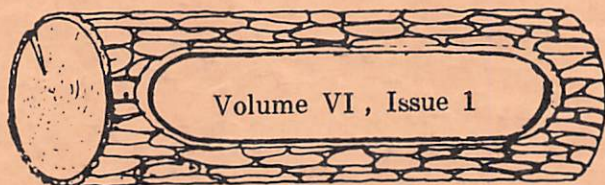

GERMAN RESEARCH -- OUR CANADIAN CONNECTIONS

Canadians of German ancestry have been fortunate the past couple of years because of the recent informative articles which have appeared in Canadian publications. German settlement patterns, ethnic arts and crafts, as well as individual family histories, have been written up in the various historical and genealogical periodicals.

Of interest to genealogical researchers were the articles published in Ontario History. One article dealt with Iron Cross cemetery markers and the "Tree of Life" symbol. Another article told of "Fraktur Art". An example was the "Familien-Register", a genealogical document inscribed with information about family generations. This article included some German family histories, other forms of the artistic script, and information about the artists.

Museums in areas which had German settlements exhibited ethnic culture. The Markham District Museum collected genealogical and historical resource materials. Other museums, Black Creek Pioneer Village (Toronto), Doon Pioneer Village (Kitchener), Jordan Historical Museum of the Twenty (Niagara Peninsula), and North Marysburg Museum (Picton), featured German festivals and displays.

In addition to the Pennsylvania Germans, the Mennonites, and loyalists of Palatine origin, were found the early Alsatian settlers in Quebec and the Hessian soldiers who appeared in Quebec marriage registers. Some Germans who settled the US midwest in the mid 1800's came through Canadian ports, and some remained in Canadian communities for short periods of time.

If your ancestors did not settle in a German Canadian community, these articles still can provide useful German source material. Below is a list of recent books and articles which reported on the German element in Canada.

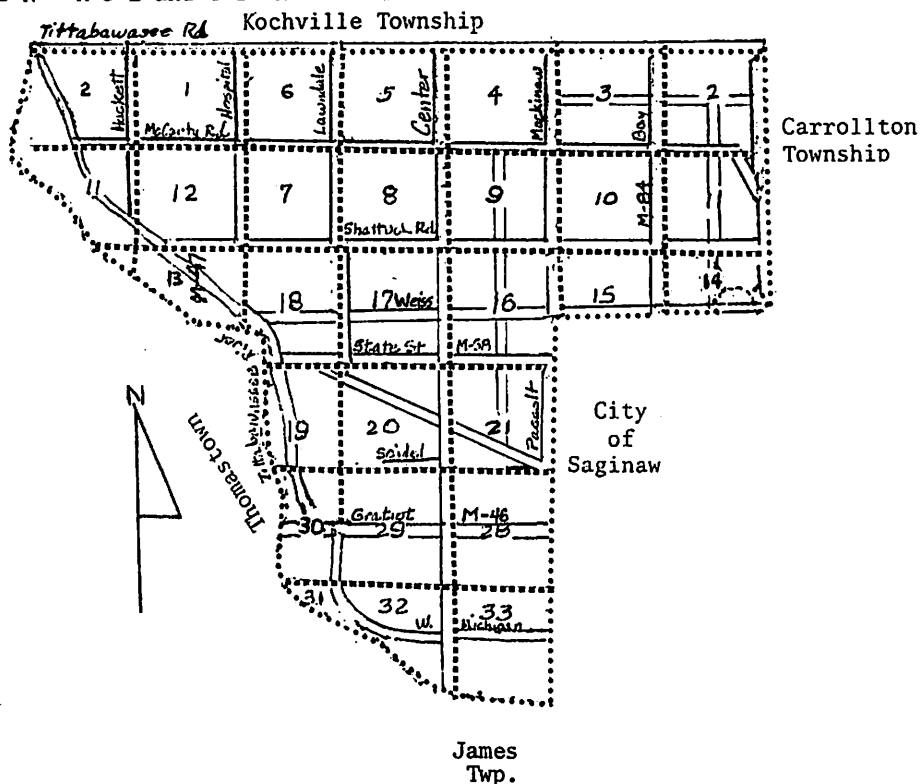
