## City's Hotel History Told

There's a dish of hash in Saginaw's past. It probably has been as important in spreading the name of Saginaw throughout the land as the pine forests and salt wells.

It all began one day in 1872 in the Bancroft House's kitchen where Chef George COBB was mulling over in his mind what to do with some left-over boiled potatoes.

George diced the potatoes, then like a good chef does, he proceeded by taste. He added some corned beef, a cup of coffee cream, a few nutmeats and a pinch of salt, stirred the mixture together, and then separated it in patties. These he browned on both sides in butter.

Presto! The now world famous Bancroft Corned Beef Hash dish was invented. The name "Bancroft Corned Beef Hash" appears on menus in better eating places throughout the United States, in Cuba, in France. And the Bancroft is justly proud of its corned beef hash. It goes to great lengths to keep its tasty culinary attraction at perfection at all times--even curing and making the corned beef that goes into the hash.

The hash helped make the Bancroft House known far and wide as a fine hotel, a reputation earned and enjoyed during its 89 years of serving the traveling public and acting as gracious host to most important community events.

The Bancroft isn't Saginaw's only hotel, nor was it the first. But it is the oldest hotel in the City and is Saginaw's best. The hotel business is one of the oldest businesses in the world. The truly great hotels are the ones which have that friendly knack of making a person feel at home, almost to the point where he could go down into the kitchen and make himself a Swiss-cheese-on-rye at midnight.

Hotels started out like that in the pioneer days. Back then Saginaw was just a cluster of houses stuck away in a forest of pine trees. Travel was difficult. When a family had guests who came any appreciable distance, the guests stayed.

Some people made better hosts than others. Travelers singled them out. Eleazer JEWETT and his wife were generous hosts. They lived in a log cabin at Green Point and many strangers came to their home for entertainment.

It finally reached the point where Mr and Mrs JEWETT decided to make a better thing out of their hospitality. In 1837 they moved into a two-story frame building on Niagara (then Water) between Clinton and Throop, and started Jewett's Hotel.

Their ability to delight travelers continued and the business prospered for more than 20 years. Maiden's Log Tavern, at what is now Court and Hamilton, also was a well-known place in those days, and Major MOSELY's log cabin, within the old Fort Saginaw stockade, was a rendezvous few pioneer travelers missed.

When the Webster House was opened in 1838 and quickly became recognized as the leading hotel in the Saginaw Valley, the old log houses lost their popularity.

The Webster House stood at Michigan and Cleveland. It was a spacious thing with a Grecian portico. Fluted columns sustained the entablature. There was a broad veranda, and a fine basement.

Even in a hotel in those days time often passed slowly, and the local characters relieved the monotony with a bit of horseplay. One time something or other brought a lot of people into Saginaw to stay at the Webster House.

The country folk took off their boots, shoes and stockings in the office and walked barefoot upstairs to bed. After the hotel had quieted down and the snoring had indicated the guests were sleeping, a couple of the hotel employees proceeded to blacken one of every pair of boots and shoes.

When the guests came down in the morning everyone tried to get a pair of polished boots or shoes. Some didn't even know their own and looked half an hour for them. During the day nearly every man on the streets had on one polished shoe and one dull one. As history records it, the stunt was a great ad for the Webster House.

Jesse HOYT, one of East Saginaw's greatest benefactors, came to the conclusion in 1858 that the struggling community of East Saginaw needed a good hotel. He proceeded at once to start construction, and it was finished in 1859, one of the finest hotels in Michigan. HOYT named it the Bancroft House in honor of his intimate friend, George BANCROFT, the renowned historian.

The Bancroft House was opened formally Sept 7 of that year with festivities that made the pine forests whisper still louder in the quiet pioneer nights. The first proprietor of the hotel was Henry HOOPS of New York who brought from the big city the furniture and fittings valued at \$15,000., a sizable amount in those days.

The hotel was pretentious. The main entrance was on Genesee about 50 feet from Washington and there was a woman's entrance on Washington. The hotel's appointments included a shaving salon, billiard room 32 x 60 feet in size and equipped with four tables, a reading room and a kitchen equal to that of any hotel East or West.

