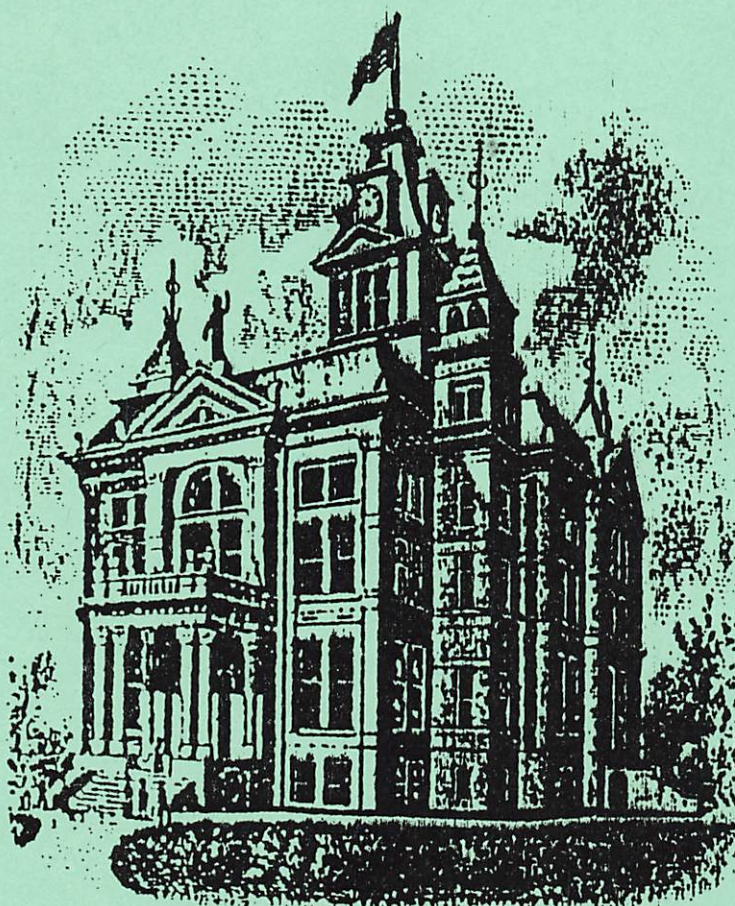

ORIGIN OF THE SAGINAW GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

In 1971, the Saginaw Historical Society was located in the historic Passolt Home at 1105 S. Jefferson Ave. At the beginning of that year, the officers of the Society were as follows: Gertrude Decker, executive director; Mrs. R. Jardinico, president; M. Swarthout, vice president; G. Blakely, secretary-treasurer. Ms. Decker passed away on March 19th of that year, and Mrs. Marie Beach had assumed the presidency by the May 14th meeting of the Society.

At the May 14th meeting, chaired by Dr. Richard D. Mudd, Saginaw's most noted genealogist, Dr. Mudd proposed that a genealogical section be added to the Historical Society. As a result, the president of the Society extended an invitation to local genealogists at that meeting. In early June, Dr. Mudd phoned Mr. Leonard Zorn, a man well known for his interest in genealogy. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that those Saginawians interested in genealogy be called together for a meeting which was eventually held at Hoyt Public Library on Thursday, June 24th, at 4 p.m.

At the above meeting, those present were offered a choice of accepting an invitation to be part of the Saginaw Historical Society or to be a separate entity. Of the ten present, six voted to be a separate organization with the remaining four voting to be part of the Historical Society. Those present at the meeting: Dr. Richard D. Mudd, Elsie Kempton, Ellen A. Rambo Haigh, Leland Watrous, Mrs. Paul E. Jaquish, Mrs. Leonard S. Zorn, Leonard Zorn, Mrs. Earl Persons, Cloyce F. Dean, and Franck Geuder.

After voting to be a separate organization, Mrs. Paul E. Jaquish was elected temporary chairman. She then appointed Leland R. Watrous as chairman of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, Leonard S. Zorn as chairman of the Committee on Nominations, and Cloyce F. Dean as invitation membership chairman. It was decided that the next organizational meeting would be set for Thursday, August 5th at Hoyt Library, 4 p.m. Those interested in joining a genealogical society were requested to contact Mr. Dean or Mrs. Earl Persons at Hoyt Library.

