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GHOST STORIES

THE SAGINAW DAILY COURIER Saturday - January 21, 1871

A few days since we received a communication, written in a fine, delicate hand, purporting to give the experience of the writer with spirits. We have kept this document hoping to hear more in regard to it and the writer, but failing in this we give the communication for what it is worth, trusting that its publication may enlighten us and the public on the subject:

In 186-, myself, husband and two daughers came to the Saginaw Valley, and my husband engaged in lumbering operations. We rented a house on street, which my husband subsequently purchased. The house itself was a small one, of the common kind, with a parlor, small setting room, which was used during the winter as a dining room, several bedrooms above, one of which was over the parlor, and designated the "guest chamber", and was seldom used. After a while the room was fitted up for my daughter, Ella, who was about to receive a visit from an old schoolmate from the East, the event being deemed of sufficient importance. Mary, the name of Ella's acquaintance, came in due time, and the two occupied the room together. After a few days, one morning at the breakfast table, Mary said, "Ella, what were you doing in the night; I heard you rustling about the room, but was too sleepy to speak."

"I was not up, said Ella," "I did not wake all night."
"Somebody was in the room," said Mary, "I am very sure"

We all laughed and told her she was dreaming. A few mornings after, Ella said, "Now Mary, what were you doing, rustling about the room last night, you accused me of sleep walking, but I heard you very plainly. After listening to your movements for some time, I spoke. You must have got into bed very quietly, for when I put out my hand you were there, but why didn't you speak, and what were you doing?"

"I can say as you did, that I never woke all night, and know nothing about this mysterious prowler".

We all of us then entered into the discussion of this matter very earnestly, and decided that "the rustling", which they both agreed, sounded like the moving about of a women's garments, nust have been caused by some currents of air moving the curtains, and let the matter rest. The repetition of these peculiar sounds were quite frequent through the winter, and the girls tried in all ways to account for their occurrence. When one was awakened by this unseen women's rustling, she would quietly awake the other and both would listen intently to discover the exact spot where the noise came from but always it appeared to move about the room. When they kept a light burning, their night were undisturbed. One day I was sitting in their room, and as usual we had been trying experiemts to produce the same sounds by day, but without effect, I remarked "Your visitor ought to occupy this chair, and then you could at all events know where she is." The chair was an old relic, a wooden rocking chair that from age and infirmity made a peculiar walling sound when any one rocked in it, loud enough to be heard in the next room.

That same night I was awakened suddenly, and in an instant I heard the rocking of this chair continuously for five minutes. The next morning I said to the girls, "Were either of you ill in the night, or wakeful, or did you try to alarm me by rocking in the old chair." I was surprised when they assured me they had slept quietly and heard nothing. Then the ghost rocked for me especially, I presume, but for the first time I felt a little superstitious. And so that matter continued all winter, and the "ghost" became a household word.

In the spring Mary returned home, my daughters and other members of the family left home, and the ghost was left in solitary possession. Early in the winter, a young man, a friend of the family visited us. Of course he was put into the room, and the first morning after he occupied it, he said, "Did any one come into my room last night? I heard the rustling about, but kept very quiet, and I presume, whoever it was, thought I was asleep."

I let the matter pass for the time, but after he had been similarly disturbed several times, I told him the whole story. He was much interested, and during the remainder of his visit, he too tried all means to ascertain the nature or cause of the noise, but without success, and when he left, laughingly said, "It must be a ghost, and will make itself visible some time."

The following spring a brother of my husband, came to the city. He was not well when he arrived, and we made him leave the hotel, and spend his time with us. The first morning after being in the room, he said, "Did you come into my room last night?"

"No," said I.

"Well, I heard some one rustling about for a long time."
As he was not well, nothing more was said on the subject. A
few mornings after, he again remarked, "Some one was certainly in
my room last night, for I was awake and distinctly saw the door open,
and though I could not tell who came in, as the moonlight was faint in
the room, I suppose it was one of the girls as I heard her clothing rustle."
"Why didn't you speak?" said I.

"I did, but all was instantly still."

One morning he came to breakfast quite excited, and said "I do believe, sister, there are ghosts in my room, for last night I not only heard them, but saw the door open, and turning around, there on the pillow by my side, was a head covered with short dark hair, the back of the head was toward me. I was so startled I looked at it in the moonlight for some time, then I cautiously put my hand towards it and it vanished."

Many other times during his stay of a month he had similar visitations or illusions as you may choose to term them.

The succeeding summer my widowed daughter came to us, and the short time God spared her to us she occupied the same room, She often spoke not only of hearing, but seeing peculiar objects in the night. One morning she said there was a head covered with short, dark hair on the pillow beside her in the night, but when she tried to touch it, it disappeared.