Saginaw may have been a raw lumber town where the famous Red Sash brigade fought with fists and caked boots in saloons and in front of the many sporting houses of that era. But when a boss lumberman wanted to take his ease, he wanted the best. The Bancroft answered the taste for fine living.

The opening celebration must have been something to see. The Osmend Cornet Band turned out in full uniform. Dr A W BUTLER correspondent of the Buffalo Courier thought so much of the possibilities of a story that he made the journey to be present.

No fewer than eight steamers landed at the Saginaw wharves between 9 am and 6 pm when a delicious banquet was served.

The Bancroft offered everything from mock turtle soup to fruits and nuts. There were pike and whitefish prepared in various styles, cold dishes of boiled tongue, ham, corned beef, chicken salad, boiled beef, leg of mutton, chicken and pork, and turkey with egg sauce.

Don't falter now. There also were 13 roasts, including bear, turkey with cranberry sauce, venison, pig, chicken and wild duck. The entrees included fricasseed pigeon, chicken a la Marergo, pork cutlets and venison steak. There was a variety of stewed and boiled vegetables to tempt every taste.

Of pastry, there were farina pudding with claret sauce, peach, apple, and cranberry pie, sponge cake au chocolate, blanc mange, rum jelly, and lemon and vanilla ice cream. The finale had the fruits and nuts.

Apparently, Saginaw's forefathers not only were good lumbermen, they also had hearty appetites and stomachs innocent of ulcers.

Tables were set for 300 guests, but more than that came. According to the story, one came who wasn't invited. The story is worth repeating—it may be true, too, because Saginaw's lumber bosses were rugged individuals.

The uninvited guest was Curt EMERSON, a man who made a fortune out of lumber and a lot of enemies the night the Bancroft opened. Why he wasn't invited isn't known. Anyhow, the story goes, Curt showed up.

He eyed the assembled guests, the women in their finery and the table set with expensive crystal and silver. Suddenly, Curt leaped on top of one of the long tables, and proceeded to stalk its length, kicking crystal and silver and food in every direction. The next day, sober again, he paid for the damage.

That bit of folklore, no matter how revealing of the character of the hard bitten men who cut the pine here, can't be substantiated in any available history. Mills History of Saginaw lists Curtis EMERSON as one of the committee who arranged the opening celebration: with the implied conclusion that EMERSON was present in dignity and poise when the grand event was held.

Anyhow, George BANCROFT himself was present at the affair along with Gov Moses WISNER. There, too, were the local dignitaries in their best bib and tucker. Those who could walk away from the well filled table next went to the ballroom. The Saginaw Courier reporter wrote this about the event.

"Terpsichorean festivities went on till the glorious ring of day had deeply tinged the eastern horizon with streakings of the morning light, when the gallant cavaliers escorted their ladye loves to their respective homes. They danced all night till broad daylight, and went home with the gals in the morning.

"During the whole of the festivities, from first to last, there was nothing to mar the harmony of the occasion, and everything passed off to the entire satisfaction of all."

After 56 years of faithful service, the old Bancroft was closed on Aug 28, 1915. The Bancroft Realty Co was formed in 1915 to acquire and hold the hotel property so long owned by the HOYT Estate and to erect a new, modern fireproof structure. The old building was torn down and the present structure of Ionic style architecture was completed in 1916. In 1925, the hotel added 100 more rooms with an addition on Genesee.

The Bancroft once sported a popular roof garden. Back in the early 1920's, an outdoor dance and dining place was erected on the roof of the Bancroft property along South Washington. The present second story had not yet been built.

Many of the name bands of that period played at the roof garden, and the spot was one of the frequented rendezvous by the city's night life addicts. The roof garden was discarded around 1924 when the Washington side addition was constructed.

The Fordney Hotel has its roots deep in one of Saginaw's most historic spots. The hotel is located on the site of old Fort Saginaw, erected in 1822.

William H TAYLOR, an enterprising capitalist of Saginaw City (West Side) built a large pretentious hotel at Court and Hamilton in 1866. It was known as the Taylor House, and was a four-story brick structure, 75 x 120 feet in size.

