

In the course of doing genealogical research in books about other counties or states, one oftentimes discovers information shedding light on Saginaw persons or events. Listed below are some references to the Saginaw area.



Portrait and Biographical Record of Rockland and Orange Counties, New York.... Chapman Pub. 1895.

William Murray Sayer and his brother Stephen were lumbermen at Goshen, New York. In 1853 these two brothers had lumber interests in Michigan. At Zilwaukee they leased mills to manufacture lumber for Albany and Chicago. Stephen died in 1855 and his brother gave up the Zilwaukee mills when his brother died.

Rochester and Monroe County, New York Pioneer Pub. 1908

Luther Gordon of Brockport, New York and George S. Weaver of Albany leased a large sawmill at East Saginaw in 1860. At the Saginaw mill they manufactured lumber for Brockport. Two years later he bought an interest in the mill and four years later sold his interest to the F&PM Railway Co. Together with his brother Walter he also had a sawmill at Sterling Michigan.

Illustrated History of the State of Oregon.... Lewis Pub. Co. 1893

Alonzo Philander Mead of Portland Oregon was a native of Hickville, Michigan. He was born in 1838 and at the age of twelve went with his parents to Saginaw. He later lived in Buffalo, NY. He owned two large planning mills, one of them in partnership with W. R. Burt of East Saginaw.

**MISS ROUSE, LONG TIME
TEACHER HERE, IS DEAD**

**South Saginaw Resident Her 64
Years, She was Church, DAR Worker**

Miss Kittie N Rouse, lifelong resident and member of a pioneer Saginaw family, and for many years a teacher in Saginaw public schools, died this morning at Saginaw General hospital. She was 64.

Miss Rouse was born Nov. 14, 1869 in South Saginaw and had always lived there. She was the daughter of the late Dr and Mrs Jonathan S Rouse, pioneers of that section of the city, which at that time was known as the village of Salina. Her home was at 2503 South Washington avenue.

Miss Rouse received her education in the Saginaw public schools, being a graduate of Saginaw high school. Until her recent illness she had taught in the first grade at the Washington school

Her teaching career, which began immediately after she completed her education, was devoted to the early training of Saginaw children after they entered their first grade in school

She had been a lifelong member of Fordney Avenue Baptist church and for more than 40 years had held active offices in the church. Miss Rouse also was a charter member of the Saginaw chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, and had been its treasurer for the past 16 years.

She is survived by two sisters and a brother, Misses Jessie and Helen Rouse and Jay Rouse, all at home.

The funeral will be held at 4 p.m. Monday at the family home. Rev Richard Lewis and Rev U Lincoln Montgomery will officiate and burial will be in Forest Lawn

THE FINAL SUMMONS

**George F Williams Died
Early Yesterday Morning**

**Had Been One of the Prominent
Lumbermen**

**He was a Good Citizen and a Man of
Unbounded Generosity**

Hon George F Williams, one of the oldest and most widely known residents of the Saginaw valley, passed away at 5 o'clock yesterday morning after an illness of over four weeks. It has been known for a number of days that Mr Williams was on his death bed and inquiries from his many friends about his condition have been numerous. Bright's disease of the kidneys and valvular trouble of the heart were the causes of his demise.

Mr Williams was born at Pontiac, Michigan Nov 21, 1831, and was therefore 63 years of age. He was a son of the late Gardner D Williams, who came to Saginaw in 1827, and who built the first saw mill on the Saginaw river in 1832. When a babe, six months old, the deceased was brought to Saginaw from Pontiac, on horseback. On the way here

the party camped two nights in the forests. Mr Williams was the first white child to arrive in Saginaw county. He attended school in Saginaw for a short time and at the age of 14 years went to Pontiac where he completed a common school education.

The late Gardner D Williams was for many years the leading lumberman of Saginaw and shortly after his death in December, 1838, the firm of Williams Brothers was organized. This firm was composed of George F Williams, as principal, and his two brothers, William A and Stewart B Williams, both of whom are well known residents of the west side. The firm of Williams Bros did a very extensive lumbering business here until six years ago, when the large plant was sold to Bliss & Van Auken.

The deceased and brother, William A Williams, took lumber across the Saginaw river about 1840 for the first building erected on the east side

In 1857 Mr Williams was united in marriage to Miss Cora I Sabine, of Rochester, NY, who died eleven months after. Deceased was a man of many noble qualities. His generosity was unbounded and his business dealings were always those of a strictly honest and thoroughly upright business man. During the rebellion, though not drafted into the service, he felt it his duty to send a substitute and he did so. In politics he was a conscientious Democrat and served this city as alderman and supervisor and held the office of mayor for one term. He was prominently connected with St John's Episcopal church and a heavy contributor to the building. He has been a member of the vestry for the past twenty-five years and

was treasurer of the church at the time of his death.

