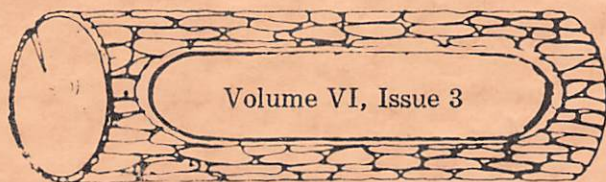

It's time to mark your calendars! The date to circle is April 22, 1978. Do it now, send in your reservations and get ready to enjoy one of the finest days of genealogy that you will ever have. The three main speakers will provide a genealogical experience which I know this area has never before experienced. I have been reminded that Timbertown Log is in need of Research Tips, Genealogical Experiences and all types of material from vital records on to queries. There is a fairly good back log of material but these pages devour a considerable quantity of research and information in each issue and it is vital for planning purposes to have additional material on hand and to know what information will be coming in. If you have any pet projects, such as records from churches, vital records from the county clerk's office, research from old records or anything else of this type, please keep the Log in mind.

It has also been brought to mind that if you are moving, please notify the society of your change of address in time to change the mailing label on your Timbertown Log. Timbertown Log is mailed through a special bulk-mailing arrangement with the post office, taking advantage of a quantity mailing at reduced fees. A change of address, filed with the post office, has no affect on the delivery of your Timbertown Log--at the bulk rate, the Log is not forwarded, but is returned to the society at a cost of 28¢ each. As you can see, it doesn't take too many mis-addressed copies to hurt the postage fund. Many societies have been forced to institute a program of requesting their members to pay up to one dollar to redeem their returned copy of their quarterly, in order to pay for the original mailing, postage due on the returned copy and a second mailing. It is hoped that this will not ever become necessary and that all moving members will notify their society of their new address at the earliest possible date.

This Society is very proud to announce that three outstanding speakers will provide an outstanding genealogical experience at the 1978 Annual Seminar, on Saturday, April 22, 1978 at Holiday Inn East.

Milton Rubincam, internationally-renowned genealogist, will speak on "Settlements of Pennsylvania" and "Methods and Pitfalls in Genealogical Research." Mr. Rubincam was born in Philadelphia, Pa., of Pennsylvania German, English, Canadian and Scottish ancestry, educated at Ocean City (NJ) High School, Temple University and the American University in Washington, DC. He is married to the former Priscilla Teasdale and is the father of three sons. He served 26 years with the United States government, retiring in 1972. He has been engaged in genealogical research since 15 years of age, and has served as president of the National Genealogical Society, the Pennsylvania Historical Junto, the American Society of Genealogists; is presently chairman of the Board for Certification of Genealogists, is a fellow of the American Society of Genealogists, the National Genealogical Society, the Genealogical Society of Pennsylvania and the Texas State Genealogical Society. Mr. Rubincam has served as editor of the National Genealogical Society Quarterly and has edited Genealogical Research: Methods and Sources. He has lectured at numerous genealogical seminars and institutes and has authored a large number of articles published in genealogical and historical periodicals in the United States, England, Germany and Canada.

Donna Valley Stuart, of Grosse Pointe Woods, a member of our society as well as the Detroit Society for Genealogical Research, will provide information on "The French of Early Michigan." Donna was born in Detroit, educated at Kingswood School, Bloomfield Hills, Wheaton College, Norton, Mass., and received her Master of Arts degree from U of M in 1950. She was awarded her GRS certification in 1975 and is currently an instructor at Macomb County Community College. Mrs. Stuart has provided many genealogical articles for publication in the DSGR magazine and Timbertown Log and is presently serving as editor of the Index to the 1860 Federal Census of Detroit, to be published in 1978.

G. Curtis Bradley, President, Michigan Genealogical Council, rounds out the featured speaker list for the day. He was born, raised and educated in Greenville, Michigan, a graduate of the University of Michigan, married and the father of three children. Curt has served as president of the Western Michigan

1900 Census Restrictions Dropped

The FEDERAL REGISTER reported on Friday, 28 October, 1977, that the National Archives had discontinued restrictions on the use of the 1900 federal census records.

John J. Landers, Acting Archivist, had announced earlier that, "In view of the passage of time and the substantial interest in access to the records of the 1900 census for historical and genealogical purposes, the National Archives

and Records Service has determined that the current restrictions on access to and copies of the records of the 1900 census can be lifted."

If you have room for 9,698 rolls of microfilm and \$116,376, endless hours of research await you.

