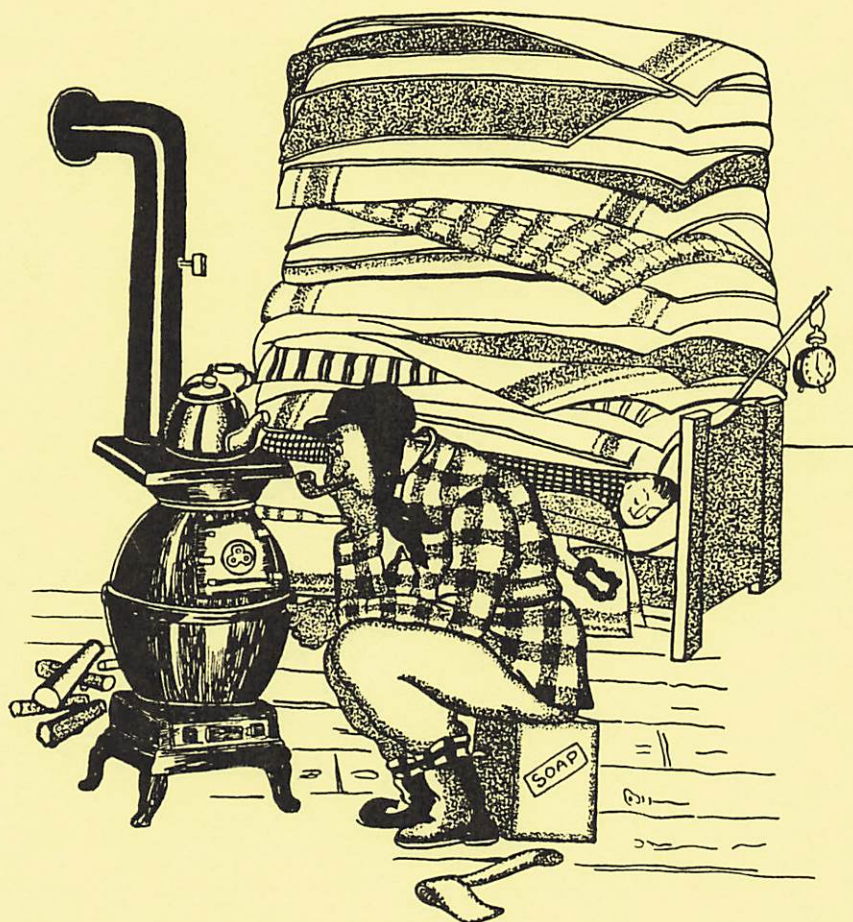

NO MORE UNKNOWN DEAD IN THE CITY CEMETERIES

**The Government Has Provided Headstones for Those Who Laid Down Their Lives
in Defense of Home and County-A Patriotic Task Performed.**

The COURIER-HERALD recently noted the receipt from the Quartermaster General's department at Washington of a large number of headstones, designed to be placed at the heads of soldiers' graves in Brady Hill, Forest Lawn and the Catholic cemeteries. The stones are of white Vermont marble, 3 ½ feet long, 14 inches wide and 4 inches thick, and although small and plain, give mute evidence that a grateful Republic has not forgotten the brave deeds of its sons in other days. Each stone bears the name, rank, company initial, number of regiment and date of death of the soldier who sleeps beneath, these facts being set forth in raised letters. The Government furnishes the stones and pays the freight on them, and the several G. A. R. posts look after the work of setting them. Col. E. F. Guild, one of the cemetery committee for the present year, has had personal supervision of the work and has nearly completed his labors. He has made a complete and accurate record of the life history and service of every soldier whose dust is mouldering in the earth, the collection of such data and information involving considerable time and work.

The first list of unmarked graves in the cemetery(s) on the east side numbered 53, and this number of stones was received and raised over the mounds where sleep the following named soldiers:

Subsequently it was found three graves in Forest Lawn and one in Brady Hill were unmarked, those of **Robert Alexander, Louis Delavergne, Peter Mallett and Eli Morse**, and stones have been ordered for them

There are now no unknown graves in Saginaw, although the location of the resting place of one brave young fellow is not marked, time and nature having obliterated the mound which was raised over his coffin. "The circumstances of this case," said Col Guild yesterday, "were particularly sad." Our records for several years showed there was 'an unknown' buried in the Grove, but where, or who he was none knew. Within a week I have learned the facts in the case. The victim was **HENRY WRIGHTMAN**, of Genesee county, who enlisted at Flint in company K., 23d Michigan Infantry, organized by Rev. J. S. Smart. He came here with his comrades to await the filling up of the regiment. While encamped in the Grove one day the boys had a jumping match, Wrightman being the finest athlete in the company. In making an extra effort to best the record he strained himself, causing internal injuries from the effects of which he died three days later. His comrades buried him where the accident occurred, in rear of and near the home of W. G. Gage."