Deceased was at one time a heavy stockholder in the Saginaw Valley and St Louis railroad company and in the City of Saginaw Street Railway company

The funeral will occur from St John's Episcopal church at 1:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon

Friends will be afforded an opportunity to view the body between the hours of 10 and 12 tomorrow morning at the residence of his brother, William A Williams, 603 South Michigan avenue

LUMBER DAYS HOME TO GIVE WAY TO HOSPITAL

Built of selected Saginaw valley timber and incorporating the knowledge and skill of the best lumbermen in the world, the William B Mershon residence at Michigan and Houghton is a monument to Saginaw's onetime glory as lumber queen of the world.

As the result of the death of Mr Mershon last summer, the two square blocks of property, containing the home, stables and gardens, have been sold to St Luke's Hospital association as the site for postwar construction of a new hospital.

In this impressive home, the late Mr. Mershon, sportsman and big businessman, arranged some of the most important business deals of the lumber and post-lumber era. Some transactions involved such nationally known products and organizations as Ivory soap and the great Phelps Dodge copper mining industry.

The True Sportsman

Here, while handling one of Saginaw's great fortunes, Mr Mershon found time to enjoy fine horses and hunting dogs, take great interest in gardening—particularly in growing rare vegetables—and to provide a haven for wild birds and small animals.

It was in 1893, when the Saginaw valley still produced the cream of the nation's lumber supply, that William B Mershon, then a prominent young lumberman, decided to build for his bride a home that would combine the finest products of the Saginaw valley he loved. Architects advised him to use imported wood in finish some of the rooms, but he demanded that every piece of lumber come from Saginaw valley forests.

The men who worked for him at the William B Mershon & Co mill in Carrollton (formerly Mershon Station) decided they would make a gift of their best skill and efforts in the construction of the home for Mr Mershon and his wife. Men skilled in selecting the best timber went out into the woods and chose the finest trees, directed the cutting of them and followed the logs through the mill, where the best-trained hands took special pains in turning out perfect lumber.

Finest Oak, Pine, Maple

When the home was finished it stood as a monument to Saginaw's glory as lumber queen of the world. The finest oak ever cut—much of it from around Paines Station—and equally fine maple from the woodlands of the Tittabawassee went into the building. One entire room is finished in perfect birdseye maple. Grand Rapids furniture men, who were friends of the builder, made furniture in the exact pattern of the woodwork.

Every piece of lumber in the home's unusual stairway was prepared by hand. Spindles were handturned. Mr Mershon's bedroom was finished in ivory, but the lumber was so fine that he never would permit the use of soap and water in cleaning it.

The home was the birthplace of three of Mr Mershon's children, Marion Mershon Sayer, who died in 1939, Lt. Col William B Mershon of Saginaw, now at Fort Riley, Kan, and John M Merson, who is supervising camouflage work for Douglas Aircraft Corp in Santa Monica, Calif. The oldest son, Edward L, was born before the house's completion.

Entertained Lavishly

The grounds originally covered about eight square blocks, extending back to Benjamin street, and including the present site of the Michigan Employment Institution for the Blind.

The owner's charm and love of entertaining brought to the Mershon home many notable persons, and none went away without saying he had been treated to the best food he ever had tasted. Wild fowl, fish and game from Mr Mershon's hunting and fishing trips stocked the larder. The refrigerator was large enough for men to walk in, and often held a whole deer or side of beef. Mr Mershon was an authority on the preparation of food, personally supervised the aging of meat, and until the time of his death prided himself on being able to tell to a day the "age" of a piece of beef.

And while the guests came to enjoy Mr Mershon's company and hospitality, they frequently left behind orders that kept his mill and factories running. Some left business knowledge that became stepping stones on the path to greater success for their host.

A Copper Magnate

There was the Anaconda Copper Co official who talked of copper mining during his visits with Mr Mershon in Saginaw and during their hunting and fishing trips.

