



The Descendants of ARTEMUS WARD BACON
One of the Founders of Saginaw Township, Michigan Compiled by Douglas Bacon Whiting (Continued from Volume XX, Issue 2, page 64)

SECOND GENERATION

2. ARTEMUS WARD2 BACON, JR. (Artemus Ward1)

Artemus Ward Bacon, Jr. was born in Saginaw, Michigan, in a log cabin at the Bacon farm on the Tittabawassee River on 1 April 1833. He was the son of Artemus Ward Bacon and Roxanna Wallace Bacon. He died in Saginaw, 19 June 1894. He married Sophia Adelaide Johnson in Saginaw on 2 June 1861. They were married by Arthur Edwards, Jr., minister of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Saginaw City.

She was born in Pontiac, Michigan, on 28 October 1839 and died in Saginaw on 21 February 1923. She was the daughter of Horace Johnson and Nancy Gotee Johnson.

Artemus Ward Bacon., Jr., was probably the first white child born to a settler in Saginaw, although there were children born to the wives of some of the soldiers at Fort Saginaw in 1823 (see History of Saginaw County, page 255). The same cource (page 256) gives the date of 11 February 1834 for the birth of the first child to a pioneer family; however Artemus Ward Bacon., Jr., was born in Saginaw nearly a year earlier.

My mother (his daughter) remembered him telling of being left in the care of Indians living near the Bacon farm on the Tittabawassee River during his early childhood. Schools began in Saginaw in 1834-5 and in 1848 there was imposed a school tax of fifty cents for every scholar in town between ages four and eighteen.

Artemus Ward Bacon, Jr's father, died on 29 August 1838, when Artemus, Jr., was only five years old. His sister died two months later; both were buried on the Bacon farm. Shortly after that, his mother remarried and so Artemus Ward Bacon, was brought

up in the David Lyon family in Buena Vista, a settlement adjoining East Saginaw.

I have an undated sampler made by Polly Lyon, a step-sister of Artemus Ward Bacon, Jr., which was given to me by my mother. According to a note on the back of the sampler, she told me that Polly Lyon was a cousin of Sophia Johnson Bacon, her mother. This could indicate how Artemus and Sophia Johnson became acquainted.

Chapman's 1881 History of Saginaw County, page 569, states that Artemus Ward Bacon, Jr., moved from Buena Vista to East Saginaw in 1859 when he was 26 years old.

An Article about Saginaw in the 1800s by Jack Tucker, on page F1 of the Saginaw News, dated Sunday, March 1, 1987, says:

A model Mill and salt works, in W. R. Bates' History of the Saginaws, was that of Sears and Holland, East Saginaw, near the Bristol (Holland) Bridge.

In the 1870s it employed 105 men, with 10 horses, under the direct supervision of A. W. Bacon, Bates tells us, "who probably has no superior as a foreman in the Valley.

He later went into partnership with George C. Merrill. There is a full page advertisement for the Merrill & Bacon Foundry in the General Directory of East Saginaw and South Saginaw in 1872. It shows George C. Merrill and Artemus W. Bacon as proprietors. Chapman's 1881 History of Saginaw County, page 569, states:

Merrill and Bacon, brass founders and Manufacturers of mill machinery, engines, etc., East Saginaw. This pioneer firm was established in business in 1871, building their present shops that year at a cost of \$12,000. Their business has increased very rapidly and their work stands high in the market. Mr. Bacon, the junior member of the firm, is a native of Michigan and a practical mechanic. He located in East Saginaw in 1859, and for a term of years officiated as foreman of the well known milling firm of Sears and Holland.

The Merrill and Bacon shop was located on the S.E. corner of Water and McCoskry streets, running from Water Street to the alley between Water St. and Washington Ave.

Artemus Ward Bacon paid for a volunteer to take his place in the military during the Civil War.

Artemus Ward Bacon and his wife built a home at 205 Phelon Street in Saginaw. The house faced Phelon Street on the north-east corner of Phelon and Owen Streets. There are now three houses on the site, all facing Owen Street. The third house north of Phelon Street was built by Artemus Bacon and his wife and rented as an investment. About 1917, the Bacon sisters sold the house on Phelon Street and moved into the house they owned on Owen Street (now 1226 Owen Street). The old house was torn down and two houses facing Owen Street built in its place.