And the rest is history.

Quest Family, County History

Our town's newly-formed Saginaw Genealogical Society is off and running on its intriguing course of ancestor research.

I intend to give it a hand as I can in this column. It may very well be that this organization may turn up some, hitherto unknown facts about Saginaw history among long-dead relatives who helped make it.

Let Mrs. Paul E. Jaquish — the Flora Jaquish remembered for her work in the League of Women Voters and as a member of the former Saginaw County Board of Supervisors — talk about the Saginaw Genealogical Society because she was one of its organizers.

Says Flora: "There are tricks to every trade, sport and hobby. A group of us in Saginaw have long indulged in the hobby of genealogy and have had lots of fun tracing elusive ancestors in the game of ancestor hunting.

"We are blessed with a very fine genealogical room in the Saginaw Public Library at 505 Janes and have made good use of it now for some years.

"Recently we organized the Saginaw Genealogical Society to help each other find our family lineage and also to help the library preserve Saginaw County history.

"Our first project will be to learn how to properly use the library and be able to find and use many resources of the genealogical room and of the library.

"For know-how we intend to put on a workshop in the coming year and as our group is knowledgeable in the work, there will be many of us to help other interested Saginawians get started."

Mrs. Howard R. Doud, 500

Golfview, is a woman who belongs to an elite organization and has a splendiferous, ornate certificate attesting the fact she's an honorary "plank owner" of the new USS Saginaw (LST-1188), a Navy tank landing ship. The certificate bears the official seal of the USS Saginaw and signature of its chief officer, Cmdr. G. P. Brown.

Its legend states in part: "Know all men by these presents and to all landlubbers,

sea lawyers, salts, swabs, square-knot admirals, gold-brickers and other scavengers of the seven seas, that Mrs. Howard R. Doud was an honored member of the original illustrious Navy crew which forever distinguished itself when it commissioned the good ship USS Saginaw LST-1188 and, therefore, for this good and sufficient reason, she is entitled by the laws of the sea to all the rights and privileges of a plank owner. Be it further understood that she is entitled

also to a clear, free, open and unencumbered title to one plank of the deck of the above mentioned ship."

Not bad for one of the gals what with all this women's lib stuff afloat, eh?

Mrs. Doud attended the Saginaw's commissioning last January with her husband, Cmdr. Howard R. Doud, U.S. Navy (ret.), who has served as a leader and president of the Tri-County Council of the U.S. Navy League.



'21 The East Side Board of Education concluded deals for property for the Central Junior High School site, and dropped condemnation action.

Wickes Boiler plant's striking steel workers permitted removal of boilers and parts consigned to Studebaker airplane parts factories at South Bend, Ft. Wayne and Chicago.

Golfside and Lathrup Park residents petitioned County Drain Commissioner Linus H. Frost for construction of a drain to serve their subdivision.

'51 200 model airplane builders participated in competitions at Sky Haven Airport. More than 3,500 spectators watched the planes' gyrations.

William F. Nehmer, prominent Swan Creek farmer and civic leader, died at age 80. He was Swan Creek Township's supervisor for 21 years.

The Foote & Ronan Drug Store, a long-time Potter Street landmark, was bought from the Ronan estate by William G. Ginster, formerly a pharmacist at Marwinske & Loebrich, Schirmer Drugs and Jay's Drug Store.

Chesaning Chamber of Commerce faced up to its annual problem—what to do with the Showboat until next year's showing came around.

'61 Improvements made to several buildings in the downtown area were termed bright factors for the central business district in which plans proceeded for a proposed general development program.

Eight field workers sat and picked in a row on a new pickle harvester tested on the Turner Fruit Farm in Thomas Township. It was termed the "best thing yet" for pickle harvesting.

In a massive new 20-year program dangling hopes of a better life before the Russian people, the Soviet Communist Party said capitalism was doomed but ordered all communists to support what it called "the Leninist principle of peaceful coexistence with the West."

