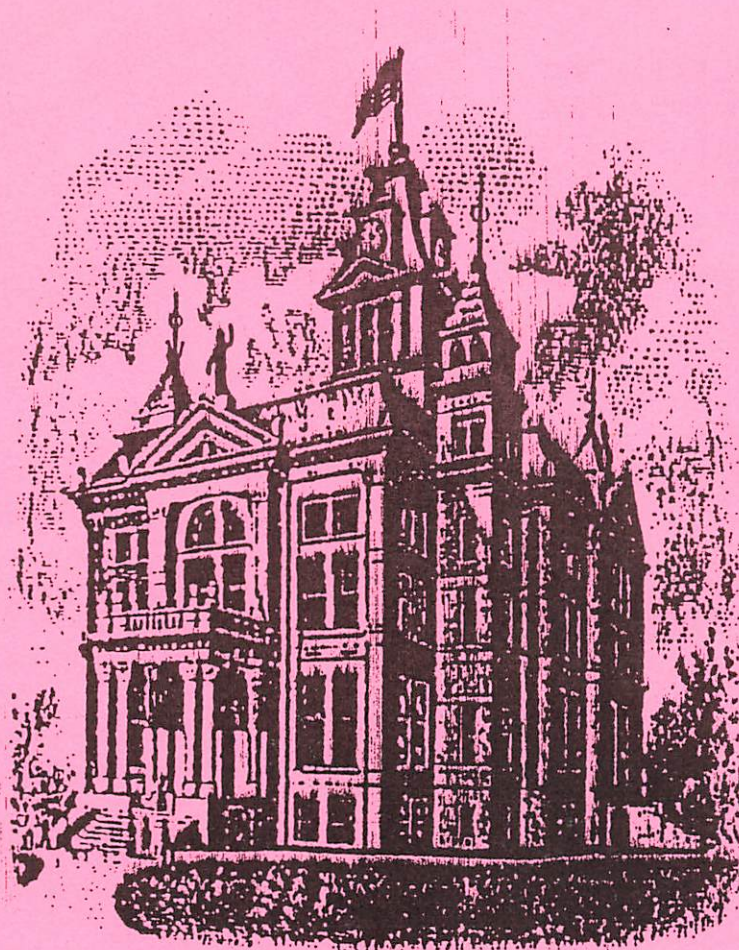

#### Last Sad Rites

The funeral of the late Stephen Edwin SMITH occurred from the First Presbyterian church at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon. A large number of the friends and acquaintances of the deceased and his family nearly filled the church. The floral tributes were numerous and expressive of the high esteem in which the deceased was held, and also emblems of the pure and noble character that he had made. A pillow of white roses, carnations, and calias with the initials S E S in purple immortals was a tribute from his young friends Bessie GAYLORD, Jessie LAYLIN, May FOWLER, J S LAMSON, Herbert THOMPSON and C G FOWLER. A beautiful wreath of roses, carnations and heliothroe and smilax from three former schoolmates, Annie HOLCOMB, Carrie REDMAN AND Kate JAMES, was very pretty. A cross and anchor combined, of white carnations and geranium leaves, was a tribute from Mrs Charles DAVIS and Miss Jessie PRENTIAS of Lansing. A cycle, cross and crown, anchor and numerous

boquets were expressive of the regard of many other friends.

The pass bearers consisted of the following gentlemen: Chester BROWN, C G FOWLER, J S LAMSON, Herbert THOMPSON, A F LEWIS and J H STOELKER

The sacred dust reposed in an elegant casket covered with black matlesse with heavy velvet mouldings and black broadcloth draping. On the plate was the inscription: "Stephen Edwin SMITH, born Oct 25<sup>th</sup>, 1859, died March 10, 1881."

The services were conducted by Rev A F KRUSKE, the choir rendering appropriate music. The sermon was drawn from the test "The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God which giveth us the victory, through our Lord Jesus Christ." First Cor xv;55-57

George HOUSNER has qualified as member of the jury commission of Saginaw county. Orders of bearing and proof of service were filed yesterday in the foreclosure cases against the Union and Consolidated street railway companies