Saginaw valley lumber production was on the decline. Mr Mershon had established the Saginaw & Manistee mill at Williams, Arizona. Through the knowledge he had acquired from the Anaconda official, Mr Mershon selected valuable copper claims in Arizona and threatened competition for Phelps Dodge Corp and Calumet & Arizona Copper Co, the two big companies at that time operating in Arizona. He sold his claims to Calumet & Arizona, receiving stock in payments; became a director of the company and later chairman of the board. Eventually he arranged a merger of Calumet & Arizona with Phelps Dodge Corp, one of the present-day "big three" of the copper mining industry. The consolidation placed him on the board of directors of Phelps Dodge, a position he held until he resigned a few years ago because of ill health.

Gave "Ivory" It's Start

Another interesting development that had its origin within the walls of the big house on Michigan avenue was the marketing of Ivory soap.

"I was a youngster the day Bob Schulz came and talked with my father about producing soap for Proctor & Gamble, but I had big ears for business deals and remember the details well" says Edward L Mershon of Seattle, Wash, son of the pioneer lumberman, who is visiting in Saginaw. "We called him 'Uncle Bob' Shculz. He had discovered a soap that would float and he marketed it under the slogan 'Duck Soap—It Floats', He told my father that he had received an offer from two Cincinnati business men, Proctor and Gamble, who had been trying unsuccessfully to produce a soap that would float. They had offered him what seemed an astronomical sum to produce soap for them. The main difficulty for Schulz was that he didn't have sufficient capital to provide shipping boxes for the first month, until he began receiving the profits. The W B Mershon Co was the biggest box manufacturer in the world, and father said he would provide the boxes and Schulz should accept the Procter & Gamble offer. That was the start of Ivory soap."

In his later years, Mr Merson spent more and more time in his home, writing of his hunting trips and of Michigan wildlife. He always maintained the grounds as a bird sanctuary and until the last watched from his window the flocks of wild fowl that made regular visits to the yard. The house and grounds stand as one of the few remaining monuments of the days when Saginaw supplied the lumber for the world and the valley's forests were abundant with wild life.

State Archive Nuremberg: 19th Century Emigrants from Central Franconia to North America

INTRODUCTION:

These records are based on information in the State Archive of Central Franconia (or Mittel Franken) at Nuremberg. As a Sesquicentennial gift, the city of Gunzenhausen sent this information to its sister city of Frankenmuth, Michigan. Frankenmuth Historical Assn. translated the information, compiled these charts and, when possible, added a location & reference as to where in N. America the settler arrived (set off by: []). If there are any questions regarding accuracy, researchers should request to see copies of the original records in Germany and for this reason will need the reference and the archive's address (there is a fee):

A Very Short Explanation of Reference Abbreviations

(a fuller explanation can be found in the first issue of this series, Volume 29 Issue 3):

Intelligenzblatt fuer Mittelfranken (abbreviated "Intellig.BI.f.Mfr."), Kreis-Amtsblatt fuer Mittelfranken ("Krs.A.BI.f.Mfr."), Intelligenzblatt fuer den Rezat-Kreis ("Intellig.BI.f.d.Rezat-Kreis"), and Boten von Altdorf are official newspapers in which prospective legal emigrants published the fact that they were leaving Germany. The remainder of the reference is: the year, part (Beilage), number, column, and date of publication (the month is usually in Roman numerals).

"Reg.v.Mfr.K.d.I." is the abbreviation for "Regierung von Mittel Franken Kammer des Inneren" (Chamber of the Interior for Central Franconia, located in Ansbach), a department of the provincial administration. If one wished to see copies of the papers of Mathias Abelein, one would order them from the State Archive in Nuremberg, referring to, "Reg.v.Mfr.KdI, Abg.1932, Titulus Ia, Nr.57740/I" (the reference listed for that record). "Abgabe" (abbreviated "Abg.") refers to the year records were transferred to the State Archive in Nuremberg.

Other references indicate the administrative town near the emigrant's home (see the first issue for a fuller explanation of the various terms). If one wanted a copy of Walburga Abele's records, they would give the reference for that record: "LRA Eichstaett, Abgabe1981, Nr.676/1/4" (LRA=the office of the "Landkreis", called the "Landratsamt", in this case the city of Eichstaett). If one wanted a copy of Joh. Jakob Ackermann's records they would give the reference for that record: "BA Ansbach, Abgabe1930, Nr.427/441" (BA="Bezirksamt", in this case the city of Ansbach). "Herrschachtsgericht", "Gericht- & Polizeibehoerde" and "Lg.ä.O." are other terms for types of administrative towns. In the "Hometown" column, the second town listed is one of these types of administrative towns. Unless noted, it is the "Landgericht" (LG.) of the first town listed in that column.