Newest backyard fun gimmick for children was a patented vinyl plastic sheet which permitted slipping and sliding maneuvers when watered by an internal watering system.

State Archive Nuremberg: 19th Century Emigrants from Central Franconia
To North America

INTRODUCTION:

These records are based on information in the State Archive of Central Franconia (Mittel Franken) at Nuremberg. As a Sesquicentennial gift, the city of Gunzenhausen sent this information to its sister city of Frankenmuth, Michigan. Frankenmuth Historical Assn. translated the information, compiled these charts and when possible, added a location and reference as to where in N. America the settler arrived (set off by []). If there are any questions regarding accuracy, researchers should request to see copies of the original records in Germany and for this reason will need the reference and the archive's address (there is a fee):

A Very Short Explanation of Reference Abreviations:

(a fuller explanation can be found in the first issue of this series, Volume 29 Issue 3).

Intelligenzblatt fuer Mittelfranken (abbreviated "**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Kreis-Amtsblatt fuer Mittelfranken ("**Krs.A.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Intelligenzblatt fuer den Rezat-Kreis ("**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), and **Boten von Altdorf** are official newspapers in which prospective legal emigrants published the fact that they were leaving Germany. The remainder of the reference is: they year, part (Beilage), number, column, and date of publication (the month is usually in Roman numerals.)

"**Reg.v.Mfr.K.d.I.**" is the abbreviation for "Regierung von Mittel Franken Kammer des Inneren" (Chamber of the Interior for Central Franconia, located in Ansbach), a department of the provincial administration. If one wished to see copies of the papers of Mathias Abelein, one would order them from the State Archive in Nuremberg, referring To "Reg.v.Mfr.kDI, Abg. 1932, Titulus Ia, Nr.57740/I" (the reference listed fort that Record). "**Abgabe**" (abbreviated "Abg.") refers to the year records were transferred to the State Archive in Nuremberg.

Other references indicate the administrative town near the emigrant's home (see the first issue for a fuller explanation of the various terms). If one wanted a copy of Walburga Abele's records, they would give the reference for that record: "**LRA Eichstaett, Abgabel 1981, Nr. 676/1/4**" **LRA**=the office of the "**Landkreis**", called the "Landsratsamt", in this case the city of Eichstaett). If one wanted a copy of Joh.Jakob Ackermann's records they would give the reference for that record: "**BA Ansbach, Abgabe 1930, Nr.427/441**" (**BA**=Bezirksamt", in this case the city of Ansbach). "**Herrschaftsgericht**", "**Gericht & Polzeibehoerde**" and "**Lg.a.O.**" are other terms for types of administrative towns. In the "**Hometown**" column, the second town listed is one of these types of administrative towns. Unless noted, it is the "Landgericht" (LG) of the first town listed in that column.