It was arranged for stores on Court Street and the main entrance was on Hamilton. It had 90 rooms, all well furnished in the style which followed the Civil War.

About 1870 I H HOPKINS leased the hotel and conducted it for several years. The house was closed about 1879, but reopened the next January by Lorenzo BURROWS Jr & Co. Four years later it was

closed again. Some months later BURROWS & SWEET took charge. Later Fred B SWEET managed the house alone. Around 1895 the old Taylor House was closed and remained dark for 15 years.

Then West Side business men, recognizing the need for a first class hotel in that section, formed a company, purchased the property, remodeled the building, and named it the Hotel Fordney after Congressman Joseph W FORDNEY, who was one of the promoters.

Two hotels, very popular during those early days and still in existence although under different names, were the Sherman House, at Tuscola and Baum, and the Naegely House at 200 North Jefferson. The Sherman House now is the Roberts Hotel and the Naegely House is the Wesley Hotel.

A hotel that was tremendously popular with the lumbermen in the 1870's was the Everett House, which was built in 1864. The Everett House was torn down in the 20's and the present Goff Building, Genesee and Franklin, was erected on the site.

One of Saginaw's popular hotels and a leading rival of the Bancroft in its day was the Hotel Vincent, at Federal and Washington. It was opened in 1890 with a ceremony that was in keeping with the grand manner. The hotel was partly destroyed by fire and within the past 25 years was torn down. Goodyear Tire took over the location.

Only two of Saginaw's hotels have had fires of any serious consequence. One was the Wright Hotel, in the 100 block South Washington; which burned Jan 12, 1918, with the loss of six lives, and the other was the Ben Franklin Hotel, 100 block South Franklin; which burned Aug 21 1928. Two firemen were killed.

The Franklin Hotel is in the old Kirby office building, which was completely remodeled for the hotel. It opened in 1915. It is Saginaw's second largest East Side hotel, and has had a varied career. It now is operated by Saginaw Hotels Corp. The Mertz Hotel, 401 Genesee, a stag hotel, was opened in the same year.

The Franklin Hotel was sold last month to Eugene McCLURE of Alma and his wife and two sisters. McCLURE operated the widely known Wright Hotel and the McClure Hotel at Alma. Only the hotel business was purchased, the building is owned by Dr Burr W LATHROP and the Duane W DRAPER estate.

The invention of the automobile, good roads and the airplane have taken a terrific toll of hotels. Back when Ma and Pa relied on the railroad train and the horse and buggy to get to places, the people who did any traveling at all had to have hotel accommodations.

At the peak of the railroad business in Saginaw at least 30 passenger trains a day would arrive and leave from the Pere Marquette station on Potter Street. But even the station has changed--now it's the Chesapeake & Ohio station, and passenger traffic is down to a shadow of its former self.

But, when Potter Street was bustling with activity from the busy trains two hotels started there that were popular with travelers, the Ferguson House, 408-410 Potter, and the Holzheimer House, 506-510 Potter. The decline of railroad passenger traffic helped kill those hotels. The Ferguson House first was known as the Irving House, later as the Green Hotel.

Other early hotels included the Dittmar Hotel, 301 South Hamilton, built in 1882 and now used by Pit & Balcony as its workshop and practice place, The Saratoga Hotel, frequented by theatrical folk was at Water and Federal, on space now occupied by The News' pressroom.

The Park Hotel, which had a rather rough and ready reputation, was at 2361 South Michigan. It longs since has been torn down. The Veague Hotel was on Genesee where the Second National Bank

Building entrance now is. It was more famous as the Roberts Restaurant, long one of early Saginaw's best eating places.

Some of the early hotels which were popular in their day still are operating. One of these is the Atlantic Hotel, 110 1/2 North Warren-which for many years was run by John L HAY legendary inventor of the hot dog.

One of the advertisements of this hotel read:

"It is perfectly all right for you to pay \$2.50 or \$3.00 for a night's lodging if you want to, and be compelled to wash in dirty river water-you do not have to do this in Saginaw if you come to the Atlantic Hotel.

