat-up portrait of an unknown man, as well as a family portrait, including a great grandmother. She had also been introduced to a book on Glengarry, Ontario, which had included a large number of familiar names.

The membership meeting of 11 March 1991 was called to order and Bonnie Dole introduced Jan Kohlbrand, Director of the Family History Center of the LDS in Midland. A handout was given to all present with pertinent information on the LDS library, as to hours, location and what's available. Though use of an overhead projection, an explanation was given as to use. There is a reference fiche in every file. For those familiar with the LDS Church, some changes to take note of: the Library is now located in the North West corner of the Church; take a left as you enter the doors; it is no longer necessary to go through the church. Some new hours are being tried. Starting 20 March, 1991, Wednesday morning hours of 10 am to 1 pm will be tried, to see if it is feasible to keep them open, which depends upon the usage. The computer, which is IBM compatible has been broken, but expected to be restored to use anytime. One can take a formatted disk and copy off the computer and then take it home to use at your leisure. One should call for the half hour time limit on the computer, which is available for sign-up times.

On 8 April 1991, the regular meeting found Herman Rindhage speaking on the Voyageurs group of the Saginaw County Historical Museum. He explained that it was a part of the living history division of the museum, and some of the activities which they enjoy. His clothing demonstrated the attire of 200 years ago; they were home-made, without pockets, and buttons made of bone. His "purse" held odds and ends, since there were no pockets in his clothing. He detailed routes of the trips which the Voyageurs had made to date and showed some great slides of the old and new voyageur canoes, as well as scenery from the trips which they had made. These slides showed how they lived during their various voyages. The slides were greatly enjoyed by those

in attendance, although there weren't too many who were ready to try out one of these experiences in the wild water.

Accident - Mr. William Townsend had the misfortune of having his leg broken yesterday, at Glasby's Mill. He was turning over a lot, partly sawed, toward himself, when the cant-hook slipped, letting the log fall, and catching his leg below the knee and breaking it.

Thursday, 23 June 1859

Stephen R. Kirby tendered his resignation as chief engineer of the fire department; accepted and filed at the City Council meeting of 20 June 1859.

Thursday, 30 June 1859

Married - In this city, 29 Jun 1859, at the residence of Mr. John P. Derby, Mr. John J. Wheeler, Esq., formerly of Burlington, Vermont, to Miss Sarah E. Gay, of this city.

Saturday, 2 July 1859

Attachment Notice - Writ of attachment against the property of Charles D. Bronson, sued out of the Circuit Court by S. Titus Parsons for the sum of three hundred dollars, on 13 Apr 1859; signed J. G. Sutherland, attorney for the plaintiff.

Thursday, 7 July 1859

Died - In this city, 4 July, Mrs. Sophia Filkins, wife of Moses C. Filkins, of Congestion of the Lungs, aged 31 years.

Saturday, 9 July 1859

Reuben Harper, a young man employed in the Merrill Mill, was seriously and dangerously injured on Thursday last. He was placing a band on some of the machinery, when a stick, which another hand was carelessly playing with, caught in the wheel, one end striking him on the left side of the abdomen, just passing the hip bone, and coming out through the thigh. The end of the stick being smooth and rounded, it passed along by the main artery, without cutting it off, which it must have done had the stick been a sharp or rough one. It is hoped he will recover.

Report of the regular meeting of Excelsior Fire Engine Company #2 of the City of East Saginaw, convened Wednesday evening, 6 July 1859; Charles J. Harris had been appointed to draft a resolution thanking the ladies of East Saginaw and Saginaw City for furnishing garlands of flowers to decorate the engine and Hose Cart of the company for the Fourth of July. Robert Haddon was secretary.

Pioneer Hose Company #1 met on 8 July 1859, and adopted much the same resolution, signed by J. Ed. Mershon, Foreman, signed by Chauncey H. Gage, Secretary.

Rev. W. C. Smith was to preach to the Congregational Church, held at Buena Vista Hall. Rev. --- McGee, for the Protestant Episcopal, also at Buena Vista Hall, at a different hour; Rev. Curtis Mosher to speak to the Methodist Episcopal assembly at the church and Rev. Conrad Volz for the Lutherans.

Orvil Hemenger of East Saginaw offered at \$10 reward for a black horse, about 14 hands high, strayed from the enclosure of the Hoyt Farm.