Another supposedly unknown grave was that of **Cosmos Bramstetter** in the Catholic cemetery, but it has been learned the stone which should have been raised over the remains was placed in Forest Lawn. This error has been rectified. The total number of soldiers buried on the east side is 107.

SAGINAW WAR NURSE LAUDED FOR JOB BEGUN IN 'SUCH A COMFORTABLE DITCH'

A delayed Associated Press dispatch from Holland brings news that a Saginaw nurse, Lt. Elizabeth C. Hogan, whose home is at 2048 Lapeer, has been awarded a certificate of merit for her part in the spectacular work done by the 41st Evacuation Hospital, first such unit to cross the Normandy beachhead. Certificates went to the physicians and nurses. Bronze Star medals to the enlisted men of the hospital force.

In a letter to her brother, Ivan C. Hogan of the police department, Lt. Hogan, writing from France on Sept. 8, exclaimed, "Thank god the battle for St. Lo is over!" and gave a few glimpses of the conditions under which the 41st Evacuation Hospital operated.

"Now that the battle is in the dimming past," she wrote, "perhaps you would like to know what this sister of yours has been doing for a living. To begin with, we were the first nurses over here, and the safest place for us when we landed was a ditch. You'd just be dumfounded to know how comfortable a ditch can be. I was!

After we got established we forgot the noise and the rest of the confusion. Once in awhile we shivered a bit and held onto our cots as we rocked in a nearby bombing raid. "you folks at home can be darned proud of the men in this American army. One afternoon I assisted with an operation on a childhood friend of yours. He said he used to go to dances with Kenneth Forbes. He will dance no more, though, because, you see, a piece of a mortar shell cut his spinal cord in two. Censorship will not allow me to tell his name."

A hint of the way those serving in the combat areas feel about the carefree gaieties of those back in the homeland comes in this comment: "A navy nurse wrote me at great length about dancing under Florida palms and stars, so I just wrote back and told her how I sometimes "danced" while we watched the tracer bullets and got out of the way of the flak. Some of the things that happened to us seem almost fantastic to us now, and I must say that the Lord kept a watchful eye out for us."

Lt. Hogan wrote of a visit to Paris, called it "a city for women", mentioned the beautiful gowns and hats and "the gorgeous perfumes", then commented on the contrast between the American nurses and the Parisian women: "The women on the streets looked us over in our steel helmets and leather boots. It certainly was a contrast. I don't think their pretty slippers would keep them very dry, nor that their fancy hats would shed much flak or shrapnel."

Lt. Hogan, a 1941 graduate of Saginaw General hospital's school of nursing, entered the army nursing service in November, 1942.

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67 NEW CITIZENS TAKE THEIR OATHS

Britain and Russia Offer Biggest Groups

Citizenship was granted to 67 of 82 Saginaw county applicants Monday in circuit court, with the new citizens listing 14 countries of origin. Great Britain led the roll with 22, Russia followed with 14 and seven from Czecho-Slovakia, five from Poland and four from Rumania were admitted. Italy and Germany had three each, Belgium and Yugoslavia two each and one came from each Mexico, Hungary, Syria, Australia and Austria.

Of the 15 failing to gain citizenship, three were absent, one was denied on residence grounds and one for lack of witnesses, and 10 were postponed or continued.

Another group of 70 applicants was being examined Tuesday. Circuit Judge William H. Martin presided Monday morning during questioning by Examiner Arthur Schwartz of Flint, with Circuit Judge James E. O'Neill continuing on the bench in the afternoon.

