Dear Genealogical Society,

Please find enclosed my compilation of persons, businesses and industries located in an area surrounding the Potter Street Station. I hope that you find it interesting enough to publish in the "Timber Town Log."

This directory was compiled from Thomas and Galatrain's Indian & Pioneer Directory of the Saginaw Valley, published in 1866. I have been doing research on this area for the past three years and am a member of the Saginaw Depot Preservation Corporation. We are proposing that a part of the area that surrounds the Potter Street Station should be designated as a Historical District. The research that I have been doing goes beyond these boundaries being proposed. This includes parts of the neighborhood that have been cleared away for the rerouting of N. 5th and N. 6th Streets and the I-75 freeway and also the region along the river where the pioneering industries of East Saginaw had once existed.

I would like to note that the printing of my list was done by James W. Gault III on his 600 dpi laser printer. With out his help this would have been finished on my stubby looking 24 pin printer, which is where this letter came from. Enclosed is a map that outlines the boundaries of the Historical District and the territory that this research covers. Please excuse the markings on this map. I got the map from City Hall and the big marks indicate property owned by the city so please ignore them. This is the best current map of the area that I could find.


I noticed that you have a query section in the "Timber Town Log." Would it be possible to print a few of my questions for me? My first question is about west side grave yards. Over the past two years I have been reading the microfilmed news papers of 1869 and have found several articles about bodies being moved from the "old cemetery" to the "new" one, both being on the west side. I know that a cemetery was once located on the site of the Saginaw Barrel Co. Lumber Mill, near Salt Street, south from Old Town and this grave yard was moved for the construction of the lumber mill in the early 1870s and some of the bodies were moved to Oakwood, built in 1867. Was this "old" cemetery the one that was moved for the lumber mill or was there one before it? What was it's name? Was the "new" Oakwood cemetery?

Can anyone tell me the ward boundaries of East Saginaw as they would appear in 1862? How many were there? A 1862 civil war draft register lists only three wards and my map from 1863 shows that by that year the boundaries of East Saginaw had reached past what is now 1st Street and all the way down to Salina.

Thank you again for printing my list of Pere Marquette employees in the "Timber Town Log" several months ago and thanks for the complementary issue. I hope that you find the enclosed list of persons, businesses and industries in the area around the Potter Street Station interesting enough to print in your publication.

## PERSONS, BUSINESSES AND INDUSTRIES LOCATED IN THE PROPOSED POTTER STREET STATION HISTORICAL DISTRICT COMPILED FROM THE 1866/1867 PIONEER DIRECTORY BY DARREN NEMETH

This is a complete list of the people, businesses and industries located near the Potter Street Station that are listed in the Indian & Pioneer Directory of the Saginaw Valley 1866 - 1867 by Thomas & Galatrain, published in 1866. This is a part of my ongoing research of an area arround Potter Street which boundries are within old Fitzhugh Street, the Saginaw River, 6th Street (south of the rail road tracks), and 8th Street (north of the tracks).

All of the directory listings are arranged by the street and the street number. The people are listed as follows; Name, (profession or trade, location of occupation, type of business employed at.), and bds. if that person was listed as a boarder. All of the businesses and industries are listed by the type of business or name of the establishment, the proprietor, (proprietor's residence) and, when possible, a list of employees or tenants listed under each establishment. You will notice that there wasn't much in the terriory north of the rail yard. This is because most the land had not been not platted and the ones were hadn't been developed. All of the listings that do not indicate specific locations or are questionable are marked with a question mark.

The Indian and Pioneer Directory of the Saginaw Valley 1866 - 1867 indicates that a few people existed near the East Saginaw Salt Works on North Washington and Garrison's and McLean's lumber mills on North Water, but do not give their exact spot. However, there was enough information supplied to indicate that they all lived north of the F. & P. M. R. R. yards. The location of the East Saginaw Salt Works was on the north side of North Washington near the foot of 5th and 6th Streets (See section M in the Atlas of Saginaw Co., published by F. W. Beers in 1877.). This site is now part of the Saginaw Rock Products Company plant. The McLean Lumber Mill was situated along the river in line with 2nd street and the Garrison Mill may have been somewhere between McLean's Mill and the rail road tracks. The section of North Water Street north of the rail yards was vacated in the late 1800's and no longer exists.

The history of East Saginaw in the Indian & Pioneer Directory of the Saginaw Valley opens with the experiences of the canvassers on their journey to East Saginaw on the Flint & Pere Marquette Rail Road. The author breifly described their arrival at the original Potter Street depot. This passenger station was constructed around 1862 and was situated near the north west corner of Potter and North Franklin streets. Originally, North Franklin went north beyond Potter Street. Below is the account of their trip just as published in the directory back in 1866.