"You get a single room for 75 cents or a dollar room with all the frills left off, just good, clean outside rooms, 7 x 16: has transom and outside window: 3 pound Velvet Brussels carpet: 3-piece hardwood bedroom suite: woven wire springs: hair mattress: "good as gold" sheeting: soft goose feather pillows: enough electric lights to find a collar button.

"The dollar rooms are larger but no better than the 75-cent rooms: the \$1.50 rooms for two people are a little nicer, having two front windows. Special rates for the week, \$3.00 and up."

Comparison of Saginaw City directories of 1947 and 1901 shows the reduction of hotels in the City in the past 46 years. In 1901 there were 31 hotels, now there are 13.

Other early hotels not previously mentioned were the Hotel Kerby, 320 North Hamilton: Hotel Strasburg, Lapeer and Warren: Inter-national Hotel, 232 North Franklin: Marshall House, Franklin and Federal (now the Franklin Apartments): Messner Hotel, 128 South Weadock: Nehls Hotel, 501 South Hamilton: Pacific Hotel, 715 North Jefferson, still operating: American Hotel, 117 North Hamilton: Anchor House, 900 Genesee: Benjamin House, 307 South Hamilton: Bourcier House, 401 North Hamilton: City House, 511 South Harrison: Crowley House, 301 North Hamilton (now the famous Schuch Hotel): Crystal House, 1261 South Washington: Dunbar House, 305 VanBuren: European Hotel, 110 North Warren: Parker House, 505 South Fayette (still operating) Reed House, 404 West Genesee: Saginaw Valley House, 521 Lyon: Schneider Hotel, 634 North Washington: Tuscola House, 302 North Franklin, and Woodbine House, 2370 Mackinaw.

They've all had their day, some gay, some not so gay. Their names bring back memories of pine and the shouts of the lumberjack. But things don't stand still--not in the hotel business.

## **YOUR FAMILY'S HISTORY**

### **Hoyt Library Has Genealogical Volumes**

Every year shows an increasing interest among people generally, in their family histories. As people have more leisure and better opportunities for study, they are more and more interested in who their forefathers were, and what they did. This interest in earlier generations has brought about the collecting of genealogical material in increasing quantities and a collection of some 270 volumes of such material is now available to the citizens of Saginaw in the Hoyt library. Extensive use is being made of these books, and investigators from other cities and even from other states are frequent users of the materials. In order that the books may be all together in one place, and be always available for study and research, they have been assembled in the east study room on the balcony floor of the library.

The most (foremost?) agency in developing interest in the subject of American genealogy has undoubtedly been the Daughters of the American Revolution and it is to the local chapter of that organization that the library owes a great deal in the promotion of interest in Saginaw. Also, a number of sets, as well as of individual books on this subject in the library, are the property of the DAR, who have placed them there on deposit, that they may find the widest possible usefulness.

The most recent acquisition to the library's own collection has been the first 53 volumes of the New England Historical and Genealogical Register. This quarterly publication has appeared continuously since 1847, and there is now a set complete to date in the Hoyt library. It is interesting that the issue for October 1923 contains the genealogy of President Harding. In addition to actual biographical information, these volumes contain a wealth of material illustrative of the customs and the conditions of colonial life.

The lineage books of the Daughters of the American Revolution, of which 64 volumes are in the library, are the property of the Saginaw chapter of the DAR. These give a complete record of the ancestors of the members of the society and the collateral information given presents much of value to the student of American history, whether he is engaged in genealogical research or not.

A volume of special interest is one in manuscript with the title "Some Genealogical Notes on Early American Families." prepared as a result of her own research by Mrs Fred W Culver of Saginaw.

A considerable number of volumes deal with the early history of several of the eastern states, particularly the New England states and New York, where most of the early records have been preserved.

Other books are those dealing with the history of specific families or groups of families. These books enlarged the scope of the collection greatly but since each one is limited to its field, it is somewhat outside the province of a public library to spend its funds for volumes of this character. The library is therefore dependent upon gifts to add to its collection of individual family histories, and it is hoped that those who have such histories may be willing to place them in the library collection in order that they may be available to the largest possible number of users.