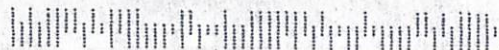

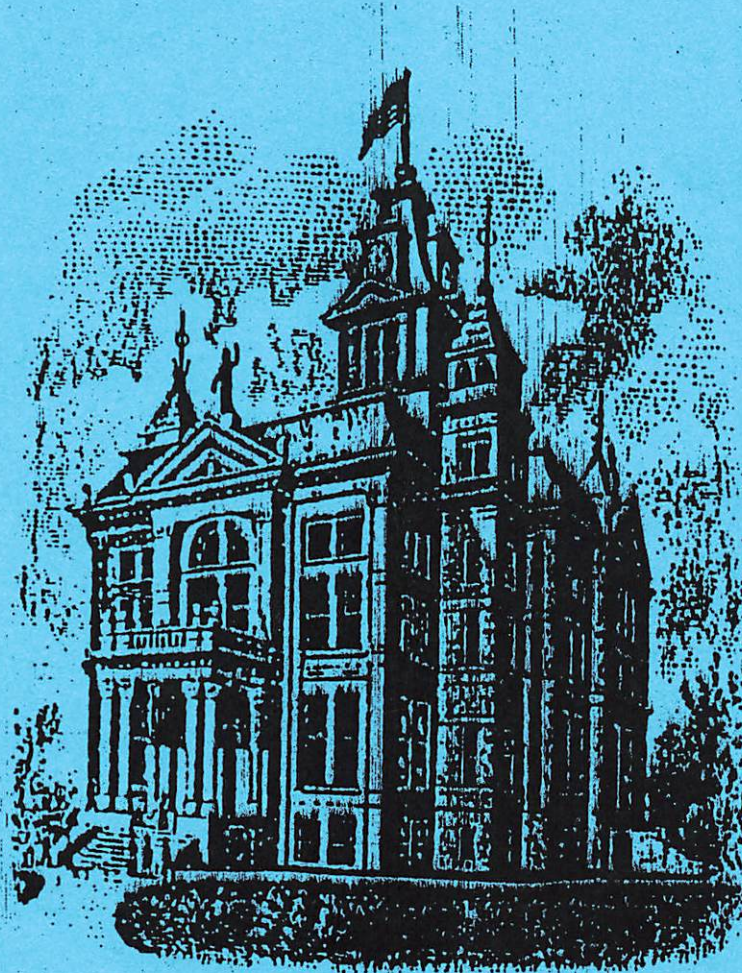

KIDNAPED AS BABY, FARMER FINDS FATHER IS WEALTHY SAGINAWIAN, SAYS DESPATCH

**Special to the Courier-Herald
Cincinnati, Ohio Sept 3**

Prior to yesterday John Smith, a wealthy young farmer who lives near Jamestown, Ind., an adopted son of Joseph Emmett, said to be one of the wealthiest land owners of Indiana, was ignorant of his parentage, and his father, Fred Smith, a wealth Saginaw, Mich., furniture manufacturer, was ignorant of his having a living son and heir. When he opened his free delivery mail box this morning young Smith found a letter from Alfred C. Crouse, superintendent of the Cincinnati Children's Home in which is unfolded a remarkable story of his early life and the identity of his wealthy father in Michigan.

Bitterness will be mingled with the sweets of information, for while young Smith will learn that his father is a prominent manufacturer of Saginaw, Mich., and among his near relatives is a university president, he also will become acquainted with the facts that his father was a victim of an unfortunate marriage; that he, the son, who is now the farmer of Jamestown, Ind., was abandoned in Newport, Ky., 19 years ago, and that his mother, who disappeared at that time, has not been heard from since.

Since Smith reached the age of understanding he has tried repeatedly to locate his father. He knew that he had been abandoned, in 1896, when two years old, in a Newport boarding house, and that he was taken in by Colonel John H. Graff of the Kentucky children's home in this city.

Supt. Crouse and Smith practically had given up hope of solving the mystery when a woman, past 75 years old, came to the home yesterday. She said she was Mrs. Mary Smith of 1700 Central avenue, and that she wished to obtain information concerning a grandson who mysteriously was kidnapped years ago. Crouse found the 1896 records and the name of John Smith.

"Oh, yes, that's the name of Fred's boy." The woman exclaimed. "I've been hunting him many years."

According to Crouse and Mrs. Smith she had nine sons. Frederick, now of Saginaw, became infatuated with a poor girl of whom the mother did not approve, but in spite of opposition the son and his sweetheart were married in 1893. A year and a half later a boy was born

Frederick Smith, disappointed father, married again, and finally went into the furniture manufacturing business at Saginaw, Mich. He is now wealthy. In the meantime the child was adopted by Emmett and secretly taken to Indiana.

While Frederick Smith was prospering in Saginaw, his brothers made names for themselves in other cities. Albert Edwin Smith is now president of Ohio Northern university at Ada, Ohio. Clifford is proprietor of a hotel at San Francisco. Frederick Smith has a large family in Saginaw. Crouse said. Frederick Smith will be notified to come to Cincinnati to meet his long-lost boy.

Efforts last night to locate anyone in Saginaw who knew anything of the case described in the foregoing dispatch from Cincinnati were vain. The name "Fred Smith" appears twice in the latest city directory, but neither of these men could be located last night, and neither is a furniture manufacturer.