"Coming here from Detroit, strangers find little to admire in the suburbs of the city, that surround the depot at the foot of Franklin street--they have been hurried over miles of well-tilled land, and great stretches of timber; past lakes and streams, and low hills; fields ornamented with farm products; great farm houses and little pioneer cottages; piles of lumber shingles and staves; -- past these they have been carried, and are glad to hear the shrill whistle of the locomotive as it dashes in at the station. Here we meet our stranger friends, as the citizens of East Saginaw are always glad to do, and show them about the City.

"Let us while our companions are finding seats in the comfortable street cars, just glance around our surroundings. Close at hand are the usual unattractive out-buildings connected with the Rail Road station. Before us is a better class of houses rising higher as the distance increases towards the business center of the City. A few prominent structures rise above the rest; at our right the masts and cordage of vessels in the river are in full view; away at our left and partially behind us, the forest trees stand in quiet dignity; before us, the clean dry walks lined with young shade trees invite our steps down Franklin street. We will decline the tempting promenade, for the Conductor's whistle calls us to the street car. the ready Jehu gives the signal to his waiting team and we sweep around a curve from Franklin street into the center of Washington avenue, and move on through the busy street. Lining our route and along the parallel avenues are many fine dwellings, fresh with paint and wearing a pleasant home look..."





The Vassar Plank Road or now known as Holland or M-46 was built in 1868. The nineteen and one half mile road ran from East Saginaw to Vassar. This toll house was located near the East/West border of Saginaw and Buena Vista Township. Emil Prueter's (1878-1960) family homestead was located on the wooden plank road in Buena Vista, just East of Towerline. He told of the one lane road and how it was used. When two wagons met, the farmer with the empty load had to pull off the road, letting the loaded wagon pass. In the late 1800's the wooden planks were replaced by gravel and made into a two lane road.

#### BRECQUE KEITH EDDY HISTORICAL COLLECTION JANUARY 1995

DETROIT RIVER CONNECTIONS Historical and Biographical Sketches of the Eastern Great Lakes Border Region by Judy Jacobson. 190 pages. In addition to geographical descriptions of areas on both sides of the Micnigan and Canadian lands near Detroit, the author has included a map of the great lakes region, and Detroit/Winsor border region circa 1750, and a map of Detroit circa 1790. She offers many accounts by families on both American and Canadian lands.

AMERICAN PRISONERS OF THE REVOLUTION by Danske Dandridge. 504 pages. The book includes American Army and Navy servicemen captured at the time of the battle of Long Island and after the surrender of Fort Washington by the British. These prisoners were held in the New York City area, either on land, or upon prison ships located on New York area waters. In addition to some personal accounts, the entire roster of the 8,000 men imprisoned on the Old Jersey are included.

LA POPULATION DES FORTS FRANCAIS D'AMERIQUE (The French Forts of America in the 18th century) Volumes 1 and 2 by Marthe Faribault Beauregard. Volume 1 lists mostly Michigan forts, although it includes some located in Canada as well as Illinois. Bibliographies written in French are included. Volume 2 lists baptisms, marriages and burials of the french forts and establishments in North America in the 18th century. Indiana and Illinois especially are focused upon. The contents are indexed by subject and by name. Bibliographies are written in English.

GERMAN SETTLERS OF IOWA by Margaret Krug Palen. 360 pages. Not just covering lowa and the Midwest lands newly opened up by then President Lincoln and settled by German immigrants, this book organizes research which follows the decendants of these people further west to South Dakota. Many of these offspring stayed, some returned to family land in Iowa.

Each family's name is traced as far as possible, many back several centuries in Germany. Entries are listed alphabetically according to Germanic family descent. Check the introduction for a clue to how germanic names were americanized (naturalized). Information has been indexed by family name, also.

### INFORMATION IS ONLY AS GOOD AS ITS SOURCE by Doreen McLennan Weber

Since 1962 I have been working on the genealogy of Johann C WEBER and his wife Kunigunde nee BERNTHAL WEBER who were among the first 15 settlers of Frankenmuth, Michigan in 1845. My quest began in 1961 after marrying a WEBER descendant whose mother was a LORENZ LOESEL descendant (he was also among the original 15 settlers).

The search has been complicated by the couple giving 6 of their 7 living sons the first name of Johann. Then two of the Johann brothers married BURKHARDT sisters and the records in the Hoyt Genealogy Library files have their families and wives incorrect and intertwined in various ways. Fortunately, through church records, relative interviews, old pictures, marriage records, birth records and land records, I feel I've correctly sorted out the families and each families descendants.
