


SOME THOUGHTS ON THE VARIOUS FEDERAL CENSUS REPORTS OF SAGINAW COUNTY, MICHIGAN

by Leland R. Watrous

Having spent quite some time reviewing and reading the various census reports of Saginaw County for 1830, 1840, 1850 and now 1860, I had noticed, but not remarked until now, some strange anomalies in those records. Charles W. Grant, who enumerated most of the 1860 Saginaw County Federal Census, was quite meticulous in his task. However, one column stands out: those who were unable to read or write English. With the influx of

German immigrants in those years just prior to 1860, it is certainly remarkable that almost without exception, those German settlers could all read and write English. It is also remarkable that almost all of the Irish settlers are listed as being unable to read or write English. Some of the Canadians, Swiss and a few other nationalities are mentioned in that category, but I have been unable to comprehend the reason for these disproportionate statements of illiteracy. Was Mr. Grant prejudiced for some reason? We shall probably never know, but seems to be a very interesting point.

Programs in Review

The meeting of 11 November 1991 found Evelyn Leasher, Public Services Director of the Clarke Historical Library at Central Michigan University, as our speaker. She gave a brief run-down of the various sources available there, such as Michigan History, the Old Northwest Territory, Great Lakes History and 19th Century children's books, along with microfilms of most of the state's newspapers. She noted that parking is a problem in that area and the library is open to everyone. Photocopying can be done by the library staff. They operate on the closed-stack principle in that books must be requested. They have very little genealogical material, but all census reports of Michigan. have also collected a wide range of Indian material, Isabella County was once occupied as the Indian reservation. They also have much in the way of Civil War records, including diaries and letters. County histories and town histories also take up quite a bit of space, as do old maps, posters and photographs.

On 13 January 1992, our first meeting at the Saginaw Historical Society Building took place, with a full house. Bonnie Dole spoke on the History of the Wylie Brothers, lumbermill and property owners in Saginaw, Clare, Gladwin Counties. We learned that when she does research from obituaries, she has to prepare her mind for the language used. She presented her program with

the aid of an overhead projector, using copies of various records she had discovered on this family. Eighteen Wylies are buried in Oakwood Cemetery, which answered a number of her questions about the family. Her father, after finding the locations of the various land purchases owned by the Wylies, obtained maps of the area and located the land on them, showing just where the land was situated. Bonnie also had located news accounts and obituaries of some members of the family, which she read to the group.

The Descendants of ARTEMUS WARD BACON

One of the Founders of Saginaw Township, Michigan

(Continued from Volume XX, Issue 1, page 32)

The eastern boundary of the Bacon Farm on the Tittabawassee River was Hospital Road, which at that time, ran down to the river. The northern boundary was Shattuck Road. What is now the Midland Road did not exist in 1830. The location of the farm is shown on the 1877 Atlas of Saginaw, page 42. In 1839 the Bacon farm was split by the survey of the Mackinaw Trail (now the Midland Road).

From 1831 to 1835, the area now known as the County of Saginaw was a township attached to Oakland for judicial purposes. The act establishing Saginaw Township was passed 12 Jul 1830 and came into effect when the first township meeting was held on 4 Apr 1831. That first meeting was held at the deserted military post with thirteen citizens attending, and Artemus Ward Bacon was elected Treasurer. At the same meeting they appropriated \$25 for the poor and \$50 for building roads and bridges.

The 1881 History of Saginaw County on page 604 states:

During the year 1832 . . . A. W. Bacon, Charles McLean, Henry McLean, John Brown, Andrew Ure, Harvey Williams, John McGregor, Douglas Thompson, Stephen Benson, William J. Henderson and John Todd lands along the Tittabawasee, and subsequently brought their families thither to reside.

The same source on page 318 states that the first grand jury included Artemus $W.\ Bacon.$

He married Roxanna (sometimes referred to as Roxa or Roxie) Wallace on 5 Jul 1832 in Saginaw. I found no information about where she came from or who were her parents. Roxanna Wallace Bacon and Artemus Ward Bacon had two children, Artemus Ward Bacon, Jr., born 1 Apr 1833, and Sarah J. Bacon, born in 1835; she died 11 Dec 1838. Artemus W. Bacon, Senior, died 29 Aug 1838. There are two (now unmarked) graves near the river on the site of the Bacon farm. These are almost certainly the graves of Artemus Ward Bacon and his daughter, Sarah J. Bacon, as the first cemetery in that locality was not started until about 1850.

Artemus Ward Bacon's estate, consisting of the 102.55 acre farm, was not probated until 28 Aug 1852 when the application was filed; the final settlement was signed by Eleazer Jewett, Judge of Probate, on 16 Sep 1854. (Saginaw County Probate File #8).

A model Mill and salt works, in W. R. Bates' History of the Saginaws, was that of Sears and Holland, East Saginaw, near the Bristol (Holland) Bridge.

In the 1870s it employed 105 men, with 10 horses, under the direct supervision of A. W. Bacon, Bates tells us, "who probably has no superior as a foreman in the Valley.

He later went into partnership with George C. Merrill. There is a full page advertisement for the Merrill & Bacon Foundry in the General Directory of East Saginaw and South Saginaw in 1872. It shows George C. Merrill and Artemus W. Bacon as proprietors.
