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EVENTS OF A YEAR
A Backward Glance at things of 1891

Matters of Importance That Have Occurred in This Vicinity, Making an Epitome of News of Interest to Many Readers. Given in an Abbreviated Form.

Following its usual custom, THE NEWS, today being the last of the year, presents to its readers a resume of the principal events which have helped make up the year's history in this vicinity. It is a varied list, and one which many will find interesting:

2. Charles MILLER suicided in jail
6. Vegetable hall destroyed by fire; loss, \$3,000
12. Fire destroys two valuable horses and a large barn and contents belonging to Capt C D LITTLE; loss, \$2,500
13. Failure of Cornick & Meyers, boot and shoe merchants; liabilities \$19,000 death of Wm LLOYD who left an estate of \$150,000
15. Fourth annual session Michigan Master House Painters; Frank ROCK's 6-year-old son killed by being run over with a wagon
16. Wylie Bros' shingle mill burned down
22. County Superintendent of the Poor John CREEN died
26. Architect W T COOPER's plans for the city hall adopted by the council; the PALMER murder trial commenced.
27. Meeting of the State Veterinary association
28. Arrest of John HOWARD for stealing \$4,000 worth of diamonds from a New York Hotel
30. Swinton & Reynolds' store burglarized of a large quantity of gold pens; Rev Teho NELSON elected president of Kalamazoo college; East Saginaw club holds its first annual reception

4. Largest meeting of salt manufacturers for years in session to consider the reorganization of the Michigan Salt association