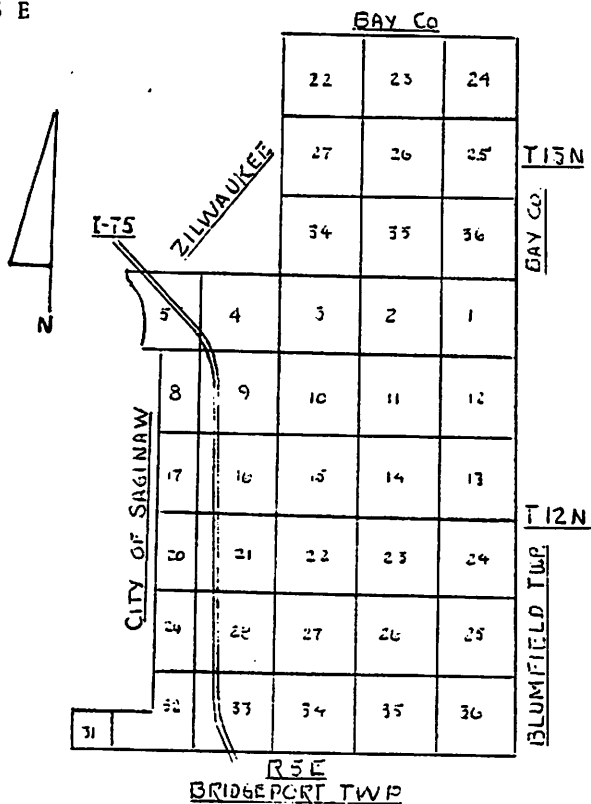
In line with this decision of the archives, and in the interest of providing genealogists with material, the Board of Directors and the membership of the Saginaw Genealogical Society have initiated action to purchase the complete set of the Michigan 1900 Federal Census as well as the 1880 Census of Michigan. By ordering now, we hope to receive these microfilms by mid-summer, 1978, thus making the Saginaw library one of the first non-governmental repositories to offer the 1900 Michigan census for research in the nation.

Programs in Review

Leland R. Watrous

On 12 September 1877, Mr. John McCulloch of the law firm of Learman and McCulloch, a local copyright attorney, spoke on the new copyright laws which were effective 1 January 1978. He stressed that copyright laws offer a form of protection to authors, and that the copyright is individual, not blanketed and covers such items as books, periodicals, lectures, musical compositions, maps, charts, works of art, photographs, slides, sound recordings and many other forms of communication. The copyright commences when created in a tangible form and is in force for the life of the author plus an additional fifty years. In order to show that it has a copyright, the notation "Copr" or "©" followed by the date and owner is placed on the cover, title page or such a position to give reasonable notice of this copyright. The doctrine of fair use recognizes a certain, very limited, infringement by scholars, researchers or libraries.

John Cuthbertson, a school administrator with a fine genealogical background, gave an interesting and amusing insight into publication of a family history. After he had published his own family history in 1973, he found that a relative had also completed a history a year earlier and that neither knew of the other's work, although many of the same names coincided. Mr. Cuthbertson told of many of the problems in completing such a book as well as digging up details such as favorite sayings and habits of those mentioned in the book, concluding that it had been a lot of fun.

The program for the November meeting consisted of Anna Mae Thompson, speaking on her work in Scandinavian research and of the many problems she has encountered with the differences in language and in locating the correct area and town of the ancestor for whom she was searching.

The December meeting found Bernard Forster favoring those present with a program on migration patterns. This informative talk, along with an illustrative map, provided a good background on the whys and wherefores of migration. Early Indians often traveled as far as 2,000 miles from home for the purpose of visiting or war, utilizing trails originally formed by animals; these trails naturally following the path of least resistance and natural water courses. The Mohawk Trail from Albany to Buffalo being one example, several others being in existence in other areas. The early settlers limited their roads to their immediate needs, such as church or commerce. Their movement inland was originally hindered by mountains but later roads improved travel, meant improved migration.

The January 9th meeting featured a panel presentation with Fred Pike speaking on military records. He advised that many military records can be obtained from DAR Lineage books, and town histories as well as the National Archives. Many of the early pension records were burned in the War of 1812. Norman Wright's "Building An American Pedigree" lists many sources of military records. Ruth Freeland, talking on the Values and Responsibility of genealogists, stated "Genealogists are a special breed of person, viewed by non-genealogists as eccentrics," and "we uncover the happenings of yesterday." Experience in research can help others and genealogy is a sharing experience as well as a hobby. She advised "be persistent--don't give up, be thorough and be thoughtful." "Keep your records in order, help your genealogical society, workshop or seminar---SHARE!"

In February we were privileged to have a sight and sound presentation of the Thumb Area Historic Overview, an extremely interesting slide-tape program, featuring the many Thumb area historic sites from Huron, Tuscola and Sanilac counties. This proved that although we think we know our area, we really are not all that familiar with the persons, events and places which shaped the later growth of this section of the state.