**State Archive Nuremberg: 19th Century Emigrants from Central Franconia to
North America**

INTRODUCTION:

These records are based on information in the State Archive of Central Franconia (or Mittel Franken) at Nuremberg. As a Sesquicentennial gift, the city of Gunzenhausen sent this information to its sister city of Frankenmuth, Michigan. Frankenmuth Historical Assn. translated the information, compiled these charts and, when possible, added a location & reference as to where in N. America the settler arrived (set off by: []). If there are any questions regarding accuracy, researchers should request to see copies of the original records in Germany and for this reason will need the reference and the archive's address (there is a fee):

A Very Short Explanation of Reference Abbreviations

(a fuller explanation can be found in the first issue of this series, Volume 29 Issue 3):

Intelligenzblatt fuer Mittelfranken (abbreviated "**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Kreis-Amtsblatt fuer Mittelfranken ("**Krs.A.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Intelligenzblatt fuer den Rezat-Kreis ("**Intellig.Bl.f.d.Rezat-Kreis**"), and Boten von Altdorf are official newspapers in which prospective legal emigrants published the fact that they were leaving Germany. The remainder of the reference is: the year, part (Beilage), number, column, and date of publication (the month is usually in Roman numerals).

"**Reg.v.Mfr.K.d.I.**" is the abbreviation for "Regierung von Mittel Franken Kammer des Inneren" (Chamber of the Interior for Central Franconia, located in Ansbach), a department of the provincial administration. If one wished to see copies of the papers of Mathias Abelein, one would order them from the State Archive in Nuremberg, referring to, "Reg.v.Mfr.KdI, Abg.1932, Titulus Ia, Nr.57740/I" (the reference listed for that record). "**Abgabe**" (abbreviated "**Abg.**") refers to the year records were transferred to the State Archive in Nuremberg.

Other references indicate the administrative town near the emigrant's home (see the first issue for a fuller explanation of the various terms). If one wanted a copy of Walburga Abele's records, they would give the reference for that record: "**LRA Eichstaett, Abgabe1981, Nr.676/1/4**" (LRA=the office of the "Landkreis", called the "Landratsamt", in this case the city of Eichstaett). If one wanted a copy of Joh. Jakob Ackermann's records they would give the reference for that record: "**BA Ansbach, Abgabe1930, Nr.427/441**" (BA="Bezirksamt", in this case the city of Ansbach). "**Herrschaftsgericht**", "**Gericht- & Polizeibehoerde**" and "**Lg.ä.O.**" are other terms for types of administrative towns. In the "**Hometown**" column, the second town listed is one of these types of administrative towns. Unless noted, it is the "Landgericht" (LG.) of the first town listed in that column.

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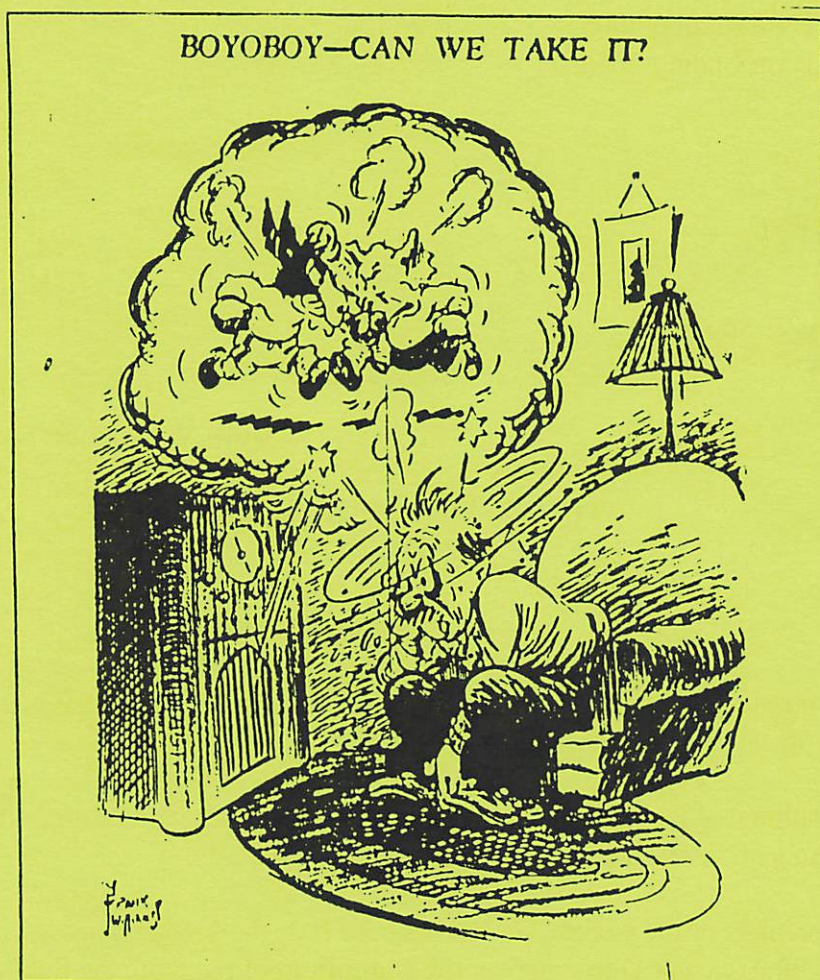

