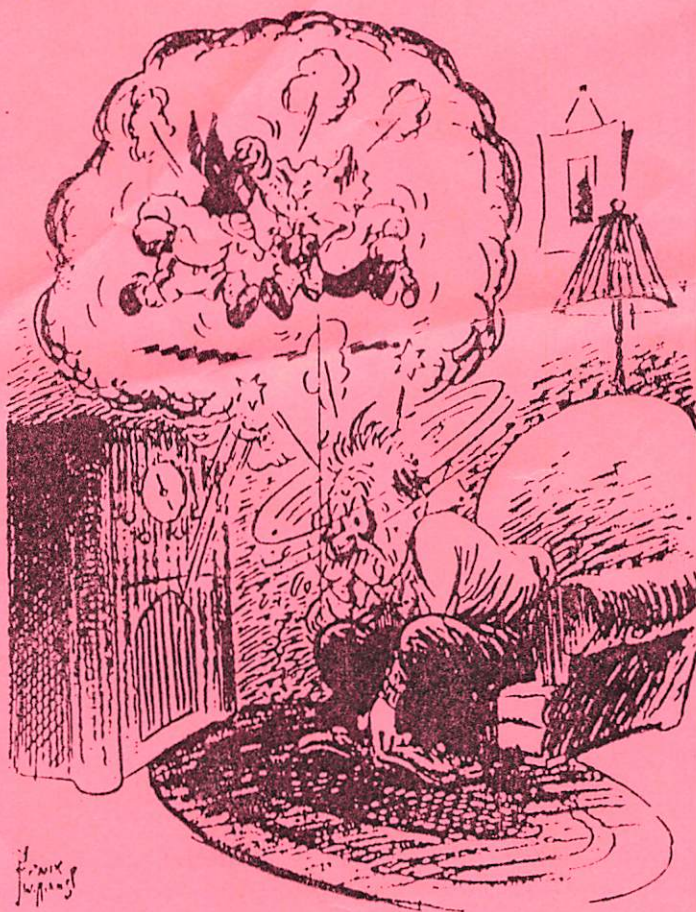

The Last Group --- after the Sir Isaac Newton Ship ---
STEPHANIE

The "Stephanie" carried the last of the 1843 emigrants to the Town of Wheatfield in Western New York, Niagara County.

These folk were "freibauers", landowners, from the Walmow area.

They were held up for weeks when they attempted to leave, without their consent papers, when their neighbors left. They got halfway to Hamburg but at Havelberg they were intercepted by the provincial police and forced to return to Walmow. The ship list shows that when they were at last able to go, they took the first available passage with immigrants from all over Germany, a full two months after the Sir Isaac Newton brought the next-to-the-last of these East Prussians.

STATE AND LOCAL VITAL RECORDS

BIRTH RECORDS

The first attempt of the Michigan legislature to create a state-wide compulsory system for the recording of important information relating to births and other vital data was made in 1867 as Public Act 194. This law required the township supervisors to collect facts pertaining to all births that occurred in their jurisdictions, noting date; name of individual; gender; race; place of birth; and the names, birthplaces, occupations, and residences of the parents. By authority of Act 343 of 1925, responsibility for maintaining these statistics was transferred from the Secretary of State to the Department of Public Health, where control remains today. In 1978, by authority of PA 368, the legislature restricted access to all birth registers and indexes. Consequently, for the time being, none of the birth records listed below can be examined by researchers. Anyone wishing to obtain birth certificates (or any other vital record) should contact the Vital Statistics Section, Department of Public Health, 3423 North Logan, Lansing 48909 (517) 335-8655.

DIVORCE RECORDS

The Michigan legislature, under authority of Act 9 of 1897, required all circuit court clerks to notify the Secretary of State of all petitions for divorce filed in their respective counties. These reports were to include the names and ages of the parties involved, names and ages of all children in the family, date and place of petition for divorce, and county where the marriage was performed. In 1923 (PA 27) the law was changed, directing the circuit court clerks to submit their reports to the Department of Public Health.

DEATH RECORDS

In 1867 (PA 194) the Michigan legislature passed a law requiring township supervisors to collect data on the deaths occurring within their jurisdictions. The statute mandated that certain facts be entered on forms provided by the Secretary of State, with return thereof to Lansing via the county clerks. The information to be recorded was name of deceased; date and place of death; gender; race; marital status; age; nativity; cause of death; plus names and occupations of parents. In 1925, by authority of Act 343, the duties of the Secretary of State concerning the registration of deaths were transferred to the Department of Public Health.

MARRIAGE RECORDS

In 1867 the state legislature passed Act 194 requiring every justice of the peace, minister of the gospel, and all other persons authorized to solemnize marriages in Michigan to make note of each marriage performed by them and to deliver to the clerk of the county in which such marriage took place documentary evidence that the ceremony had occurred. Information to be recorded was date; names of the parties involved; their ages; race; residence; birth places; occupations; number of times previously married; place of marriage; the couple's parents' names; the name of the presiding official; plus the names and residences of the witnesses. These facts were to be recorded by the receiving county clerk and then forwarded to the Secretary of State. In 1921, by virtue of Act 170, the duties of the Secretary of State with respect to marriage records were transferred to the Department of Public Health.
