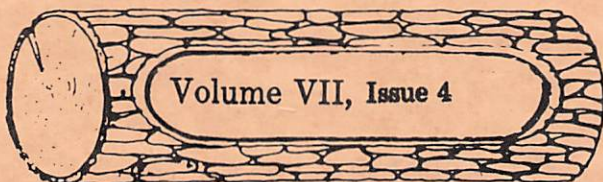

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A TALE OF THE TAXES

The tax receipts on the preceding page were made available by the Foy family of Richland Township, through the good offices of our Scottie Baxter. This property has been in family hands for the past century and provides an interesting view of the growth of property value and inflation over the years. In following the history of the North East Quarter of the North East Quarter of Section 17, Richland Township, note the starting valuation and taxes of the year 1885 in figure 1--these 40 acres were valued at \$280, paid a total tax bill of \$6.12, the biggest item being the Ditch Tax of \$1.40. In figure 2, the tax bill for the year 1890, found the valuation growing to \$320, the taxes to \$4.34 with the school tax as the biggest item at \$1.27. By 1896 valuation had risen to \$380 and the tax bill to \$10.72 with school taxes being \$4.60 in figure 3. The Twentieth Century treated the Foy family (and presumably the other area farmers equally) badly when the valuation for that same 40 acres had gone to \$900 (fig. 4), although the taxes for that particular parcel went only to \$16.73 with the school tax eating up \$2.18 of the total; the grand total of taxes for the three pieces of property was \$41.64, including what appears to be \$1.00 for a dog. By 1918 (figure 5) these 40 acres had leaped to a valuation of \$2300 requiring \$40.72 in taxes, with the school tax amounting to \$2.30 and the Township tax of \$15.64; the complete tax on this bill came to \$205.17. Figure 6, the taxes for 1923, show that the valuation stayed at \$2300, although the bill for this piece of land required \$76.67 in taxes, with the Highway and Bridge Tax of \$14.72 and the School Tax trailing slightly at \$14.31. Taxation hit a half-century high of \$231.03 for the entire property. Those of our readers who are connected with farming or farm property surely know the results of the next half century of growth without further examples. Our thanks to the Foys and Scottie Baxter for allowing us to use these records.