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THE DISAPPEARANCE OF EMMA SCHNUG

What would you do if you sent your child off to run an errand and she never returned home? Would you send your six-year old child to run family errands in the first place? This is what Mrs. Alvina Schnug did with her little daughter Emma. She sent her to the Baum market, and the child never returned home. Emma Schnug disappeared on the morning of March 7, 1877 never to be seen or heard from again. Her disappearance has been a mystery for over one hundred years.



Emma was also to go for a dress fitting after she finished at the market. On a cold day in March Emma Schnug left home about 9 a.m. It was not far from her home where her mother said she could see her from the front window. She was to pick up some meat for dinner in her father's little tin bucket. She left the market at approximately 10:30 a.m. and headed for the dress shop. No one knows how long she was there or when she left, and no one has seen her since.

Emma had three older sisters living at home during the time of her disappearance, their ages ranging from seven to nine. There were several other children in the family, possibly sixteen of them. Seven of these children are believed to have died at the age of four or younger. Besides Emma, one other died from unknown causes. (Saginaw County Death Records) Emma's father was a cabinet maker and her mother was a homemaker pregnant with a fifth child at the time of the disappearance.

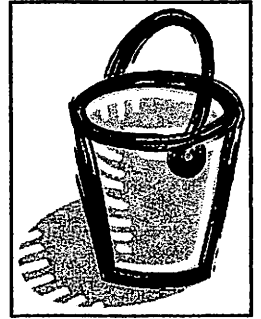
During this time East Saginaw was a lumber town with saloons and houses of prostitution in much of the area we now call "downtown". Walnut and Ninth Streets where the Schnugs lived is two blocks from Genesee Street. Emma walked two blocks to reach the corner of Genesee Street. From there she went to the Baum market for her mother. She then proceeded to Washington Street to the dress shop.

The weather was dry and cold on this particular day in March. A blizzard arrived about 4 p.m. The blizzard covered the whole state, dropping six to twelve inches of snow in most areas. High winds caused huge drifts. Visibility was not good. Because most of the roads were dirt or planks traveling was hard.

When Emma left home she was wearing a dark red cloak and hat, red and gray socks, and carrying a tin bucket. None of these things would be hard to spot in a blanket of snow.

Emma was nowhere to be found. Her mother watched her as she crossed the street. When she arrived safely on the other side, she waved her tin bucket as a signal. That was the last time her mother saw her.

On July 16, 1878 both The Saginaw Daily Republican and The Saginaw Daily Courier ran the following headlines, "The Mystery Concerning the Fate of Little Emma Schnug, The Body Found in the Woods Near the City and Fully Identified." According to the articles a body answering the description of Emma Schnug was found in Buena Vista township.



A group of women and children had gone berry picking on Vassar Plank Road by the Eastman farm. Mrs. Lois Flagler and two boys were picking berries by the St. Clair Railroad tracks about three miles from town. Officer Thomas Oliver was summoned to the site to investigate. The remains had no flesh, but the hair was preserved, as well as the cloak, socks, shoes and a piece of apron. Also found was a nearly new buffalo robe, a pair of shoes and tin bucket, which did not belong to Emma. The other clothing articles had rotted away.

Mrs. Flagler, the woman who found the remains, was a neighbor to the Schnugs. She was a woman with a strange look about her which caused Mrs. Schnug to fear her. This gave her reason not to go berry picking with Mrs. Flagler. Two days after Mrs. Flagler reported finding the remains, the Flagler family were never seen or heard from again.