One night she saw the door open and a faint figure glide across the room. These appearances were very frequent until her death. She seemed to take pleasure in the thought that spirits were about her.

After he death, the room was closed for many, many months. We then decided to break up housekeeping. Just before we perfected our plans, a gentleman and his wife, old friends of my husband, came unexpectedly to the city. They were only here for a few hours, but as this was their first trip west, we persuaded them to remain a day or two. They, of course, never had heard any thing of the peculiarities of the room, which was so hastily fitted up for their occupancy. At the breakfast table the next morning Mrs. F. said, "I was awake when you came into my room last night Mrs. ____, but you rustled about so gently I know you thought I was asleep, so I did not speak."

I said, "No, I did not go into your room last night."
"Probably then it was one of your girls to get something left in the room, for I heard them very distinctly."

The following morning, both Mr. & Mrs. F. spoke of hearing some one again in their room, and as they left the same day without any explanation on my part, they undoubtedly considered me a careless housekeeper, who had to send for forgotten articles in my guests bedroom.

In a few days after, we vacated the house and I never heard whether its subsequent occupants had any mysterious nightly visitors.

How all these extraordinary coincidences can be explained I cannot tell, but this is only a simple statement of facts.

It is a list of the engineers and firemen under the employment of the Pere Marquette Rail Road including those hired by two of the rail roads consolidated into it, the Flint and Pere Marquette and the P.H. & N. W. R. R. (Port Huron & North Western?) as of October 1, 1913.

There are a few hand written notes on the document. Unfortunately, I don't know what they mean or can't read them. On the third page, October 1, 1912 may be a typographical error. It may have been meant to be October 1, 1913.

I am a member of the Saginaw Depot Preservation Corporation and am the historian of Potter Street and the surrounding area.

August 7th to 11th 1881

This day interred the remains of Edward Brulette who died at Jackson of cancer of the stomach in 49th year of his age - he was born in Canada - he was for some time a resident of this place where his widow still lives upon her native place - he was a Union Soldier of the late War of the Rebellion of the States.

August 26th

Buried Albert Nelson aged 24 years - born in Badax Wisconsin - disease congestion and cold causing death.

Augs 30th 1881

This day interred the remains of Phillip Eddington Citizen of this Township for many years - in business - 64 years of age, active, industrious until near the close of his life - a diseased liver caused his death he was one of Order of Free & Accepted Masons of the Lodge of this place - Services at the funeral conducted by the Rev'd McElroy of East Saginaw - which was numerously attended

Oct 3rd 1881

Earnest Dickman was this day buried in the family lot in the Union Ground back of the Cemetery Bridgeport A very fine young man aged 20 years who was killed in a saw mill in East Saginaw accidentally and very much mourned by many friends and aquaintences.

Oct 8th 1881

This day interred the remains of one Charles Brock who was born in Germany aged 70 years - who died at his home in this Town of gradual decay or old age.

Nov 1881

Mary M. Sheffield of the Town of Albee died this day interred her remains in the addition of Esq. L. Blakely upon a lot sold them for a family lot beside other members of the family - Typhoid Fever

BURYING GROUND CASS BEND (Oak Grove Cemetery) Bridgeport, Mi

Dec 24th 1881

This day interred the remains of Sally Ann Lesia who died of consumption in the 42nd year of her age - formerly for a long time a resident of this Township in the family lot beside her children to "unite the family" - fee for the same paid by Mr. Peter Lesia in charge - a woman very much respected and beloved by all.

Jany 12th 1882

This day interred Frankie Hunsberger of this Township who died of Diptheria in the 6th year of his age - a nice boy very much missed by his friends and school mates.

January 23rd, 1882

This day interred the remains of Bridget Hieson Putnam who died at her Fathers residence in this Township of quick consumption in the 21st year of her age - having been born inthe City of Flint in this State and very much lamented.

January 30th

This day interred the remains of Mary J. Williams of this Township who was born in England - her parents since coming here have lost four out of the family by the distressing disease Diptheria in this Town, aged 10 years, she was the first of the four who died here.

Feby 3rd

This day interred the remains of Janette Williams who also died of Diptheria - born in England - aged 6 years

Feby 5th

Lewis Williams was this interred born in England aged five years who also died of Diptheria.

Feby 12th 1882

This day interred the remains of Mrs. Matilida O'Hara of this Town who died in the 30th year of her age - born in Canada - leaving a large family and her husband to lament her sudden and untimely death. The husband and his family have a large circle of true and sympathetic friends in this community.
