

Programs in Review

Leland R. Watrous

The meeting of 13 Mar 1978 found Georgetta Walker speaking on "Patriotic Societies, using as "Exhibit A" Ruth Zorn. She explained the many patriotic societies base their membership on service of ancestors to colony, state or region. The literally dozens of organizations represent not only military service, but also service to particular areas in many capacities such as clergy. On 8 May 1978, Carl F. Herzberg of the Reitz Funeral Home discussed records as kept by undertakers and emphasized that they must file a certificate of death with the clerk in the county in which the persons resided and that these records are available on the first of the month following the death. A Burial Transit Permit must be filled out when the deceased is moved from state to state; this must be returned to local registrar. Mr Herzberg suggested that information for the death certificate could be filled out ahead of time and left in a safe place or with relatives.

Karen Bonasczak of Bay City spoke at the meeting of 12 June regarding searching for family members lost by adoption and in favor of opening records for this purpose. Among the groups active in this field are the Adoptees Liberty Movement Assn and the Adoption Identity Movement with the goal of passing legislation to free up the sealed adoption records.