There were several other theories about Emma's disappearance. There were some who believed she wandered off in the storm trying to find a friend's home, got lost, and was overcome by the storm. Others believed someone had gained Emma's trust luring her away from her neighborhood. Many believed that on July 15, 1878 Emma's remains had been found. The coroner's office had an inquest. Statements were taken from many witnesses. All the bones and material were examined and said to be those of Emma. The verdict "death from causes unknown" was made on July 24, 1878. Her county death record reads:

Emma Schnug Date of Death: 24 July 1878

Age: 7 years, 1 month

Place of Death: East Saginaw

Cause of Death: Unknown

Found in woods at this date, supposed murdered

After the inquest the body was released to the family to be buried in the family plot. The Schnugs buried the bones still not wanting to believe they were Emma's. Alone they continued to hope and search.

There were many sightings of a girl thought to have been Emma. Her father followed every sighting that came along with hopes of finding his daughter. He traveled across Michigan investigating various sightings. A young girl was seen with a man on a wagon in Bridgeport. This turned out to be a true abduction with the girl being released and the man arrested. Another sighting in Blumfield township resulted in an arrest of a man who lured a child thought to be Emma into a wagon. During this time Bruno Martin reported to police his little girl was approached by an unknown man who offered her money, candy and a new dress if she would go with him. Martin's daughter ran home. In Buchanan, Michigan, postmaster Saylor received a letter from a man named Morley asking for a description of the little girl Emma Schnug. Morley was concerned about a little girl who was brought into his neighborhood by a woman, and the child was continuously crying for her mother. In Clare a girl answering the description of Emma, was spotted with a man. Although she looked "almost exactly like Emma", her father confirmed she was not. Mr. Schnug also went to Illinois, Indiana, California and New York only to return with nothing. It was thought that a rich aunt of Emma's might have lured her away to New York for a better life. The aunt wanted to take Emma and raise her as her own, but that too was a false lead. The Common Council of East Saginaw authorized the mayor to offer a \$100.00 reward for her or information which would lead to her recovery. This too brought in false leads. The police faithfully did all they could. "The honor of the city is involved in finding this child".

Approximately a week after Emma's disappearance rumors began circulating about what happened to her. Stories spread about how she was the daughter of a former wife of Mr. Schnug, despite evidence to the contrary. Another story was that the present Mrs. Schnug wanted to get rid of Emma possibly setting up the disappearance. The lawyer for the Schnugs, Mr. John McArthur, made a statement to the public in The Saginaw Daily Republican in which he responded to the rumors, "I shall immediately institute legal proceedings against them."

Sixteen months passed and the search still continued for Emma. On July 14, 1878 Officer Oliver went to the Schnug's home for another description of Emma on the day she disappeared. Her mother described the dress, apron, shoes, socks and cloak she had been wearing, along with the tin bucket she was carrying. Satisfied with what he heard, Officer Oliver told the parents the body of their long-lost daughter had been found. He gave them the details while they listened in disbelief.