Mary STEWART, widow of Thomas M STEWART and executrix of his estate, by her attorney, John F O'KEEFE, commenced suit against the Michigan Central Railroad Co yesterday for \$25,000 damages on account of the killing of her husband at the Sheridan avenue crossing on the 5<sup>th</sup> of February last. The circumstances out of which the case grew are fresh in the minds of Courier-Herald readers. About 5 o'clock on the afternoon of Feb 5 Thomas STEWART with three others attempted to drive across the Michigan Central tracks at the Sheridan avenue, when their sleigh was struck by an incoming train and all were fatally injured. The bill filed yesterday describes the dangerous condition of the crossing and points out how an approaching train is hidden from view by buildings and fences. It alleges that it was the duty of the



company to use such precaution as would prevent accident, describing what the precautions should have been and including among them the maintainance of safety gates with a competent tender. It alleges that the train which struck STEWART's sleigh was being run at the rate of 35 miles an hour, in violation of the city ordinance which requires that trains within the city limits should not be run at a greater speed then six miles an hour. It charges negligence and incompetency on the part of the employes of the company. It alleges that STEWART was doing a business, the profits of which were from \$3,000 to \$5,000 a year; that he contributed upwards of \$1,000 a year to the support of his wife and infant child and that he would have contributed at least an equal sum during the period of his natural life if he had not been killed by the alleged carelessness of the railroad company. On this showing the claim of \$25,000 is based. The bill alleges that the accident was not contributed to in any way by the negligence of the unfortunate man

INTRODUCTION:

These records are based on information in the State Archive of Central Franconia (Mittel Franken) at Nuremberg. As a Sesquicentennial gift, the city of Gunzenhausen sent this information to its sister city of Frankenmuth, Michigan. Frankenmuth Historical Assn. translated the information, compiled these charts and when possible, added a location and reference as to where in N. America the settler arrived (set off by [ ]). If there are any questions regarding accuracy, researchers should request to see copies of the original records in Germany and for this reason will need the reference and the archive's address (there is a fee):

A Very Short Explanation of Reference Abbreviations:

(a fuller explanation can be found in the first issue of this series, Volume 29 Issue 3).

Intelligenzblatt fuer Mittelfranken (abbreviated "**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Kreis-Amtsblatt fuer Mittelfranken ("**Krs.A.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), Intelligenzblatt fuer den Rezat-Kreis ("**Intellig.Bl.f.Mfr.**"), and **Boten von Altdorf** are official newspapers in which prospective legal emigrants published the fact that they were leaving Germany. The remainder of the reference is: they year, part (Beilage), number, column, and date of publication (the month is usually in Roman numerals.)

"**Reg.v.Mfr.K.d.I.**" is the abbreviation for "Regierung von Mittel Franken Kammer des Inneren" (Chamber of the Interior for Central Franconia, located in Ansbach), a department of the provincial administration. If one wished to see copies of the papers of Mathias Abelein, one would order them from the State Archive in Nuremberg, referring To "Reg.v.Mfr.kDI, Abg. 1932, Titulus Ia, Nr.57740/I" (the reference listed fort that Record). "**Abgabe**" (abbreviated "Abg.") refers to the year records were transferred to the State Archive in Nuremberg.

Other references indicate the administrative town near the emigrant's home (see the first issue for a fuller explanation of the various terms). If one wanted a copy of Walburga Abele's records, they would give the reference for that record: "**LRA Eichstaett, Abgabel 1981, Nr. 676/1/4**" LRA=the office of the "**Landkreis**", called the "Landsratsamt", in this case the city of Eichstaett). If one wanted a copy of Joh.Jakob Ackermann's records they would give the reference for that record: "**BA Ansbach, Abgabe 1930, Nr.427/441**" (BA=Bezirksamt", in this case the city of Ansbach). "**Herrschaftsgericht**", "**Gericht & Polizeibehoerde**" and "**Lg.a.O.**" are other terms for types of administrative towns. In the "**Hometown**" column, the second town listed is one of these types of administrative towns. Unless noted, it is the "Landgericht" (LG) of the first town listed in that column.

## Wonderful Resource in the National Archives of Canada (NAC)

For years there were rumors that a great hoard of genealogical material existed in Washington consisting of the records of the Tsarist Russian Counsuls in Montreal, Halifax and Vancouver. It was known to have disappeared in 1917--the year of the Russian Revolution--and was thought to have been sent to Russian Consulates in the United States which did not recognize the government of the USSR until 1933.

In 1980, A NAC search team found the records in an underground vault in Washington. Although the official period covered by the documents is 1900-1922, many records in the collection date back to the 1850s and some back to the early 1800s. The collection relates to people who came from the area covered by the old Russian Empire before 1917. In modern ethnic terms they include: Jews, Ukrainians, Russians, Finns, Poles, Byelorussians, Lithuanians, Latvians, Estonians, Armenians, Doukhobors, Germans (Mennonites), Georgians, Cossacks and several other minority groups.

