MILLER'S MANUEL: A RESEARCH GUIDE TO THE MAJOR FRENCH-CANADIAN GENEALOGICAL RESOURCES, WHAT THEY ARE AND HOW TO USE THEM by Douglas J. Miller.

Anyone conducting French-Canadian research should use this manual as a guide when using the following resources: Tanguay-Jette-Drouin-PRDH-Loiselle and Baptismal, Marriage and Burial Records. This guide takes each reference source and gives a description and detailed instructions on how to use the resources – in English! A must have for anyone who has trouble interpreting the French language or beginners to French-Canadian genealogy.

PSYCHIC ROOTS and MORE PSYCHIC ROOTS: Adventures in Serendipity & Intuition in Genealogy by Henry Z. Jones, Jr. An inspiring collection of stories by genealogists that have experienced the “magic” of finding their ancestors or living relatives in unexpected places. Some of us may have experienced the thrill of the book that happens to fall from the shelf and opens up to the ancestor that we have been searching for, or while visiting a cemetery, we hear a loud bird that happens to be standing on the grave of an ancestor, or while visiting a research center, overhearing a conversation of people who are researching the same family. If you are at a standstill in your research – these volumes may give you the inspiration you need to keep going!

SCOTS IN THE WEST INDIES, 1707-1857 by David Dobson

In 1707 trade restrictions were lifted between Scotland and the English colonies and this lead to an increasing number of Scottish settlements to the islands. The West Indian population also increased following the American War of Independence, when many Loyalists, including Scots, took refuge on the islands. Trading was then established with the ports of Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Charleston and Savannah and many families eventually moved to these areas. This volume contains a surname listing containing miscellaneous biographical information such as birth dates, occupation, emigration information and death dates.

NORTON—Morris NORTON, a veteran of the Civil War, and a resident of Michigan for the last 65 years, died at his home, 223 Hess avenue, at 4 o'clock yesterday morning of general debility, aged 84 years. Mr NORTON was born in Chautauqua county,

New York, Sept 12, 1827. When a child his parents moved to Ashtabula, Ohio. In 1846 he came to Michigan, locating in Lansing. He was married to Miss Mary E BAKER in 1851. After their marriage they lived in Lansing until 1896, when they came to Saginaw, which has since been their home. Mr NORTON enlisted in Co B, Second Infantry Michigan volunteers, known as Berdan's Sharp Shooters, and served his enlistment but was unable to re-enlist on account of failing health. Mrs NORTON died Feb 2, 1909. He leaves one son and one daughter, Louis and Mrs Frederick SERENS, both of this city. Mr NORTON was a member of Camp Sherman, NLVS, and of the Washington avenue Presbyterian church. The funeral will take place at 9 o'clock Saturday morning from the family residence. Rev C W HASTINGS officiating. The interment will be in Mt Hope cemetery, Lansing.

O'REILLY—Miss Mary O'REILLY died at the home of her brother, James O'REILLY, 823 Waller street, at 1 o'clock yesterday morning of paralysis, aged 51 years. Miss O'REILLEY was born in Brickley, Ontario, March 6, 1860. She came with her parents to Saginaw when a child and has spent the greater part of her life here. She was a member of SS Peter's and Paul's church. Fraternally she was a member of the LCBA Branch No 64. She leaves her father, James O'REILLY, of Saginaw, four sisters and three brothers, Mrs John McLEAN, Mrs B M McGINN, and Mrs Patrick CULLEN, all of Chicago; Mrs Fred ROHL of Atlanta, Ga; Thomas O'REILLY of Los Angeles, Cal, James and John O'REILLY of Saginaw. The Grand Rapids train over the Pere Marquette arrived here Saturday night several hours late due to the derailing and overturning of the engine at Edmore. Engineer John FULLER of Grand Rapids was badly scalded and Fireman EDWARDS of the place was slightly hurt. No passengers were hurt.

State Archive Nuremberg: 19th Century Emigrants from Central Franconia to North America

INTRODUCTION:

These records are based on information in the State Archive of Central Franconia (or Mittel Franken) at Nuremberg. As a Sesquicentennial gift, the city of Gunzenhausen sent this information to its sister city of Frankenmuth, Michigan. Frankenmuth Historical Assn. translated the information, compiled these charts and, when possible, added a location & reference as to where in N. America the settler arrived (set off by: []). If there are any questions regarding accuracy, researchers should request to see copies of the original records in Germany and for this reason will need the reference and the archive's address (there is a fee):

A Very Short Explanation of Reference Abbreviations
(a fuller explanation can be found in the first issue of this series, Volume 29 Issue 3):

Intelligenzblatt fuer Mittelfranken (abbreviated "Intellig.BI.f.Mfr."), Kreis-Amtsblatt fuer Mittelfranken ("Krs.A.BI.f.Mfr."), Intelligenzblatt fuer den Rezat-Kreis ("Intellig.BI.f.d.Rezat-Kreis"), and Boten von Altdorf are official newspapers in which prospective legal emigrants published the fact that they were leaving Germany. The remainder of the reference is: the year, part (Beilage), number, column, and date of publication (the month is usually in Roman numerals).

"Reg.v.Mfr.K.d.I." is the abbreviation for "Regierung von Mittel Franken Kammer des Inneren" (Chamber of the Interior for Central Franconia, located in Ansbach), a department of the provincial administration. If one wished to see copies of the papers of Mathias Abelein, one would order them from the State Archive in Nuremberg, referring to, "Reg.v.Mfr.KdI, Abg.1932, Titulus Ia, Nr.57740/I" (the reference listed for that record). "Abgabe" (abbreviated "Abg.") refers to the year records were transferred to the State Archive in Nuremberg.

Other references indicate the administrative town near the emigrant's home (see the first issue for a fuller explanation of the various terms). If one wanted a copy of Walburga Abele's records, they would give the reference for that record: "LRA Eichstaett, Abgabe1981, Nr.676/1/4" (LRA=the office of the "Landkreis", called the "Landratsamt", in this case the city of Eichstaett). If one wanted a copy of Joh. Jakob Ackermann's records they would give the reference for that record: "BA Ansbach, Abgabe1930, Nr.427/441" (BA="Bezirksamt", in this case the city of Ansbach). "Herrschafsgericht", "Gericht- & Polizeibehoerde" and "Lg.ä.O." are other terms for types of administrative towns. In the "Hometown" column, the second town listed is one of these types of administrative towns. Unless noted, it is the "Landgericht" (LG.) of the first town listed in that column.