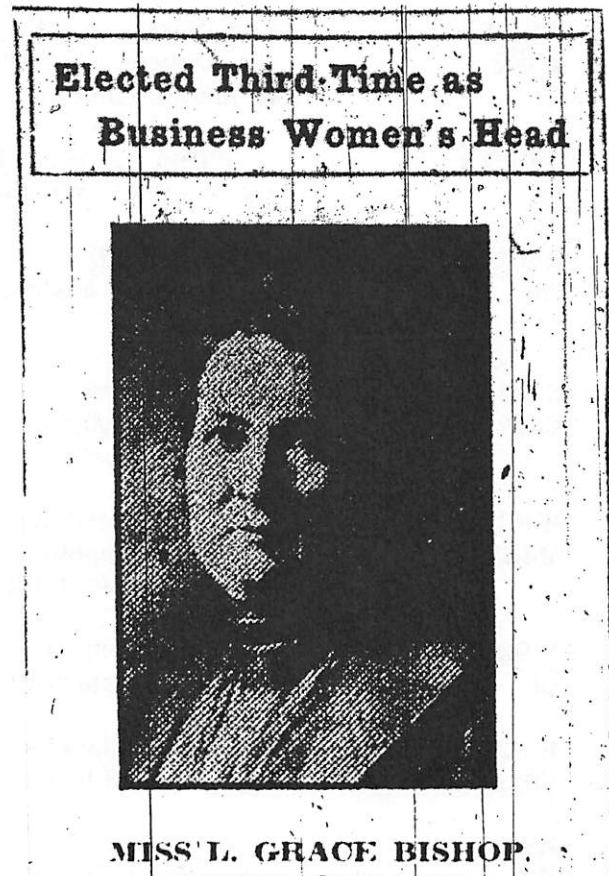

COAL MINING IN SAGINAW STREETS

SUBJECT OF AN ANIMATED DISCUSSION
LAST NIGHT AT CITY HALL

The Council committee on ordinances, city engineer and attorney, and aldermen from the nineteenth and twentieth wards, last night heard arguments pro and con on the Warren Ordinance prohibiting the mining of coal in Saginaw streets. It was a session lasting about three hours, and in which every inch of the ground was fought over by both sides.

The coal operators were represented by R.M. Randall and Arthur Barnard and attorneys Geo. W. Weadock and F.E. Emerick. They have several foremen and miners present. There were also present many west side citizens, who did not hesitate to express their opinions. Eugene A. Snow acted as their representative, and spoke in behalf of the rights of the people.

The coal companies claimed they could mine under streets on leases from abutting property owners, but could not do so to the detriment of the city.

Mr. Snow maintained that the city had a right to say whether or not coal could be taken from under the streets.

There was a long discussion on what constituted a proper protection so that the surface should not fall in and Mr. Snow drew a word picture of the coal companies working back after the coal had been taken out and removing the props, which he said might let the surface fall down and create havoc to buildings and pavements.

The attorneys for the coal operators objected to the prohibitive clause of the ordinance, and asserted that if anybody was damaged the remedy was by law.

Mr. Emerick spoke especially on the possibilities of the arrest of any of the coal operators and hauling them up in court, to which Mr. Snow replied that they were not supposed to be any more exempt from arrest than the humblest citizen.

Altogether it was a very lively meeting and more eloquence was dispensed than has been known in the mayor's office in many a day.

City Attorney Naegely held, as he has before, that the city could take action against the coal companies whenever mining operations endangered the streets or public property.

The committee withheld the matter in abeyance for a week or more. The ordinance subsequently drafted will probably provide that no coal can be taken from under streets excepting for the purpose of crossing into adjoining property and then with a narrow chamber, and this to be done by straight lines. Mining under streets diagonally or lengthwise will probably be prohibited.

DETROIT THREATNED WITH FUEL SHORTAGE

REPORTS FROM "THE THUMB" DISAPPOINTING - TRAINS SNOW BOUND AT BROWN CITY

Detroit - Feb. 4 - Special The fiercest storm of the year is raging east of St. Thomas, Ont., tonight and the Wabash and Grand Trunk railroad y systems absolutely discontinued all eastern freight traffic. Orders were issued to double head all eastbound passenger trains.

The orders tonight place a complete embargo on perishable as well as dead freight, and freight trains have simply been abandoned at all the terminals of the two roads, where they will remain until there comes some improvement. Live stock, which comes under the head of perishable, is being cared for as best the systems can, but none is being forwarded to their destinations.

As practically all of the anthracite coal for Detroit is handled by the Michigan Central, Grand Trunk and Wabash, the latest storm will undoubtedly add to the threatened shortage of fuel in the city. The roads were badly handicapped in moving cars previous to yesterday.

Storm reports from "Thumb" district of Michigan tonight are disappointing. A snow plow which succeeded in working south from Harbor Beach to Port Huron yesterday was started northward today, but on the return trip has made little progress. The Pere Marquette line being exposed to the winds from Lake Huron, is buried in snow, drifts before the opening made by the snow plows can be made use of. It is ninety miles from Port Huron to Port Austin, and reports received tonight show that the snow plow and relief train which started at 1 p.m. had worked northward only about twenty miles. At Palms Station, fifty miles from Port Huron, there is a junction, and the snow bound village of Harbor Beach is situated eighteen miles from Palms on the branch line. Assistant General Superintendent W.D. Trump of the Pere Marquette said it was hoped that the snow plow would get as far along as Crosswell tonight.