FACES CHARGE OF EROTIC DENTISTRY DR. FREDERICK E. BUSH IN JAIL ON ASSAULT AND BATTERY CHARGE

Dr. Frederick Bush, a dentist with offices in the Weichmann building, was served with a warrant by Patrolman Joe Barnes and found himself in jail for the night charged with assault and battery. He was to be arraigned by Justice Clements in the morning. He denied having done anything wrong.

A woman, Mrs. McQuaid, described as a wife of a farmer, a "pretty young woman of a decided brunette type", went to the dentist's office to have a tooth filled. According to the woman, the tooth was almost filled when the doctor sent the office assistant on an errand. The door had hardly closed when Dr. Bush "leaned over her, took her face between his hands and kissed her plump on the lips".

When the woman appeared in court the next day to press charges, she realized that Dr. Bush was not the man who treated her tooth. She did not know who Dr. Bush was when she sought treatment so she assumed Dr. Bush was the man who kissed her.

Investigation by the police resulted in the arrest of Robert M. Smith, Dr. Bush's office assistant. Mrs. McQuaid identified him as the miscreant. He entered a plea of not guilty and the court fixed bond at \$500, trial to be the next day. Mr. Smith could not post bond and so he was lodged at central station for the night.

Search of the records in the county clerk's office by the Saginaw County Dental society, failed to show Mr. Smith as a registered, licensed dentist. Members of the society would not say if they would prosecute him for practicing without a license.

The court case was delayed because the alleged "kisser" became ill. Dr. F. W. Edelmann declared that Mr. Smith suffered from delirium tremens, a condition due to excessive alcoholism, and was in a condition "bordering on nervous collapse and is very delirious". Smith told Dr. Edelmann that he had been drinking heavily. When he was sent to jail he could no longer have alcohol and this brought on his condition. Trial was postponed.

At the examination where Mr. Smith and the complaining witness were the only ones heard, Smith admitted that his memory was hazy and he could not be certain that he was not guilty. He declared that he felt very sick that day.

Smith was not able to pay a fine of \$25 and costs which amounted to \$28.35 so he was to start serving a 90-day jail sentence.

SAGINAW'S FIRST DOLLAR DAY

In an age of sales occurring every day in one store or another, it is hard to believe that a community could get excited about a Dollar Day but that is just what happened in all of Saginaw's business districts - east, west and south side.

Saginaw business men and municipal officials became enthused about the Dollar Day promotion when they learned how successful the day was in Flint, Canton, Ohio, Utica, New York, St. Joseph, Mo., and other places. Some said their sales were from 50 to 516 percent better and an average of 50 percent were new faces to their shopping stores.

Samuel Seitner, of Seitner Bros., who had stores in Canton, O., and Flint, had to send half a dozen clerks to Flint to help take care of the crowds. Both stores broke business records on that day.

Saginaw Mayor Paddock said he would be glad to do anything to boost sales and promote the city. Merchants gave their hearty endorsement and agreed to offer unusual values. The success of the Dollar Days in other cities was a result of their leading business men being behind the day.

Saginaw's progressive merchants were behind this day. Board of Trade President, W. S. Linton, felt it was a "splendid idea"; President M. N. Brady of the West Side Business association offered his endorsement as did Dr. T. M. Williamson, president of the South Side Business Association. Saginaw Chamber of Commerce President Harry E. Oppenheimer also supported the day.

The date for the Dollar Day was set for Thursday, October 21. It was to be like a festival. Amsden's Thirty-third Regiment Band was to play musical selections on the streets of the business centers. The Courier-Herald published a list of participating merchants who were offering special values. Every type of store seemed to participate - clothiers, shoemakers, music stores, farm implements, stoves, drug stores, banks, dry cleaners, hatter, groceries, florists, art goods, furniture stores.

