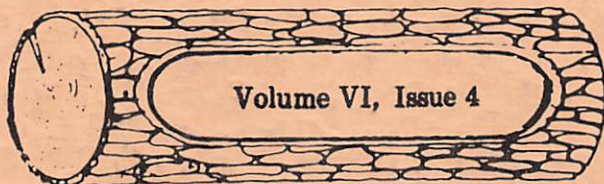

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President's Message

The seventh year of existence of the Saginaw Genealogical Society is coming to an end, and the close of the year in June will signal my second and final year as President. It is with mixed feelings that I leave this position; relief at escaping relatively unscathed from the decisions and responsibilities necessary through these two years and the feeling of pride and accomplishment in the condition of this Society. The state of health of this Society cannot be credited to any one individual-it has been a steady increase throughout the Society's history-but the responsibility must rest on the shoulders of every member, particularly the elected officers, appointed committee members and all those who gave so graciously of their time throughout these years to all the projects. Prime examples of this outpouring of effort are the two workshops, chaired by Ruth Freeland and assisted by numerous members of our Society, and the just-concluded Annual Seminar, put together by Elsie Kempton and Lois Schrah, also involving literally dozens of members. Planning for the Seminar starts shortly after the previous seminar, moves into high gear in the early fall and accelerates into high speed during the winter. Those of you who were fortunate enough to attend undoubtedly realized how smoothly and efficiently the entire program was organized and carried out. This was accomplished only by long hours of planning by the various society members.

In leaving office, I just have to publicly thank all the elected and appointed officers, workers on the various projects and the membership in general for the splendid cooperation which I have received. It is only through this spirit of assistance that our Society has grown to be the outstanding organization that it is today. I am certain that this friendship and cooperation will be continued through the coming year and years, to succeeding officers and committees. I know it will be in good hands.

Genealogists of the Saginaw area are very lucky people. The Hoyt Library, especially the Eddy Room area, is a gold mine of information. Thanks to the Eddy Fund, the Saginaw Public Library has been allowed to expand and remodel the present location in the library. Those of us who had to contend with the former genealogical room remember the cramped work space and books scattered throughout the two floors. Now that the new quarters have been occupied for many months, we find that this area sometimes seems almost as crowded as it did before because of the increased interest in genealogy. Much of this increase stems from the generous support given the library by this Society as such and much is due to gifts from many of the members. The Society has donated approximately \$2,000 in books and microfilms directly and has provided many exchange magazines through the aggressive exchange program. Other groups, such as the DAR have contributed handsomely, and, judging from the book acquisitions listed in Timbertown Log, literally hundreds of books and microfilms have been given by individuals in their effort to put useful genealogical material in the hands of all interested in that field. This effort is quite noticeable when looking at the new shelves which are now becoming filled. Many people who have unused genealogical materials in book cases might examine these with an eye to weeding out items from which they receive very little day-to-day help and contributing them to the library, where, on the shelves in the Eddy Room, they could solve problems for persons looking for that one little link to the past. Give it some thought! Incidentally, gifts to the library can accumulate some very nice income tax deductions.

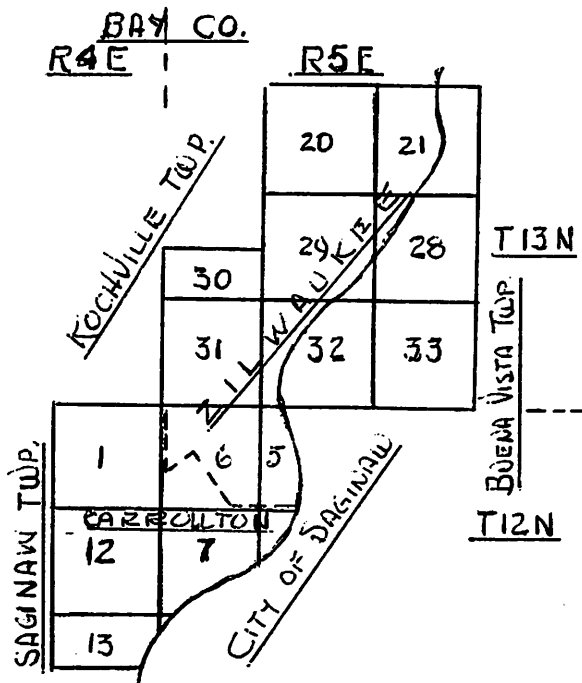

MAP OF CARROLLTON AND ZILWAUKEE

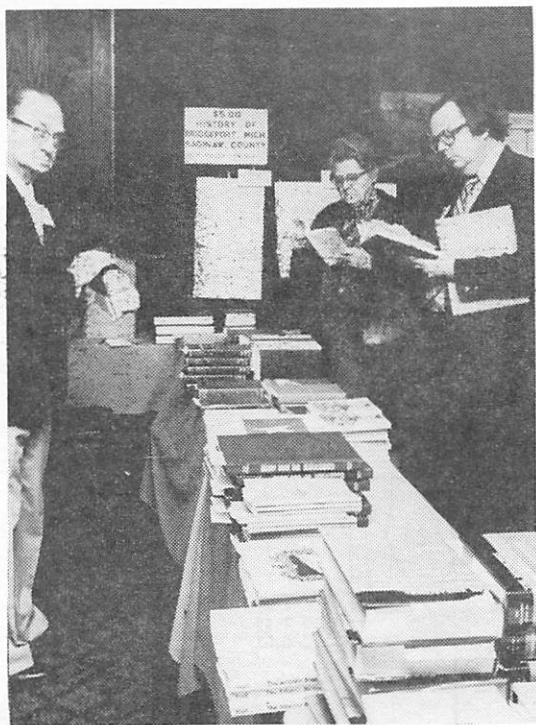

BRIDGEPORT HISTORY OFF THE PRESS

Another significant project of the Saginaw Genealogical Society has borne fruit. The *History of Bridgeport*, Compiled by T. J. Pollen around the year 1912, has been retyped, an index has been compiled for it and a title page, table of contents and preface prepared.
