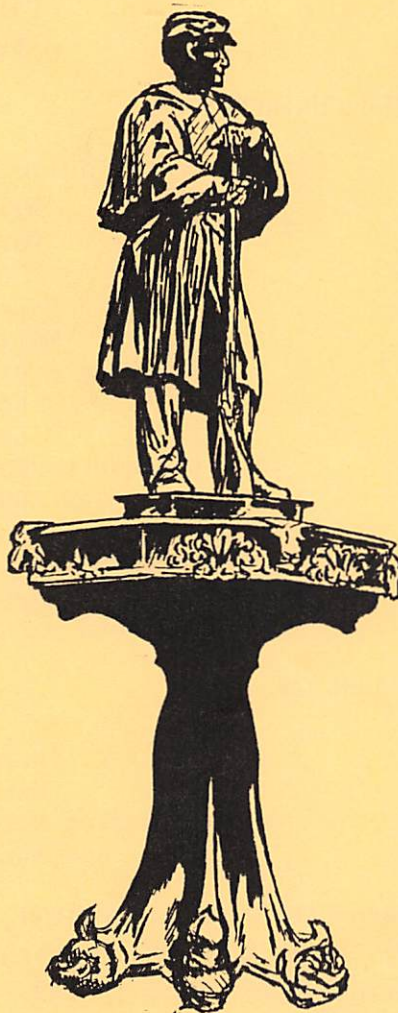

They're the Last Here of the Boys in Blue Who Answered Lincoln's Call

The glory and the sorrow of the nation's cruellest war will be recalled this Memorial Day by seven old veterans - Saginaw's remainder of the Boys in Blue who fought for the north in the Civil War. Captain Keeler will act as honoray grand marshal of the Memorial Day parade. Automobiles will carry Capt. Keeler and any of his comrades who care to take part in the exhibition, their days of long marches having passed a long time ago. These six are all who remain in the City of Saginaw of the one large and powerful Grand Army of the Republic.

### LIFE'S JOURNEY ENDED

On Sunday last, Mrs. Anna Webster BEACH, widow of the late Latham BEACH and mother of Joseph BEACH, of this city, was stricken with paralysis at the residence of the latter, on Walls street in this city. Since Sunday she has been failing rapidly and yesterday afternoon at 3:25 o'clock died of the effects of the stroke.

Mrs. BEACH was born in Litchfield, Conn., Sept 28 1803 and would therefore have been 83 years old next September. Most of her life was spent at Penfield, Monroe county, N. Y., where her husband, the late Latham BEACH, died fifteen years ago. Mrs. BEACH was the mother of eleven children, five of whom, four sons and a daughter, survive her. She was a lady much esteemed and was a devoted Christian woman, having been a life-long member of the Presbyterian church. The funeral will occur Friday morning at 10 o'clock from the residence. The remains will be taken to Grand Blanc for interment.

At 12:15 yesterday noon, John F. BRATER, son of John K and Margaret BRATER, a most estimable and worthy young man, succumbed to the ravages of typho-malarial fever and breathed his last. He was 19 years and 4 months of age. He had been ill only two weeks, and the news of his death was a sad surprise to many of his acquaintances. For the past year and a half he has been employed in G. Estabrooks & Co's clothing house, where he gave universal satisfaction in the discharge of his duties. The funeral will occur at 2 p.m. Friday at the Lutheran Church of the Holy Cross.

## HOW IS YOUR TITLE?

Of Interest to Every Land Owner in the County

A List of Wills on Record not Probated -- Also a List Probated and not Recorded - Either of Which Effects the Title of Lands Bequested Therein.

The following lists of wills, are furnished by Deputy Register of Deeds R F SIMONEAU and Register of Probate O W SEYMOUR, the first being a list of wills that have been admitted to probate but never recorded as required by law to make the titles perfect; the second having never been admitted to probate here but recorded in the register's office. Persons owing lands under or by title received through either of these sources will do well to look to their titles, as it may save them trouble in the future. It is absolutely required by law that every will shall be both recorded in the register's office and probated in the probate office to be legal and valid. There are also a number of foreign wills or wills made in other states or countries and not probated in this county, that have no validity whatever and that are now on file in the probate office. "Following is a list of names found in the day book of Dr. A.B. SPINNEY, 1867 at East Saginaw Michigan.

The day book became a scrap book for my aunt, Lola TRUXETON. She died in her early twenties. I have no idea how she got the day book. She lived in Evert Michigan, but was a Dental Hygenist and perhaps through her employer -- I don't know. The first half of the book is covered with articles of interest to her; the handwriting in the book varies - I found at least three separate types. The old doctor was evidently a general practioner - made house calls, worked Sundays, and charged an average of \$1.50 per call. The wife of his patients were listed as such - example: wife of Hugh McBRIDE, etc. Seldon did I see a woman's first name. On several occasions, the patients' name was listed only as "Stranger".