To make the day more interesting, a \$25 reward would be yours if you spotted Miss Dollar Day. The Courier-Herald secured the services of this well-known Saginaw young lady. She consented to be Miss Dollar Day for the adventure and to aid Saginaw General hospital. She would also receive \$15 for her efforts. The Courier-Herald published one picture of her, backside, with hat, long sleeved blouse and long skirt. Another picture showed her but she has a mask over her eyes. She could be mingling with you in any participating

store, any side of town. She would only be on the street to go from store to store. She would ignore you if you accosted her on the street. You had to find her in a store and have a sales receipt from any Dollar Day participating merchant. Also, if you were lucky enough to collect the reward, you and Miss Dollar Day would be featured in a moving picture that was being taken of Saginaw.

President Winslow, of the American Commercial Film company, would be taking the moving picture for a camera play written about Saginaw personages and scenes. Pictures in the Saginaw drama would be taken at the A. T. Ferrell residence, 923 North Michigan avenue, where the entire cast would assemble. many of the participating stores for most of the day. Miss Dietz thought the pictures in the paper looked like Daisy but she couldn't be sure. She spotted her at the M. W. Tanner store and waved her sales receipt and exclaimed "You are the Courier-Herald's Miss Dollar Day."

"Yes, I am."

"Oh, go on. You're crazy. You are not"

She believed when asked to go to the Courier-Herald office to get the \$25.

And the moving picture plays of Saginaw called "Saginaw in Filmland" and "The Billionaire Lord" were shown at the Auditorium to some four or five thousand people in a couple of shows. The main floor of the big building was crowded and the balconies and gallery were comfortably filled. The film, about 7000 feet in all, was of excellent quality. Scenes taken around Saginaw of many of the leading industries showed the diversity and size of the city's industries. Familiar faces and familiar scenes were shown. The appearance of George W. Wallis, late chief of the fire department, who died suddenly at a fire about a week after he and the other members of the department had staged a spectacular downtown fire scene, brought applause from the audience several times.

The play "The Billionaire Lord" had a cast of more than 50 well-known society persons that many in the audience recognized. The cast included Mrs. Newell Barnard, Cyril Quinn, George Grant, Jr., George O'Brien, George Stone, Mrs. Lewis Barnard, A. S. Harvey, George Humphrey, Lewis Barnard, Mrs. Otto Schupp and Mrs. George Humphrey.

Dollar Day was a HUGE success.

Intelligenzblatt fuer Mittelfranken (abbreviated "**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Kreis-Amtsblatt fuer Mittelfranken ("**Krs.A.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Intelligenzblatt fuer den Rezat-Kreis ("**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), and **Boten von Altdorf** are official newspapers in which prospective legal emigrants published the fact that they were leaving Germany. The remainder of the reference is: they year, part (Beilage), number, column, and date of publication (the month is usually in Roman numerals.)

"**Reg.v.Mfr.K.d.I.**" is the abbreviation for "Regierung von Mittel Franken Kammer des Inneren" (Chamber of the Interior for Central Franconia, located in Ansbach), a department of the provincial administration. If one wished to see copies of the papers of Mathias Abelein, one would order them from the State Archive in Nuremberg, referring To "**Reg.v.Mfr.kDI, Abg. 1932, Titulus Ia, Nr.57740/I**" (the reference listed fort that Record). "**Abgabe**" (abbreviated "**Abg.**") refers to the year records were transferred to the State Archive in Nuremberg.

Other references indicate the administrative town near the emigrant's home (see the first issue for a fuller explanation of the various terms). If one wanted a copy of Walburga Abele's records, they would give the reference for that record: "**LRA Eichstaett, Abgabel 1981, Nr. 676/1/4**" **LRA**=the office of the "**Landkreis**", called the "Landsratsamt", in this case the city of Eichstaett). If one wanted a copy of Joh.Jakob Ackermann's records they would give the reference for that record: "**BA Ansbach, Abgabe 1930, Nr.427/441**" (**BA**=Bezirksamt", in this case the city of Ansbach). "**Herrschaftsgericht**", "**Gericht & Polizeibehoerde**" and "**Lg.a.O.**" are other terms for types of administrative towns. In the "**Hometown**" column, the second town listed is one of these types of administrative towns. Unless noted, it is the "Landgericht" (LG) of the first town listed in that column.