The Saginaw-Port Huron branch of the Pere Marquette is blocked between Marlette and Brown City, where the east-bound train which left Saginaw for Port Huron at 7 a.m. is snowed in. The west-bound train which left Port Huron at 8:50 a.m. is at Brown City unable to proceed until the east-bound train is released.

Earlier in the day it was thought that the Port Huron-Saginaw line was open, but the cuts filled up with snow before today's trains could get through.

MORTUARY RECORD

Though not unexpected, the news of her death will be received with sincere regret by many friends who held her in the highest esteem.

ARNOLD - At he home , 411 Irving Avenue, Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock , occurred the funeral of Mrs. John R. Arnold. A large number of sorrowing friends gathered to pay a final tribute of love and respect. The burial service, read by Rev. W. H. Gallagher of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, was very impressive. "The Will Be Done" was then rendered in a very touching manner by Curt Schwahn, accompanied by Miss Hessie Grant. A prayer by Rev. Gallagher followed , which brought great comfort to the hearts of the bereaved ones. "Abide With Me" sung by Mr. Schwahn, closed the services at the house.

From the home the remains were conveyed to Forest Lawn. There a brief service was held, and all that was mortal of the beloved wife and mother was laid to rest in a bed of flowers and evergreens. The following acted as pallbearers; Oscar Lebsch, Dedrick Palm, George Scheller, John Haug, Max Willman and Fred Wedding.

The floral tributes were profuse and beautiful, including pieces from "the teachers of the Stark school, class No. 7 of the Jefferson avenue Baptist Sunday School" and grade 4 Stark school, showing the esteem in which deceased was held.

The funeral of Miss Ida Stewart will be held tomorrow at 2p.m. from the family residence, 1000 Mackinaw Street. The interment will be at Oakwood Cemetery.

State Archive Nuremberg: 19th Century Emigrants from Central Franconia to North America

INTRODUCTION:

These records are based on information in the State Archive of Central Franconia (or Mittel Franken) at Nuremberg. As a Sesquicentennial gift, the city of Gunzenhausen sent this information to its sister city of Frankenmuth, Michigan. Frankenmuth Historical Assn. translated the information, compiled these charts and, when possible, added a location & reference as to where in N. America the settler arrived (set off by: []). If there are any questions regarding accuracy, researchers should request to see copies of the original records in Germany and for this reason will need the reference and the archive's address (there is a fee):

A Very Short Explanation of Reference Abbreviations

(a fuller explanation can be found in the first issue of this series, Volume 29 Issue 3):

Intelligenzblatt fuer Mittelfranken (abbreviated "Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr."), Kreis-Amtsblatt fuer Mittelfranken ("Krs.A.Bl.f.Mfr."), Intelligenzblatt fuer den Rezat-Kreis ("Intellig.Bl.f.d.Rezat-Kreis"), and Boten von Altdorf are official newspapers in which prospective legal emigrants published the fact that they were leaving Germany. The remainder of the reference is: the year, part (Beilage), number, column, and date of publication (the month is usually in Roman numerals).

"Reg.v.Mfr.K.d.I." is the abbreviation for "Regierung von Mittel Franken Kammer des Inneren" (Chamber of the Interior for Central Franconia, located in Ansbach), a department of the provincial administration. If one wished to see copies of the papers of Mathias Abelein, one would order them from the State Archive in Nuremberg, referring to, "Reg.v.Mfr.KdI, Abg.1932, Titulus Ia, Nr.57740/I" (the reference listed for that record). "Abgabe" (abbreviated "Abg.") refers to the year records were transferred to the State Archive in Nuremberg.

Other references indicate the administrative town near the emigrant's home (see the first issue for a fuller explanation of the various terms). If one wanted a copy of Walburga Abele's records, they would give the reference for that record: "LRA Eichstaett, Abgabe1981, Nr.676/1/4" (LRA=the office of the "Landkreis", called the "Landratsamt", in this case the city of Eichstaett). If one wanted a copy of Joh. Jakob Ackermann's records they would give the reference for that record: "BA Ansbach, Abgabe1930, Nr.427/441" (BA="Bezirksamt", in this case the city of Ansbach). "Herrschaftsgericht", "Gericht- & Polizeibehoerde" and "Lg.ä.O." are other terms for types of administrative towns. In the "Hometown" column, the second town listed is one of these types of administrative towns. Unless noted, it is the "Landgericht" (LG.) of the first town listed in that column.
