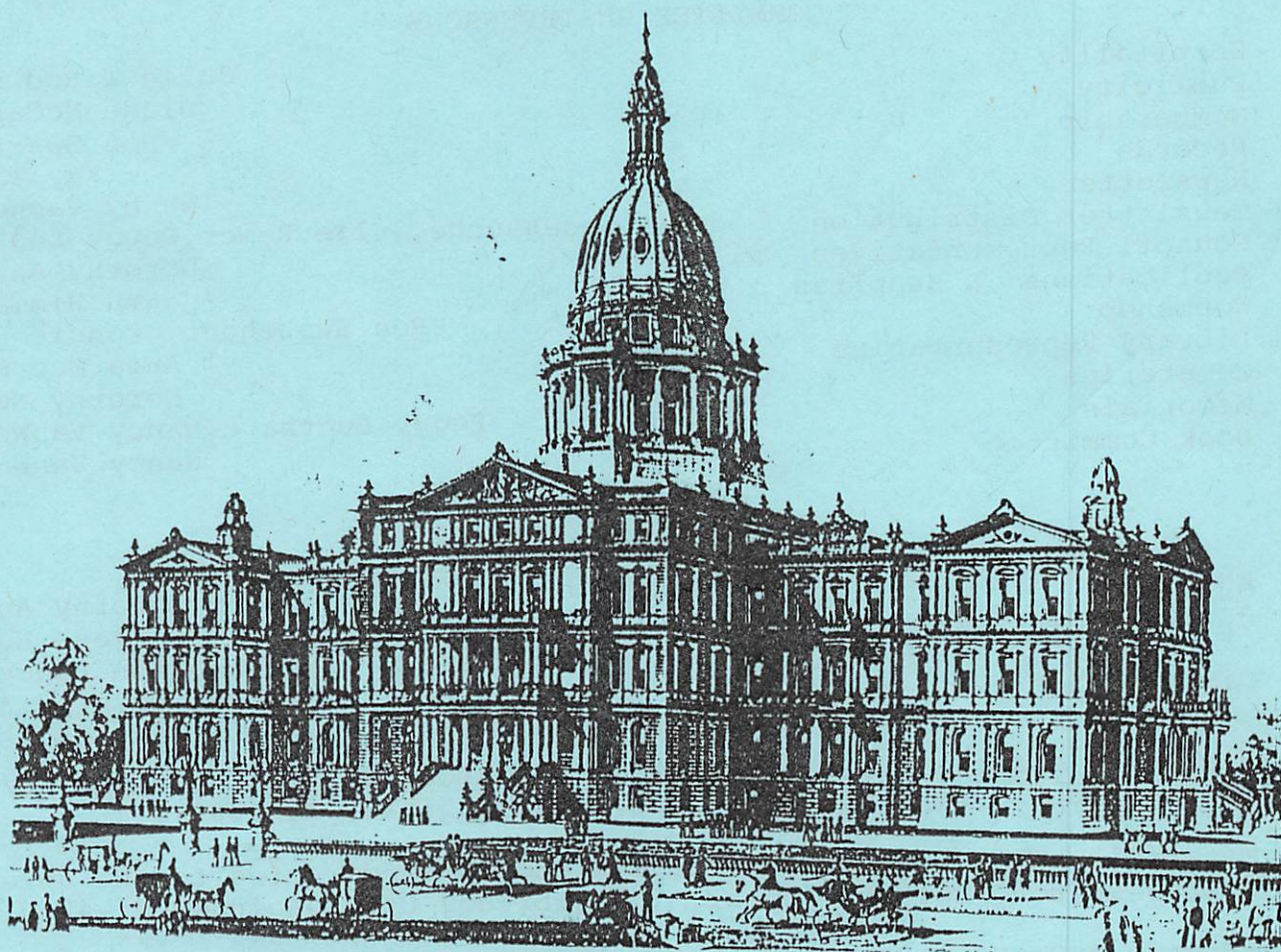

At the company's peak, Durant-Dort was not only an assembly company, but was making its own wheels, axles, paints, varnishes, and buggy tops and controlled its own sources of lumber. Besides its plants and subsidiaries in Flint, it had interests in Blount Carriage and Buggy, Atlanta, Georgia; Atlanta Wheel and Axle, East Point, Georgia; Dominion Carriage, Toronto, Canada; Pine Bluff Spoke, Pine Bluff, Arkansas; Hughes-Purcell Paint, Kansas City, Missouri; and hickory forests and mills in Tennessee and Arkansas. Estimates of production during this period range from 75,000 to 150,000 vehicles a year, but production figures for the carriage industry are difficult to pin down.

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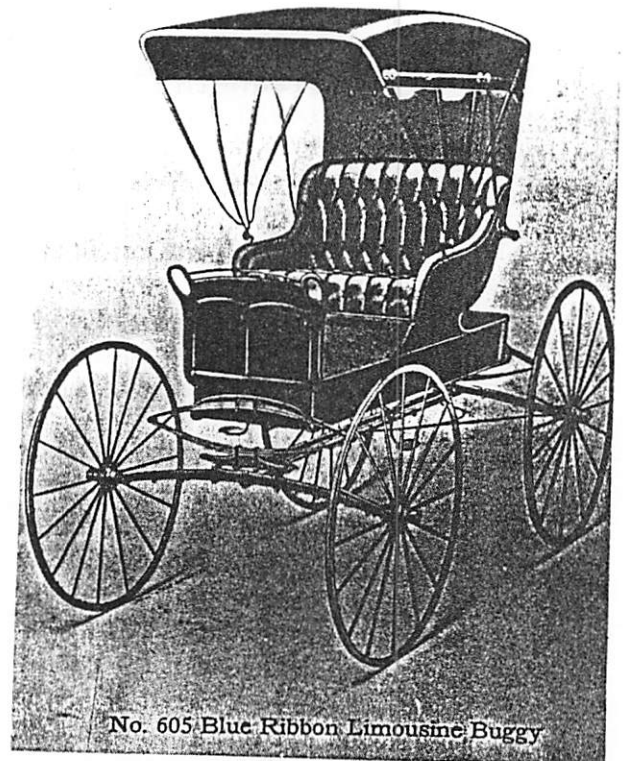

New York, April 6, 1891

Dear Parents and Brothers and Sister,

You will all be angry with me for not writing to you for so long. You also did not write. We thought you might not be alive anymore.

Dear Parents, I am fine. Thank God, so is my husband.

Father, you asked if I am going to work and what kind of household I have. I am not going to work. My husband makes enough money. A brother-in-law is living with us. I do his laundry and some cooking. He pays me \$3.50.

Our household is very simple. It is better to save some money and not spend it on things we don't need. One thing we don't have yet and you wanted to give us as a wedding gift is a feather bed.

Dear parents, please roll it tightly in waterproof material to make it a small parcel so that I don't have to pay so much duty. June 7th is my husband's birthday. Could you send him one of those nice pipes they have in Germany? You could put it inside the bed.

I hope we don't wait that long anymore to write to one another.

I never wrote you that my husband is working as a machinist in a factory for 3 years already.

Dear parents, how about Margarethe, wouldn't she want to come to America? She would make a little money faster than in Germany. If you can't make it in New York, you can't make it anywhere.

I will close now with greetings to you all.
