There are many rumors current on the streets that Issac BEARINGER is buying up Union Park stock for the prupose of closing it up and selling the ground for building lots. Yesterday was Thomas STEEL's 67th birthday, and in honor of the event a number of his Scotch friends and others gathered in the evening at his pleasant residence, 401 Maple street, and helped him celebrate it in good old-fashioned style. Scotch songs and recitations were given with infinite grace and spirit by the talented Miss BERGEN; Alic BIRSA pretty little daughter, executed a variety of Scotch dances under the inspiration of the stirring notes of the bag-pipe, played by Colin CAMPBELL, of Bay City, who by his skill delighted the hearts of all true Scotchmen. George SMITH also rendered some songs of Scotia, and Dan FORREST delivered a speech in his usual felicitous manner, giving a sketch of Mr STEEL's life which was happily responded to by Mr STEEL himself, who also sang with great effect "Gae Bring to Me the Guid Auld Harp" The happy affair concluded by all joining hands and singing "Auld Lang Syne," after which, with hearty congratulations, the members of the jolly gathering dispersed to their several homes.



TRACING ONE'S ANCESTRY

Genealogy Appears to Be a One Sided and Partial Thing

A conversation among a group of people the other day, all of whom were of good New England families, brought out some curious admissions. Only one of the party could trace his descent, in the line of mothers, farther than to his grandmother, though several could trace it very much farther in the paternal line, and even in what they called the "maternal line" which meant of course the mother's father's family. All present could tell the maiden name of their mother's mother, but only one could tell the maiden name of her mother. Of course many in New England among those genealogically careful people who can tell you the names of all their 10 great great grandfathers and grandmothers can do this, but these are comparatively few. And those who cannot carry back the line of mothers more than three generations include the representatives of some of the most aristocratic families in New England, whose line of paternal descent is unbroken to the settlement and beyond.

Let us think for a moment what this question involves. Suppose you write down your own name. Then write down on one line just above it the names of your father and mother - the father's name first on the left, the mother's second on the right. You perceive that these two people had an equal interest in your being. There is at least a chance that you are like your mother in important physical and mental respects.

Now, set down on a line above these two names the names of your grandfathers and grandmothers, beginning with your father's father and ending with your mother's mother. These two couples again had as much interest in your father and your mother as your father and mother had in you, and there is in you as much of your mother's mother as there is of your father's father. Now above this line write down the names of your eight grandparents - which you should surely be able to do if you are a Yankee. Each one of these eight had an equal interest in you. Now you perceive that you have a pyramid standing on its apex. You are the apex. The left hand edge of it is your line of fathers, and on the right hand of it is your line of mothers.

In all likelihood you derive rather more of your characteristics from the right hand edge of the pyramid than you do from the left and while in all probability if you are from a good New England family, you can go on stretching out the left hand edge of the inverted pyramid you cannot go on with the right hand edge any farther, and this means that your genealogy is a one sided and partial thing. --- Boston Transcript

He suffered an attack of la grippe last winter but recovered somewhat though his last illness was due to its effects. He was 69 years old. Deceased was born at Lands Krona, Kreiss Ham, Province of Westphalia Prussia Nov 1, 1832. He came to Saginaw county in 1850 and was one of the first settlers in this locality. He has held offices of trust in Blumfield township and was widely known. He leaves a widow and nine children. They are Mrs Fred DITTMAR, Mrs Frank TUREK, Mrs William SCHROEDER and Frederick and William LANDSKROENER of Saginaw. Henry and Theodore LANDSKROENER and Miss Amelia LANDSKROENER of Blumfield, and Charles LANDSKROENER of California. The funeral will take place at 1 o'clock Saturday afternoon at the family residence. Rev Conrad Volz officiating.

THE SAGINAW MEN WON
In a Dispute as to the Unloading of a Boat

The steambarge H E Runnels reached Bay City yesterday morning, with lumber from Duluth consigned to Saginaw parties. The boat was drawing too much water to get up the river and so the captain decided that he would lighten a part of the cargo. This he proceeded to do as soon as possible, securing longshoremen from Saginaw for that purpose.

This aroused the ire of the members of the Bay City Longshoremen's union. They claimed that an agreement had been effected early in the season by which the men from the two cities were prohibited from infringing upon the other's territory, the division line being fixed at Melbourne.

The Bay City men appealed to their mayor in the matter and that gentleman interviewed the captain. The Saginaw men had no desire to violate any agreement and acted perfectly fair in the case by listening attentively with the captain to the complaint. Finally it was agreed to have the boat moved up the river further and across the so-called agreement line, which was done.