Sault Ste. Marie was founded by Father Jacques Marquette in 1668. It is the third oldest remaining settlement in the United States

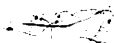

Michigan State University has the largest single campus student body of any Michigan university. It is the largest institution of higher learning in the state and one of the largest universities in the country. Michigan State University was founded in 1855 as the nation's first land-grant university and served as the prototype for 69 land-grant institutions later established under the Morrill Act of 1862. SAGINAW WOMAN WAS NURSE IN CIVIL WAR

Mrs. Mary J. Hill who died in this city May 15 was a well known and highly respected pioneer resident and had served as nurse in the civil war. She was stricken with blindness in 1893, and since that time has been a semi-invalid, being seldom able to leave her home.

During the civil war Mrs. Hill joined her husband and entered the service as a nurse. She was doing hospital work at Fairfax hospital near Washington at the time Lincoln was assassinated. It was her privilege to comfort the wounded and dying soldiers, writing letters, and sending keepsakes home.

Mary Jane Conant was born in Perrington, N.Y., April 13, 1827, and spent her early life there, moving to Fairport N. Y. some years later. She came to Michigan with her family, settling in Hillsdale county where she taught school until she was married December 31, 1848 to Willis K. Hill. Soon after they moved to Flushing, and finally to Saginaw. Mr. Hill died May 18, 18885. Of three children, two survive, Mrs. Mary J. Ennis, of San Francisco, Cal, and Mrs. Charles Trumble, of Saginaw.

State Archive Nuremberg: 19th Century Emigrants from Central Franconia
To North America

INTRODUCTION:

These records are based on information in the State Archive of Central Franconia (Mittel Franken) at Nuremberg. As a Sesquicentennial gift, the city of Gunzenhausen sent this information to its sister city of Frankenmuth, Michigan. Frankenmuth Historical Assn. translated the information, compiled these charts and when possible, added a location and reference as to where in N. America the settler arrived (set off by []). If there are any questions regarding accuracy, researchers should request to see copies of the original records in Germany and for this reason will need the reference and the archive's address (there is a fee):

A Very Short Explanation of Reference Abreviations:

(a fuller explanation can be found in the first issue of this series, Volume 29 Issue 3).

Intelligenzblatt fuer Mittelfranken (abbreviated "**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Kreis-Amtsblatt fuer Mittelfranken ("**Krs.A.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Intelligenzblatt fuer den Rezat-Kreis ("**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), and **Boten von Altdorf** are official newspapers in which prospective legal emigrants published the fact that they were leaving Germany. The remainder of the reference is: they year, part (Beilage), number, column, and date of publication (the month is usually in Roman numerals.)

"**Reg.v.Mfr.K.d.I.**" is the abbreviation for "Regierung von Mittel Franken Kammer des Inneren" (Chamber of the Interior for Central Franconia, located in Ansbach), a department of the provincial administration. If one wished to see copies of the papers of Mathias Abelein, one would order them from the State Archive in Nuremberg, referring To "Reg.v.Mfr.kDI, Abg. 1932, Titulus Ia, Nr.57740/I" (the reference listed fort that Record). "**Abgabe**" (abbreviated "Abg.") refers to the year records were transferred to the State Archive in Nuremberg.

Other references indicate the administrative town near the emigrant's home (see the first issue for a fuller explanation of the various terms). If one wanted a copy of Walburga Abele's records, they would give the reference for that record: "**LRA Eichstaett, Abgabel 1981, Nr. 676/1/4**" LRA=the office of the "**Landkreis**", called the "Landsratsamt", in this case the city of Eichstaett). If one wanted a copy of Joh.Jakob Ackermann's records they would give the reference for that record: "**BA Ansbach, Abgabe 1930, Nr.427/441**" (BA=Bezirksamt", in this case the city of Ansbach). "**Herrschaftsgericht**", "**Gericht & Polizeibehoerde**" and "**I.g.a.O.**" are other terms for types of administrative towns. In the "**Hometown**" column, the second town listed is one of these types of administrative towns. Unless noted, it is the "Landgericht" (LG) of the first town listed in that column.