Some idea of the extraordinary size and nature of the LiRaMa Collection can be gotten from a general list of its contents: (1) About 100,000 registration forms containing names, places and dates of birth, nationality, ethnic origin, religion, occupation, names and places of residence and next of kin, places and lengths of residence in Canada (2) About 150,000 photographs; (3) Canceled passports and other travel documents; (4) Birth Certificates, identity cards, war service records, affidavits, school records, estate records and wills. ## HAVE YOU EVER HEARD OF THE 'KORESHAN?'

The *Bumell/Bonnell Newsletter* recently had this most interesting article:

March 20, 1998, the Naples Daily News carried this news item: "A piano and cello recital will

take place this Sunday in the Art Hall at Koreshan State Historic Site. The program will feature the restored 'Harriot Bunnell Steinway' piano, which was originally brought to the site for Bonnell, a Koreshan, by boat in 1905."

The Koreshans were a group of Chicago area people who established a communal society north of Naples in the late 1800s under the leadership of Cyrus Teague, who was an army surgeon during the Civil War. Koresh was the Hebrew word for Cyrus. He taught that we lived on the inside surface of a large globe with the sun at its center, therefore, the surface we lived on was concave rather than convex. He "proved" this by constructing a fencelike structure that extended for several miles along the beach with measurements taken at various points from the top to the surface.

The Koreshans were intellectuals, artists, musicians and earned a living for the community by serving as a publishing house for outside firms.

The men lived separately from the women and were celibate.

After Teague died, their numbers diminished. The last member died about 1978, but the grounds are maintained by the State as a historical attraction. Teague's masterplan was to build a new Jerusalem there that would be populated by hundreds of thousands of believers.

### What Is The Correct Way To Spell Your Name?

Donald Lines Jacobus, in his *Genealogy as Pastime and Profession* writes, "The correct way to spell your surname is the way you yourself spell it..every man is privileged to spell his own name as he sees fit. But because you and perhaps your father and grandfather spelled the name a certain way is no reason for being concerned to prove that your first American ancestor spelled it the same way.

It is a matter of small importance whether he did or did not, and our first American ancestors were too much occupied with serious matters to worry much about how their names were spelled.

The spelling in vital records is not conclusive, since it may have been the error of a clerk. The spelling on gravestones is not always conclusive, for stonecutters made many mistakes. Even an autograph is not conclusive unless the writer was a person of some education, for often men spelled their names differently in different signatures.

From Glen Clift's *Kentucky Marriages* comes this interesting item on page 66 "Marriage Moses Alexander, aged 93, to Mrs Frances Tompkins, aged 105. They were married in Bath, Steuben Co NY 11 June 1831. They were both taken out of bed dead the next morning.

### Think About This One

It's thought that you can use flour to dust old, old tombstones so you can read the inscriptions. Just be sure to use plain flour - don't ever use self-rising in a cemetery.

### If Your Family Grave Was Moved

If your family ancestor's final resting place turns out not to be final or permanent because of a construction project, such as a turnpike - first find out the date the road was built from the county civil engineers or Army Corps of Engineers. Secondly, check newspapers just before and after the date of interment for mention of removal and reinterment. Thirdly, check county health department for registration of removal and a possible court order. Finally, check with local morticians of the area who may have helped in the removal. From *Questing Heirs*.

### LOOKING FOR PASSPORTS

All passport applications from 1791 to 1905 are in The National Archives. During this period, passports were not required except during part of the Civil War. However, many people obtained them. Without one, a US traveler visiting the old country could be drafted into military service.

The earliest applications were simply letters of request, but sometimes other papers - such as expired passports, birth certificates, naturalization papers, etc, were filed with them. The application could contain name, place of residence, age, names of family members traveling with the applicant, the court of naturalization, date of arrival in the US, port of entry, vessel name, etc.

#### Have You Ever Heard of "Instant Dates?"

There are some archaic terms referring to dates  
that will make you stop and blink if you run  
across them in your genealogical research. For  
example: Monday instant - if used, usually means  
"today". The 10th instant - usually means the  
10th of the present month. The 20th ultimo - the  
20th of the last month. Monday last - the most  
recent Monday. Tuesday last - the nearest  
Tuesday to follow. December last - the most  
recent December. While the terms "nest" and  
"last" are usually written out, the term "ultimo" is  
sometimes written "ULT" and instant is "INST".  
It is important to note the date on the document  
being studied as that is the key to the dates the  
writer refers.

#### Swedish Help Now Available

Swedish postal authorities have a program to  
help Americans of Swedish background find their  
relatives in Sweden. Information packets are  
available from a number of Swedish-American  
organizations for distribution.

A short form on an ancestor can be filled out and  
for \$20 the sender will receive confirmation of  
information on the immigrants, parents, siblings  
and children.

the benefits of marriages within the family
